A POLICE UPDATE

The Neighbourhood & Response teams working out of Newton Aycliffe have been busy responding to a variety of incidents across the area over the past week, including Concerns for Safety, Missing Persons, Shoplifting, Domestic Incidents and Harassment.

Response officers responded to a report of an ongoing domestic incident. Officer arrived on scene and apprehended the suspect, who was arrested for criminal damage and court related offences. He was taken to custody where he was charged, remanded, and put before the courts the next day. On Saturday 2nd March officers from response and the Neighbourhood Team arrested several males for going equipped. They have been bailed whilst enquires are ongoing. A number of companies on Aycliffe Business Park were also visited as part of ongoing reassurance patrols.

On Sunday officers arrested a male who was wanted for outstanding bail offences.

On Wednesday, PCSO's from the Neighbourhood Team attended a multi-agency walkabout around the Western Area in Newton Aycliffe. Working with partner agencies is an important part of our day-today working.

E-Bike patrols have been conducted around Newton Aycliffe, covering areas such as Tesco and the town centre, Greenfield Way, Williamfield Way and Stephenson Way.

On Thursday, a male was interviewed for a number of shoplifting offences, where he admitted the offences.

A number of Herbert Protocols have been completed over the last couple of weeks. These forms assist emergency services in locating a vulnerable person if they were to go missing. If you know somebody living with Dementia/Alzheimer's, who you feel could benefit from this, please get in touch with the team or send us a private message. Patrols have been increased around the Tesco area, after an increase in calls relating to Anti-Social Behaviour. A number of youths have been identified from CCTV footage.

PCSO's have attended numerous addresses to give out target hardening equipment to vulnerable

Focus on ASB - Living a Nightmare

Within and between the streets of our towns and villages, a silent, and sometimes deadly, epidemic persists, with victims of anti-social behaviour (ASB) enduring unacceptable repeated incidents of harassment, alarm and distress often described by victims as living a nightmare.

The fear of repercussions often stifles reporting, which in turn perpetuates an environment where significant underreporting disguises the true extend of ASB in our communities and resources are not deployed to where and when the incidents are occurring only where the incidents are reported and recorded. If not addressed, ASB can disrupt daily routines and cause annoyance and frustration. Victims may alter their behaviour to avoid certain areas or situations. Sometimes this avoidance option is not an option if the ASB is linked to a neighbourhood dispute, which leaves many victims feeling trapped and isolated and a prisoner in their own home.

The fear of going out, the anxiety of encountering the perpetrators and the frustration of feeling powerless can take a toll on mental health and overall quality of life. Repeat incidents of ASB can quickly escalate from perceived low-level behaviour to more serious crimes and tragic consequences if not addressed and taken seriously, The tragic case of Fiona Pilkington serves as

a haunting reminder that such situations are not merely hypothetical but ticking time bombs waiting to explode. The link between ASB and mental health crises cannot be underestimated, yet government funding for victims does not include support for victims of ASB. Sadly, reference to victims of ASB is absent from the Victims Bill and this is something I have raised with all our local MP's, ministers

and shadow ministers urging them to call on the government to address this glaring omission. As a Police and Crime Commissioner I am responsible for commissioning a range of victim services. So, I have been determined to ensure all victims of ASB get the same valuable support as victims of crime. I have brought victims services in house and appointed an ASB victims Champion who ensures victims voices are heard and we learn from their experiences and address unresolved cases of ASB.

In County Durham and Darlington all victims of ASB can now access victim support services through our highly acclaimed Community Peer Mentor Service. Something I believe all ASB victims living in England and Wales should have access to.

To dismantle the silent suffering of ASB victims and end their living nightmare, all agencies must acknowledge the plight of victims and allocate necessary resources for mental health and support services. We have to make it easier for victims to report ASB and give them the confidence that we will take complaints seriously. Only then can we hope to prevent the tragedy of Fiona Pilkington from repeating, and truly make our communities safe and secure for everyone.

Across the day, the children took part in activities linked to the book. These ranged from designing and making flower bookmarks in EYFS, to creative writing across the school. Children also designed their own front cover for their own version of 'The Secret Sky Garden'. All the work that the children produced will be displayed in our school library. Children all received a book token at the end of the day to go and spend on a brand new book.

