# Primex European Division Support for MTB Athlete

Liam Clement (19), Enduro Mountain Biking Athlete from Scorton, Near Richmond, North Yorkshire, is very grateful to have the continued support of Newton Aycliffe based Polyolefin Sheet Extrusion company Primex European Division for the 2024 season of competition events. After a successful 2023 season, Liam has spent the winter months training which included a two-month trip to New Zealand where Liam practiced and competed in events including the New Zealand National Championship.

Liam's plan for this year is to again compete in the UCI EDR Under 21 World Series which consists of six rounds based in Europe, together with all the major UK events which will include Ard Moors, Ard Rock, Scottish Tweedlove Championship and the British Championship in August.

Liam recently returned after a busy period in Europe competing in the first two rounds of the World Enduro Series. Liam competes in the highly competitive Under 21 class, against 50+competitors representing 16 countries from around the globe.

Round 1 took place at Finale Ligure in the steep Rocky Mountains above the Italian Riviera seaside resort. The event turned out to be extremely tough with 30-degree heat and very tight transition times. Liam dug deep and completed the event without any time penalties scoring UCI World Series points, qualifying him for the full series.

After a long drive, through Italy, Slovenia, Hungary and Czech, the team reached Poland to compete in the steep wooded mountains close to Bielsko-Biala. The Polish event covered five stages of steep technical tracks which also had very fast sections. Liam, competing as one of only two UK qualified riders, again scored UCI points finishing in 30th position to claim an overall World ranking of 25th

Liam now has two UK based events to compete in, Ard Moors and the Tweedlove International, before a trip to the French Alps and Switzerland for further UCI EDR World Series events. Liam called in to Primex's Newton Aycliffe production facility to thank Alan Pollitt (General Manager) and show him the Merida One-Sixty 10K bike that he is riding this year for Meridabikes who, together with Primex European Division, The Dirtfund Project, Royal Racing, Siverback Xtreme, Smith Optics UK, 7ldp protection and Danny Harts Descend Bike Park, help make it possible to compete at



international level.

### The Queen's Award

Sunday 26th May 2024 saw the presentation of a Queen's Badge to Benedict (Benny) Crossen, a member of the 1st Newton Aycliffe company of the Boys' Brigade at Neville Parade Methodist Church during the normal, communion service led by the Rev. David Payne. The Badge was presented to Benedict by Councillor Carl Robinson, the past Mayor of the Great Aycliffe Town Council, with an address by Geoff Knapton, the President of Great Aycliffe Rotary, whose organisation supported the company and, which, they in turn, reciprocated. Other members of the company and their officer, Lieutenant Alistair Elliott, were present to witness the proceedings too. This event is significant for several reasons:

Benedict is the second born of twins to Gerard and Sharon Crossen, they are now 21 years of age. He and his twin brother both achieved their Queen's Badge at the same time and, while his twin, Bailey, was presented his award on 8th October 2023 by Cllr. Carl Robinson, while he was still Mayor, Benny was away at Preston University studying Computer Science so, recently, Cllr Robinson completed the job. Benedict and Bailey are the youngest two of a family of four boys, the older pair (not twins) are Gerard and Finlay who, in their younger days, also achieved the Queen's Badge, so the whole family are Queensmen. This may well be a record.

The Queen's Award is the highest achievement in the church-based Boys' Brigade and has been in existence since 1952, predating the Duke of Edinburgh Award which can be worked for in the BB as can the BB President's Badge, the award before the Queen's Badge. After this, it will be a King's Badge as it was before the late Queen ascended to the Throne.

Since the change of Monarch, it may be that this has been one of the last presentations of a Queen's Badge for a long time.

### Unjustified **Council Tax**



I am really starting to question just what on earth do we, the residents of Aycliffe, get in return for the council tax that we have to pay? It is extortionate, unjustified and, in a lot of peoples' cases, I don't doubt, unaffordable. The green spaces in Woodham, on both sides of Woodham Way, where the BMX bike track is, were cut on the 14th May. The grass was a foot long, well overdue and the leftover cut grass would provide enough silage to feed a herd of cows for a full month! How are kids expected to play any ball games on there with that much cut grass lying all over the place? And then there's the recurrent issue of overflowing bins. This has been a problem for years and has been commented on previously, though it does not get any better. I can't imagine they are emptied more than once a week, but, if they are, then it needs to be even more than the current number. It's just not good enough.

I'm only living in a band C property and yet I have to pay £2300 a year, or £230 a month for ten months. To some families that will be a big chunk of their monthly income. As a pensioner, that is a lot to me.

What happened to the rant that Councillor Stead made about the double taxation we are forced to pay in Aycliffe, whereas residents in Chester le Street. Crook and Consett pay significantly less than we do? Like all politicians, he has dropped the subject like a hot potato.

I'm sure other readers will be able to highlight plenty of other examples of reduced services in Aycliffe that are seeing this town fall further into decline. Perhaps it's time the salaries of the Chief Exec of Durham County Council, (well in excess of £100,000), and other top ranking councillors, were cut just like our services that are dwindling more and more, year on year.

