Residents Reminder

Residents are being reminded of three elections taking place in County Durham in May.

On Thursday 2nd May, elections are taking place to appoint a Police and Crime Commissioner for the Durham Police area, which includes Durham and Darlington, and a Mayor for the new North East Mayoral Combined Authority.

There will also be a local election taking place on this day for Durham County Council's Horden division.

Poll cards will be delivered to residents from 25th March. Anyone currently registered and eligible to vote in this election will receive a poll card with details of their voting preference. Anyone who is listed on the electoral register can request a postal or proxy vote, which can now be done online.

To apply for postal or proxy vote online, voters will need to provide their national insurance number and their signature to be checked by the Department of Work and Pensions. For these elections, the deadline for postal vote applications is 5pm on Wednesday 17th April and 5pm on Wednesday 24th April for proxy vote applications.

Online applications for postal and proxy votes can be found at www.gov.uk/vote-uk-election. Anyone who wishes to vote in person at these elections must show an acceptable form of photo ID, such as a passport, driving licence or concessionary travel pass. A full list of acceptable photo ID can be found on the poll card or online at www.gov.uk/how-to-vote/photo-id-youll-need.

Voters who do not have an accepted form of photo ID can apply for a free Voter Authority Certificate at www.gov.uk/apply-for-photo-id-voter-authority-certificate.

All applications for a free Voter Authority Certificate for this election must be received by 5pm on Wednesday 24th April.

For these elections, the deadline to register to vote is midnight on Tuesday 16th April. Anyone who is not registered or has recently moved house and not informed electoral services is encouraged to register by the deadline. This can be done online at: www.gov.uk/register-to-vote.

Scrutiny Panel Recruitment Now Open

The Office of the Durham Police and Crime Commissioner (OPCC) is keen to hear from members of the community across Durham and Darlington who want to make a real difference and become volunteers for existing and new scrutiny panels.

and become volunteers for existing and new scrutiny panels.

The OPCC carries out a wide-ranging programme of external scrutiny via groups and panels made up of partners and members of the community and are an additional mechanism for the PCC to hold the force to account and form part of the wider OPCC Accountability Framework.

Scrutiny Panels consist of the Custody Detention Panel, Best Use of Stop and Search/Use of Force (BUSS), VAWG/DA/SV (Violence Against Women and Girls, Domestic Abuse and Sexual Violence), Public Complaints, Independent Ethics Committee, Out of Court Disposals (OoCD) and Animal Welfare Scheme.

Scrutiny panels, which will be ran on a voluntary basis, will look to support a consistent, coherent, and credible approach that results in evidence-based recommendations to Durham Constabulary for positive change and will look to constructively challenge the Force's existing ways of working and identify any organisational learning.

The groups will be responsible for critically examining a sample of cases, including Body Worn Video footage and documents, and identifying any issues which point to disproportionality in police actions, leading to corresponding changes by the Constabulary to rectify these issues. They will also recognise good practice that takes place.

Andrea Petty, Chief of Staff (OPCC), said: "It is so important that we create opportunities to hear voices from our local communities and respond to any feedback and recommendations made to promote trust and confidence in policing. "Not only is this an excellent opportunity for volunteers to let us know their thoughts, but it is also a chance for them to get some experience of understanding policing practices to ensure we are continuously improving, addressing concerns, celebrating successes and meeting the needs of victims and the public."

Newton Aycliffe 2 v Winterton Rangers 0 Saturday 23rd March 2024

Newton Aycliffe picked up another impressive home win against Winterton Rangers last Saturday. Brian Atkinson's side now haven't lost at home since early February and are in the playoff places as the season approaches the business end. The first chance came when Toby Pascoe crossed the ball to Jack Clarkson, Clarkson then deftly lobbed the ball over Joe Simpson and exhibited great acrobatic skill to find the ball again and fire a shot at Nathan Popple who was forced to make a one handed save. Charlie Dawson hit a shot



from range soon after but once again, Popple made a one handed save.

Winterton have been bottom of the table for a large majority of the season, but they were still a very competitive side in the first half. Ethan Ord had to think fast to dispossess Owen Vincent who was almost one-on-one with James Winters. Winters would be called into action again when Vincent's cross easily found Paul Grimes, but Grimes' header was parried by Winter and all Sam Aynsley could do was fire it high and wide.