Police Officer Boost Welcomed

Police and Crime Commissioner Joy Allen has welcomed new funding to recruit an extra 11 police officers over the next twelve months - but warns the uplift does not go far enough.

Chris Philp, Minister of State for Crime, Policing and Fire, wrote to the County Durham and Darlington PCC and Chief Constable Rachel Bacon to confirm the force's success in the 2024-25 Additional Recruitment Scheme. The Force has been asked to recruit an extra eleven police officers above the number it needs to maintain its current headcount in 2024-25, bringing the total number of officers to 1379. With the additional recruitment allocation, Durham Constabulary will receive a total of £48k per officer to cover salaries, training, and other associated recruitment costs. The funding is dependent on the Force achieving its full maintenance headcount and the extra eleven officers. Commissioner Allen welcomed the extra officers but said the force was still 128 short of 2010 levels and renewed her calls for an overhaul of the current funding formula to level the playing field and increase support for areas with high demand and greater pockets of deprivation. "Any influx in police officers is good news for our communities. These additional 11 officers will make a vital difference to the neighbourhoods they are asked to serve, supporting existing officers to tackle highimpact crimes and meet demand pressures.

"However, Durham is still trailing behind when it comes to police strength through no fault of our own. Unlike many forces which have seen their headcount grow beyond 100 officers, we have more than 100 less than 2010 and it is already starting to show.

"There is a limit to what can be realistically achieved when the odds are firmly stacked against us. Cutting crime and keeping people safe costs money. And we don't have enough. And, while I am pleased at this small step in the right direction, I will make the point again that it is time for the Government to urgently rethink its current policy to remunerate police forces more fairly and restore our numbers to what they were before.'

The Commissioner reiterated that Durham still has the joint lowest budget per recorded crime out of similar sized forces. The rate is also below the national average.

This is despite the region falling into the highest band of permanent exclusions from schools in England, leaving more young people exposed to criminal exploitation and harm. Additionally, the north east also has the highest rates of drug and alcohol related deaths, which increases demand on policing.



N.A.F.C. REPORT

Newton Aycliffe 2 v Stocksbridge Park Steels 1 Saturday 9th March

Newton Aycliffe followed on from their epic victory over league leaders Stockton Town with a 2-1 win over Stocksbridge Park Steels. In comparison to Tuesday's gripping match, this game was a quieter affair. Stocksbridge had the game's first two chances from Jack Tinker and Ross Goodwin, but both went high over the bar. Fortunately, Aycliffe would score



with their first big chance, after twenty minutes. Toby Pascoe crossed to Liam Jarvie who was deep in the Stocksbridge box and poked the ball past Ben Townsend with ease.

The first half scoreline would remain 1-0, mainly due to Townsend doing well to deny both Jarvie and Ethan Wood's strikes. The second half would prove a bit more interesting. Most of the early attacking was from Stocksbridge starting with Luke Rawson narrowly missing a header. A few minutes later James Winter would have to make a quick save after a swift low shot from Kurtis Turner.

The game would remain rather quiet again until the hour mark, a ball from a corner would be whipped into the Aycliffe box and Winter did well to deny Jack Watson from close range, parrying the ball away to Marc Costello who launched the ball out of the box. Liam Adamson and Jarvie launched a quick counter-attack, but Jarvie's shot went high and wide

The Stocksbridge pressure continued, and this time Costello could only clear as far as Luke Hogg who calmly sent the ball past Winter to make it 1-1. Stocksbridge seemed more than happy to play for a draw, while Aycliffe spent the remainder of the game searching for the winning goal. Jarvie's curling shot was easily saved by Townsend. Jake Petitjean would also challenge Townsend but the Stocksbridge keeper once again stood firm.

Adamson and Kyle Davis have exhibited brilliant link up play throughout the season, and the winning goal was no exception. Davis weighted the perfect pass to Adamson who feinted passed Tinker, and fired an absolute rocket of a curling shot that hit the top corner on the way into the net. Davis would almost get a goal of his own immediately after, but this time Townsend found the ball with ease. Aycliffe would see the game out, and earn yet another victory at home to now make it a nine game unbeaten run.

