Government Agrees £300m Deal for Hitachi



Local Member of Parliament Alan Strickland has welcomed the Transport Secretary and North East Mayor Kim McGuinness back to Hitachi to launch a major new investment in the plant. Secretary of State Heidi Alexander MP, Arriva and Angel trains announced a £300m contract to build 45 new carriages for the Grand Central route from Sunderland to London Kings Cross. This follows the visit by Prime Minister Keir Starmer to the factory in Aycliffe Business Park, in December, to announce a £500m deal, which

These deals are part of the government pledge to take action to boost Hitachi's order book and address production gaps. The latest contract involves the development of nine new trains that use battery technology instead of diesel back-up engines. This innovative green technology paves the way for further growth opportunities at the Newton Aycliffe facility.

secured the factory's future after years of uncertainty.

Local MP, Alan Strickland, who has been campaigning for the factory's future for three years, said: "I'm proud that Hitachi's worldclass manufacturing plant in Aycliffe has now received £800m of new orders since the general election. This decisive action by the Labour government is securing highly skilled local jobs and bringing much needed investment to our area. I'm proud to have worked hard with government ministers, rail industry leaders, Hitachi management and trade union representatives to campaign for these groundbreaking deals.

Jim Brewin, Hitachi UK Chief Director, said "We have been blessed with the support we've had from North East Mayor Kim McGuinness to local MP Alan Strickland and the Prime Minister. What we've really been taken back by is just how much the workforce here has been acknowledged."



Shildon Community Bus Service Waiting List Now Open

Shildon Community Bus has committed to purchasing a brand-new mini bus with the help of Durham County Council. Our older bus, which has a boot, is nearing the end of its useful life and we cannot service our client base with just one mini bus. We promote social inclusion by providing transport for social, leisure and educational outings. We support social groups based within a 10 mile radius of Shildon. Our weekly shopping trips, picking up in Newton Aycliffe and Shildon, are very popular. Examples of our affiliated groups include a walking group and sports supporters. All of these need to access a bus with a sizeable boot to enable gear and shopping to be transported safely. Our second bus cannot be used for these groups as the

tail lift leaves no storage space. We have almost reached the final amount that we need. We now ask for the support of the public for the final push towards our goal of £100,000.

Nigel Price has kindly agreed to walk a total of 140 miles, in six stages, over eight days, with a view to publicising our appeal.

Nigel's walk began on 10th April at Styford Hall and finished at Wall, Hexham. There are five other stages: Souter Lighthouse and the Leas to Tommy's Sculpture at Seaham, a full circuit around Derwent Reservoir, Thirsk to Darlington, Horwich to Manchester Ancoats then Ancoats to Huddersfield and back again. The final stage will be from Darlington to finish at the Shildon bus office on the 27th May. While Parliament is in recess, I've been busy working hard for our community and our country. In the last few weeks we've seen major decisions by the government to back British industry and support home-grown manufacturing. I was delighted that the Labour government agreed a major £300m deal for Hitachi Rail in Newton Avcliffe. I welcomed Secretary of State for Transport, Heidi Alexander MP, back to Aycliffe to announce the deal between Hitachi, Angel Trains and Arriva for the development of nine new batterypowered trains. This will see 45 new carriages manufactured at the plant, carrying cutting-edge green technology. I'm very proud that this innovative new product was developed at the facility in Aycliffe Business Park. It opens up a whole new market in train production, which I hope will pave the way for further growth and opportunities in our town.

This deal follows the £500m agreement announced by the Prime Minister in December, which secured its future amid the damaging uncertainty left by the previous government.

Safeguarding this world-class factory has always been my top priority. My first action as a Labour candidate in late 2022 was to take then Shadow Chancellor Rachel Reeves to the plant and I've worked hard on this issue ever since. This new order brings reassurance to the skilled workforce but is also good for the thousands of jobs in small businesses the local supply chain.

On Saturday 12th April, I went back to Parliament to vote for emergency legislation to save British Steel. I'm proud that Parliament backed decisive action by the Labour government to keep the blast furnaces open, so that primary steel will continue to be made

in our country. This urgent action was needed after the plant's owners refused a very generous offer of support from ministers and threatened its future by stopping raw materials coming in. The British Steel facility in Scunthorpe manufactures 90% of the steel used in our railways, is central to our defence supply chain and makes steel used by industry, including on Aycliffe Business Park. The Labour government will never let the security of our country or critical infrastructure be threatened by global firms. Nor will we let 2,700 skilled manufacturing jobs go to the wall in that way. I strongly support the tough action taken by government ministers and was pleased to be in the House of Commons to back the emergency measures.