### Register to Vote?

People in County Durham are being reminded that they must be registered to vote if they wish to have their say in the forthcoming UK Parliamentary General Election.

The election takes place on Thursday 4th July and poll cards will be delivered to residents from Friday 7th June.

Anyone currently registered on the electoral register and eligible to vote in this election will receive a poll card providing details of their voting preference, either voting at an allocated polling station or voting by post or proxy. Anyone who is not registered or has recently moved house and has not informed electoral services is encouraged to register online at www.gov.uk/register-to-vote by midnight on Tuesday 18th June.

Anyone who wishes to vote at these elections must be registered to vote in County Durham and must also show an acceptable form of photo ID which include passports, driving licences and concessionary travel passes, such as an older person's bus pass. Voters will also be able to use expired ID if they are still recognisable from the photograph. Polling cards will contain a full list of accepted voter ID and full details are also available at www.gov. uk/how-to-vote/photo-id-youll-need. Voters who do not have an accepted form of photo ID can apply for a free Voter Authority Certificate at www.gov.uk/apply-for-photoid-voter-authority-certificate. Residents who need any help applying for a Voter Authority Certificate or who would prefer a paper application form should contact Durham County Council's electoral services team on 03000 261212 or email electoralservices@ durham.gov.uk.

All applications for a free Voter Authority Certificate for this election must be received by 5pm on Wednesday, 26th June.

Anyone who is listed on the electoral register can request a postal or proxy vote. The new government online portal is the simplest way in which to complete a postal or proxy vote application. Residents will need to provide their national insurance number and upload a sample of their signature when making their application. ### **Major Milestone for North East at NETPark Phase 3**

The £62million expansion of one of the UK's premier science parks has taken a significant step towards completion. The Phase 3 development of the North East Technology Park (NETPark) at Sedgefield reached a major milestone as



the last piece of steelwork was fitted at the site.

Representatives from Durham County Council and construction partner Kier, as well as the North East Combined Authority, Ryder Architecture, Clear Futures, gathered on site to mark the occasion.

The Phase 3 expansion will provide 11 new units and an initial seven hectares of space – rising to 16 – for laboratories, offices, production, and storage. It builds on the success already achieved by the park, which is home to 40 companies and 700 employees.

The expansion has the potential to create another 1,250 skilled jobs, plus 2,200 in the supply chain, and to be worth £625million to the local economy over the next 10 years.

A further 44 hectares around the site have been designated as development land, paving the way for a fourth and potential further phases of NETPark and the site ultimately hosting 3,000 to 4,000 highvalue jobs.

Cllr Amanda Hopgood, Leader of Durham County Council, said: "We are pleased to have reached this key milestone, which signifies the Phase 3 expansion of NETPark taking shape. It really is an exciting time for the park given the significant investment we have made, allowing Phase 3 of the site to come out of the ground, and its designation as a Growth Site in the new Investment Zone for the region.

"The entire phase of development unlocks huge potential for the county, with over 230,000 sq ft of new lab and scale-up production space, creating high-value jobs and widening supply chains. It will provide more and better jobs and benefit the local and regional economy by enabling growth and attracting and retaining leading businesses in the science, technology and engineering sectors. Construction of Phase 3 is being delivered by Kier.

As part of its appointment, the company is delivering social vaue back into the local economy by supporting the council's County Durham Pound initiative through training opportunities, work experience, employment initiatives and local spend.

Daniel Doherty, regional director at Kier Construction North & Scotland, said: "We are incredibly proud to have reached this significant milestone at NETPark. This is an exciting project for Kier which represents the ongoing importance of the North East as an area of growth for us, as well as our commitment to delivering outstanding projects in the science and technology sectors.

"The completion of the steelwork gives us the opportunity to celebrate the expertise, hard work and dedication of the team responsible for delivering such a remarkable building, which will leave a lasting impact on the local community for years to come."

An initial £5.1million Local Growth Fund grant awarded by the North East Local Enterprise Partnership allowed the necessary highway infrastructure to be put in place to open up the land for development. Building on this investment, the North East Combined Authority has awarded a further £10.7million, alongside £3.9million of North East LEP funds from its North East Investment Fund and Getting Building Fund, to support the creation of high-quality units for research and production activities.

Due to its strategic importance to the region, NETPark has also been designated as a Growth Site through the creation of a new Investment Zone for the region, aligned to the £4.2billion North East devolution

At Growth Sites, the council and businesses will have priority access to significant flexible funding which, it is intended, will take the form of a capital-based co-investment programme.

It will see the region benefit from £160million of government money over the next 10 years, unlocking hundreds of millions of pounds of investment from the private sector and creating up to 4,000 new jobs. Photo: Durham County Council, Kier and representatives at NETPark Phase 3.



### **Aycliffe Cricket Club Scoreboard Report**

Aycliffe's U15's were well beaten by ten wickets, away at Richmond, in the NYACC League despite a fighting innings by Liam Scott, who top scored for Aycliffe with 18 runs off 20 balls, including two boundaries. The U13's lost by 90 runs, away to a strong Darlington RA, in the NYACC League Cup.
