THE GOOD SAMARITAN Aycliffe's New Technical YOU TOO CAN HAVE **College Opens in 2016** 



The new Avcliffe University Technical College building design will reflect the engineering focus of its curriculum, with a tripleheight specialist engineering housing with state-of-the-art kit able to accommodate large scale work and machinery. Building work on the new £10m University Technical College South Durham is expected to begin in summer 2015 at Long Tens Way, on the Aycliffe Business Park,

close to Hitachi Rail Europe's new plant. It's on track to open in September 2016. David Land is a Trustee for UTC South Durham, working in conjunction with the University of Sunderland, he commented: My role is to manage the build and business engagement for the project. We're pleased with the

work to date and feel we're on the right track to meet the requirements of the manufacturing sector not only on the Aycliffe Business Park but in the surrounding South Durham area. The UTC offers a transitional facility that will allow students to experience work based problem solving while completing their core subjects.

"The partners have worked with Ryder Architecture on the design, contractor Willmott Dixon has been appointed and is due to start on site this summer, funding is in place, we've consulted locally on the proposed college and this week are announcing the appointed Principal Designate.

"The next challenge will be to involve more businesses in the project and then recruit students to start when the doors open in September 2016."

Plans for UTC South Durham were recently submitted to Durham County Council, with granting of planning approval anticipated for July 2015. The year-long build is expected to begin in August

2015. The college will consist of a three-storey engineering block, kitted out with general and specialist engineering equipment such as computeraided design, science laboratories, workshops and a teaching block for studying GSCE and A' level subjects. Access to the college will be off Newton Aycliffe's Long Tens Way, there will be 43 bicycle racks and 57 car parking spaces with provision for another 20. Public transport options will include the Darlington to Bishop Auckland railway line and local bus transport. Ryder Architecture, based on Westgate Road, Newcastle, is the appointed architecture firm. Project Architect Mal Lorimer commented: "At Ryder we have extensive experience of designing buildings for education. In their brief to us the sponsors

set out their desire to create a building that did not look and feel like a standard highschool, but instead create something more suited to the college's engineering focus, that would feel different and exciting.

"Industrial workspace was the inspiration for our design. The main entrance will connect directly to the dramatic, triple-height 'engineering hall'. As well as giving students and visitors an awe-inspiring welcome as they enter it will also be a practical and versatile space, able to house massive equipment or work.

The chosen palette is of simple industrial materials and the energy efficiency of the building will exceed the target set out by building regulations."

The contractor that will build UTC South Durham is Willmott Dixon, appointed under the Scape framework – which uses a controlled tender process which complies with the requirements of OJEU and Public Contract regulation requirements to select the best single supplier in a twostage selection process.

**TWELVE YEAR OI RUNS FOR CHARI**

On Father's Day, 12 year old Liam Brittle will be running to raise much needed funds for the Huckins Family Appeal. He signed up for the 3km run and decided to use the opportunity to raise funds for this cause. The run takes place from Greenfield Community College and this will be one of 7 charity runs Liam will complete this year for charity. A bit of information about what Liam is running for: In October 2011, mother of three Adelle Huckins was finally diagnosed after a long mysterious illness. The disease she has is called Lyme disease. Lyme disease is a bacterial infection carried by ticks (blood-sucking parasites) which is transmitted when the tick bites and feeds on a person or animal. Ticks are found in the

countryside but can also be present in town parks and gardens where wildlife visits. They usually feed on the blood of wildlife but they can also bite people, passing on any diseases they may be carrying. Adelle, her husband Rob and their children, Joshua, Kaitlyn and Dexter all love to go camping in the Lake District and other areas of natural beauty. However, whilst they get to experience all the wonders of nature, they have also been exposed to ticks. Prior to Adelle becoming ill, they didn't know about the simple precautions you can take against tick bites. Lyme disease is an insidious disease which can invade every system of the body from the blood, to the heart and brain. It can cause long-term health problems if not diagnosed and treated promptly. Not only Adelle has health problems, her husband and children do too. But despite numerous visits to various NHS doctors, a cause for their children's multiple health problems has not yet been found. Although a private test has proved positive for Kaitlyn for Lyme disease. Adelle's illness took years to diagnose and during that time her three children were born. It is possible for Lyme disease to be passed from a mother to her unborn baby or transmitted through breastmilk and the child can suffer health problems as a result, but in order for Adelle and Rob to find out whether this is why their children have these health problems, they need an expert doctor. Now to see they have an opportunity to see a top consultant abroad. This consultant has years of experience in treating tick bourne infections, including

Lyme disease. Rob and Adelle



have been together for 15 years but now family life is plagued by health concerns. All they want is for Joshua, Kaitlyn and Dexter to be well and to have the quality of life they deserve.

