



As part of his wife's 60th Birthday treat John and Karen Howard were away having a long weekend in Rome when they got a call on Friday 5th September that their garden sheds in Wilton Court backing onto the Nature Walk, were on fire

The neighbours were quick to attend, with Peter and Steve trying their best with two garden hoses to kill the flames. These efforts were futile as you can see from the photo. The Fire Brigade and Police arrived in a timely manner and had the fire under control and extinguished in about 45 minutes.

The cause of the fire (according to a neighbour, was young kids who had already tried to set fire to his fence, but he saw smoke and quickly dealt with the fire.

John and Karen consider themselves lucky that their fire was started in the mid/late afternoon, and neighbours saw the smoke and took action, which was a nice piece of community spirit.

collection John's irreplaceable antique and old carpentry tools were ruined. Other tools and equipment collected over many years were destroyed and the insurance will not be able to cover all the financial loss.

The cost of the blaze is estimated between £8000 and £10,000, with two sheds, garden furniture, and fences to replace. The biggest message we have to get out there is the danger, where there could have been loss of life and/ or serious injury, from gas bottles stored near the shed. Fortunately they were empty being the end of summer. Imagine if they were full and exploded causing death or injury to one of the kids?

For my part, at the end of the day, these are just things, and things are replaceable, but imagine if one of these children had been injured or

worse still, burnt to death, can you imagine having to live here with that in your mind, and then the parents their life long suffering? It doesn't bear thinking about. Parents should explaining this to those culprits who thought they were just starting a little camp fire. Did your child home smelling come smokey that day?

Hopefully this was a camp fire that got out of hand, but the real fear and concern is

that it could have been a lot worse, people could have died if this fire had been set in the evening, or a house was burnt down!

John told Newton News: "Not a great 60th Birthday present! Please get the message across to parents. I am not looking for recompense or retribution, we just need these kids understand how bad things could have been, and hopefully teach them a

Also having Councillors of either sex who are able and willing to turn up at all the required meetings (which hasn't always happened in the past) is also of great importance. Many women are in employment and coming home from a days work, cooking meals for the family, maybe still dealing with young children and having to be at the Council chamber for a 7.15pm meeting (sometimes

earlier) is hectic unless one has a very helpful, supportive partner. Family commitment for women once their children have grown up or they are retired from work may decrease unless of course they are looking after grandchildren or helping their own parents lead an independent life.

Granted the Labour Party as a body may feel they require a gender balance but not all Councillors are Labour members nor should they be if healthy debate and opposing views are taken into account to allow best

of the County Council outcomes. In Great Aycliffe we are very lucky to have a good and effective Town Council and have had for many, many years so surely Chairmen and Vice Chairmen are doing a good job for us. In the past we have had some very effective, outstanding Chairmen who were women so I am sure female Councillors would be elected to these posts if they were deemed suitable and actually wanted these demanding positions. If a Councillor proves his or her commitment and value and wants a Chairmanship they will get these positions by right not because of their gender and this will mean we continue to have an effective Town Council.



the number of registered nurses on a shift falls, care is left undone and patient mortality levels increase. Phil Wilson MP, said: "Despite the pressures

they are facing, nurses are the backbone of our NHS. The pay cap can't continue, it is unfair and if we are to keep the nurses we have, attract new recruits and ensure nursing staff can earn a decent wage.

"Understaffing in our hospitals and communities is affecting the safety of patients. It's time for the Government to show their commitment to valuing and supporting nurses the Chancellor's autumn budget is an un-missable public sector pay cap."

Davies Chief opportunity to scrap the Janet Davies, Chief Executive and General Secretary of the Royal College of Nursing, said:

"This summer, nurses have shown the Government that they have had enough of poor pay. They are struggling to keep up with the cost of living and there are reports it pays better to work in supermarkets than care for the most vulnerable.

"It's a false economy to keep nurses pay down, short staffing is threatening the safety of our patients That's why we welcome the support of MPs who are championing nursing and share our belief that the 1% pay cap should be scrapped. Nurses will not tolerate having their pay squeezed any further. The Government must put party politics aside and lift