Scott Matthews, for Winterton, whipped in a dangerous free kick from outside the box, but Winter quickly saved it before Grimes could get to it. After this Winterton pressure however, Aycliffe would score their first goal of the afternoon, Cieran Jackson's cross grazed the leg of Dawson, and the ball found the foot of Kyle Davis who fired a spectacular volley at an incredibly tight angle to make it 1-0 in the 28th minute. The first half would finish 1-0, ending with Matthews having another free kick in a promising position, but this time Winter didn't even need to move to save a poor low shot from range.

The second goal came when Lee Ridley initially won an aerial dual

with Liam Jarvie, only for Ridley's header to gift the ball to Liam Adamson. Adamson then proceeded to waste no time in getting near Popple and cheekily nutmegging him to finish off a truly sublime goal. Aycliffe would carry on attacking, and Jarvie fired a curling low shot, but was denied by Aynsley almost on the goal line.

The game became a quieter affair later in the second half until Wayne Whitfield received a red card in the 86th minute. Winterton would not make the man advantage count, however, & the score remained 2-0.



Last week, week commencing Monday 18th March, started with a constituency meeting with the ladies from Unique Abilities for People with Disabilities. They operate a sensory session/support group every third Saturday of the month in Neville Parade Community Centre for anyone who'd like to find out more. Then it was off to London in time for the Lords Amendments to the Safety of Rwanda Bill. This concluded with ten votes as the House of Commons sent the amendments back to the House of Lords having disagreed with them. The voting time is substantial as each vote takes eight to ten minutes, with a short gap between each, meaning ten votes can take close to two hours. On Monday evening, whilst the votes were taking place, I was simultaneously at an Armed Forces dinner listening to Major General Felix Gedney, OBE, who enlightened us on many of his experiences. Trying to be at a dinner and vote led to a very disjointed evening and I felt for the Major who had numerous MPs constantly going up and down to the voting lobbies. Tuesday was Treasury Oral questions in the Chamber, meaning I was on the second bench supporting the team. Following this, the Financial Secretary to the Treasury, Nigel Huddleston MP, held a meeting to discuss progression of the Finance Bill and later it was the Transport Select Committee private meeting before meeting Lee Rowley MP, the Minster for Housing in the Department for Levelling Up, Housing and Communities to raise concerns about housing tenancies in Ferryhill.

Wednesday started at an All-Party Parliamentary Group meeting on Eggs, Pigs and Poultry before a phone catch up with Durham County Council leadership. Then it was a Teams meeting with Byers Gill about the planned Solar Farm between Brafferton and Bishopton where I reinforced the need for better communication with residents, before heading to the main transport Select Committee session. Lunchtime was the usual Prime Minister's Questions then an Urgent Question in the Chamber about the HM Revenue and Customs helpline before the Post Office (Horizon System) Offences Bill which was all about repealing the sentences of the Post Masters who were victims of such an appalling miscarriage of justice. There were meetings about Pharmacies and then National Highways before heading over to the 1922 Committee. As this was the last 1922 Committee meeting before a recess, as usual the Prime Minister addressed us. The support in the room for the Prime Minister was strong as he reminded us about the many good things that have been delivered by the Government since 2010.

Thursday was a one-line whip, meaning I could have headed home Wednesday night, but it was Transport Oral Questions on Thursday morning and I wanted to raise

some issues, so I stayed. I managed to get the Bus Minister, Guy Opperman, MP, to support my campaign, to replace the X21 that used to connect Sedgefield, Fishburn and the Trimdons to Newton Aycliffe. I was also very pleased to get the final question in Topical Questions to encourage the Secretary of State for Transport, the Rt Hon Mark Harper MP, to do all he can to support the rail rolling stock orders for companies like Hitachi. I know that he and the team at the Department of Transport are doing all they can and the misleading and non-deliverable commentary from opposition politicians is neither helpful nor productive. I have engaged consistently with the Transport team, Hitachi management and Hitachi Union representatives, and I will continue to work with anyone and everyone to support Hitachi and any other business in Sedgefield. Then it was a train north ready for Friday which started with a surgery where we used the services of the Deaf Empowering Network to provide British Sign Language assistance for a constituent in our meeting with her. We will always try to facilitate extra support for anyone who needs it when we meet. I had the pleasure of going to St Mary's Catholic Primary School in Newton Aycliffe to take questions from their Year 5 and 6 pupils and later had meetings with other businesses. On Saturday, I finished my week by calling in at Neville Parade to see Unique Abilities and also met Tony and Neil from Ferryhill who operate an inclusive football group for those of all abilities, including disabilities, before then going to the Newton Aycliffe Youth and Community Centre to visit the Rotary annual model railway exhibition.

Week commencing 25th March is a short week in Westminster as the House rises for Easter recess on Tuesday evening after which I will be back in the constituency.