### **Urgent Need for 204,000 New Blood Donors**

NHS Blood and Transplant has revealed that 40% fewer new volunteers came forward across England and North Wales to give blood last year compared to a decade ago. The organisation is calling for more people to help fill the gaps by starting to donate in County Durham.

NHS Blood and Transplant has explained that 204,000 new volunteers need to come forward this year across England and North Wales to keep the nation's blood stocks at a safe level for the future.

Regular donations are crucial to saving and improving the lives of patients with cancer, blood disorders and those suffering medical trauma or undergoing surgery. 1,446 new volunteers came forward to donate blood for the first to donate blood for the first time in County Durham last year, 4 per 1,000 of the estimated number of people between the ages of 17 and 70 living there. 21 per 1000 people are active donors in County Durham. 7,675 people living in County Durham donated blood at least once last year, saving or improving up to three lives each time they did so.

NHS Blood and Transplant needs new donors to fill the gaps left by existing donors who are not able to give blood at this time and to ensure that we have the right mix of blood groups to match patients' needs.

A number of misconceptions still exist about donating blood; almost half (48%) of the people responding to an NHS Blood and Transplant survey said they think that the NHS asks friends and family to donate when a patient needs blood and 13% think that synthetic blood is created to meet the national demand. However, 8 out of 10 people knew that unpaid volunteers are the way that blood stocks are maintained. In 2015, 204,000 new

volunteers need to attend a session to donate to ensure that the nation's blood stocks continue to remain at a safe level in the future. When a survey asked for the reasons why they don't give blood, respondents gave a range of reasons. The top three given were a fear of needles (22%), knowing it's a good thing to do but not getting around to it (27%) and health problems so they don't believe they are eligible to donate (21%),

In contrast, 86% of respondents who had given of blood felt that it was as expected, or easier than they expected it to be.



### **DOG FALLS DOWN OPEN MANHOLE AND DROWNS** Hole Covered Without Dog Being Recovered

Dear Sir.

On the 17th May I contacted the Fire Service to tell them my 11 stone Cane Corso dog 'Zack' had fallen down an open man-hole and drowned in the field opposite the where Livin are Gretna building new houses. He had slipped through a broken gap in the fence which is down in several places around the perimeter of the field. The Fire Service said they could not attend as it wasn't a rescue.

They contacted the County Council and my daughter and I met Council employees Peter Clennel and Paul Bambrouge and took them to the place of the incident. They said they would secure the man-hole for safety purposes and would get my dog out the next day and take him to the vets as he was chipped. The next day I asked my daughter to telephone the council to find out what time they would be getting Zach out of the man-hole. They said they wouldn't

"We did not say that we would go back to retrieve the dog from the manhole as we would not be able to carry out such a task due to the complex and specialist nature of this work. 

A large-scale campaign to tackle waste crime in County Durham has seen a significant

drop in flytipping. Operation Stop It is Durham County Council's biggest-ever crackdown on flytipping in partnership with Durham Constabulary, Crimestoppers and the Environment Agency. The aim is to educate households and businesses of their duty of care when it comes to throwing out their rubbish while taking action against those who flout the law Thanks to public support and an extensive education programme, new performance figures have revealed a 29 per cent decrease in flytipping incidents in the county incidents since the operation began in November 2014.

Between November 2014 and April 2015 there were 3,470 • Numeracy and literacy testing for new drivers. A 12-week consultation is incidents recorded, compared to the same period in 2013-14 when there 4.862.

It comes after the council successfully prosecuted a number of flytipping offenders in recent weeks.

Cllr Brian Stephens, Cabinet member for neighbourhoods and local partnerships, Durham County Council, said: "It is really encouraging to see that the number of flytipping incidents across the county has decreased since we launched Operation Stop It.

This shows that the various education and enforcement activities we have carried out in that time is having a really positive impact.

"Our efforts as part of the campaign combined with several recent successful prosecutions against flytipping offenders demonstrate continued commitmen commitment to

tackling this issue." Meanwhile, latest figures from the council's neighbourhood protection team show that 497 flytipping incidents were reported and investigated last month (April) as part of Operation Stop It. Thirteen are still ongoing investigations and eight cases have been progressed for prosecution. Twenty-six mobile CCTV cameras were also set up at flytipping hotspots, four Police and Criminal Evidence Act (PACE) interviews were carried out and three duty of care letters were sent warning people of their responsibility to dispose of waste legally. Seven stop and check operations were also carried out to find out if waste carriers were licenced - six complied