The two sides have just seven days before they renew their rivalry as the reverse fixture is at Stocksbridge on Saturday 16th March. Aycliffe then return to Moore Lane on Saturday 23rd March for the visit of Winterton Rangers.





I want to start this week by sending my best wishes to Councillor Jimmy Atkinson who is poorly, get well soon Jimmy.

Monday 4 March started with a morning train to London followed by a meeting with Matt Vickers, Member of Parliament for Stockton South, to discuss the adjournment debate, Matt had succeeded in getting to raise concerns about the proposed solar farm running from Bishopton to Brafferton. Adjournment debates take place at the end of each day and are usually just one Member raising a point for a Minister to answer, but Matt and I had worked together on this as it affects both of our constituencies, so we were both able to speak. I am a fan of solar farms, but concerns have been raised at the scale of those planned in this area and the consultation process. The debate took place at the end of Monday's business. Earlier in the day I had hosted a session on Demand Responsive Transport which is one of the potential opportunities to fix some of the gaps in bus services we have.

Tuesday started at 8.30am at a British Airways' showcase event where a number of the Transport Select Committee were guests to see their plans for the future. Then it was into Westminster for a meeting with the Local Government Minister to raise Durham's concerns again. Later it was an online session with Darlington Council Leadership and then I chaired a meeting of my Left Behind Neighbourhoods' All Party Parliamentary Group. Here we heard how culture had supported the recovery of some communities. I then performed my duties as a Parliamentary Private Secretary at a Westminster Hall debate on wine duty before joining the Bus Minister, Guy Oppermann MP, to particularly discuss the X21 service that used to connect Sedgefield, Fishburn and Trimdon to Newton Aycliffe. We discussed this with Arriva and have follow up meetings scheduled to see how we can recover this connection.

Wednesday was Budget Day and is one of those occasions when the Chamber is full. This means that if you want a particular seat you need to be in the queue for when the doors open. I was therefore there at 7.30am ready for 8.00am to secure the seat traditionally taken by Treasury Parliamentary Private Secretaries, directly behind the Chancellor. As a Treasury Parliamentary Private Secretary this meant I joined the Ministerial team in No 11 before appearing with the Chancellor and team in Downing Street for the traditional pictures. I then headed to the Chamber for the usual Prime Minister's Questions and then the Budget speech. The speech is responded to by the Leader of the Opposition and then other

Members of Parliament start the four days of debate. This means that myself and the other Treasury Parliamentary Private Secretary, Jerome Mayhew, spend a lot of time in the Chamber supporting the Ministers. On Wednesday evening I went to a dinner where the Rt Hon Penny Mordaunt MP, Leader of the House, was the main speaker. On Thursday, I went into the Chamber for Business Questions where I raised a question with Penny Mordaunt as to progress on the infected blood enquiry. Later I took some visitors around the Palace of Westminster before then spending some time performing my duties as Parliamentary Private Secretary re the budget speech. Took the train home on Friday morning before time in the constituency that started at Sugar Hill School talking to the Year 5's, then to Trimdon Station (Deaf Hill) for a constituency surgery where once again the issue was primarily buses! After this I went to Ferryhill and called to see constituents in the Dean & Chapter before briefly calling at the Scout Centre in Newton Aycliffe. I was pleased to see the Rail Minister commit further funds to support the business case for the Leamside Line which is significant for long term transport plans in the North and we also saw another £73m announced to support buses in County Durham so I will be doing all I can to ensure our part of County Durham gets at

Saturday saw me at Fishburn to speak at the celebration of an extension to the Community Centre. Lynne and the team have been extraordinary in their efforts. Then it was over to St Michael's Church in Heighington to attend the meeting led by the Friends of the Stockton & Darlington Railway team on Heighington Station and the plans to revitalise it. We heard about its extraordinary place in history as the oldest railway station and platform in the world. They have a campaign running on their website, https:// www.sdr1825.org.uk/ where you can either donate funds or just register your support. Even just registering your support helps them have good numbers for other funding applications.