The decisive action taken at Hitachi and British Steel is an important change from the dither and delay under the last government that caused these problems in the first place. I'm also really pleased that we're seeing concrete improvements locally. NHS waiting lists have fallen for the sixth month in a row, Durham Constabulary is putting more police officers on our streets thanks to additional government funding and I was pleased to see the State Pension increase by £470 this month as a result of this government's commitment to the triple lock. Thousands of pensioners across the constituency will see their incomes boosted by this. The State Pension is set to go up by around £1900 over the course of this

I'll keep working hard to make sure our area sees the benefits of the investments being made in our country. Happy Easter - I'd like to wish all Newtonians all the best for the Easter weekend.

Knife Angel Winner



Last month children had a visit from the local police regarding the Knife Angel that will be coming to town on 31st May. The Knife Angel, created by artist Alfie Bradley and the British Ironworks Centre, is made from over 100,000 seized blades. The sculpture was created to highlight the negative effects of violent behaviour of all types including knife crime, domestic assault, sexual abuse and county lines. Knife crime is particularly poignant for Newton Aycliffe after one of the town's teenagers, Jack Woodley, lost his life to knife crime in 2021. Since then, Jack's mum, Zoe McGill, has been working with Newton Aycliffe Neighbourhood Policing Team - Sergeant Andy Boyd, to add her story to workshops, delivered by Sgt. Boyd, to thousands of schoolchildren in the town.

Based on this information, St Francis' Years 5 and 6's were tasked with a competition of creating posters relevant to knife crime and the angel itself. They researched the Angel, where it came from, why it was important and linked it to knife crime and how it could affect and make people feel.

Entries were submitted and Sienna-Mae Smith was awarded first prize for St Francis Junior School.



Ken Robson for South Ward

Popular local Independent Councillor Ken Robson will be standing for Durham County Council, South Ward on 1st May. Ken has lived and worked in Newton Aycliffe since 1964 and has been instrumental in some great endeavours over that time from forming Woodham Burn Neighbourhood Watch, building Aycliffe Central Residents Association to finally registering ACORN Community Association Newton Aycliffe as a fully registered charity.

AČORN has been active, over the years, with many campaigns including fighting to save our police station which was demolished under Labour Police & Crime commissioner Ron Hoggs tenure and then had the land sold off depriving residents of a police station. We were promised a police station, but ended up with a small office attached to our fire station. As a Councillor, Ken has continued to fight for a police station in Newton Aycliffe and an increase in police numbers.

ACORN fought Durham County Council to have elderly people's bins collected from their houses when DCC insisted the elderly and infirm must drag their bins to the end of their roads. 
I have always encouraged working together in partnership with others, and, as part of our Great Aycliffe Area Action Partnership have helped it make a great difference.

My Journey and Community Involvement

I wanted to share a little about my journey and involvement in the Newton Aycliffe community. We moved from Brandon to Newton Aycliffe to start work at B.X.L. Chemicals, after travelling for a year.

We moved to Newton Aycliffe in 1965, on Easter Saturday, it was snowing that day! With my wife



I became interested in local politics and started going along to meetings as a member of the public. Eventually, I was co-opted onto Newton Aycliffe Town Council in January 1990 and have been elected every year

since. This is now my 35th year as a town councillor. I was made Mayor in 1992/93, raising £5,000 for Motor Neurone Disease. Later, I raised another £3,000 for the Heart Foundation as Town Mayor, for the second time.

I was elected to Sedgefield Borough Council on 4th May 1995 and served until 2009, when it was disbanded and all went to Durham County Council. My scheme then took up its land, now known as the Tesco way space. Now it stands on in Newton Aycliffe.

Once again, as Mayor of the Sedgefield Borough, I managed to raise £20,000 for Breast Cancer and Prostate Cancer (£10,000 each). After devoting 14 years to Sedgefield Borough Council, I was granted the title of Honorary Alderman on the 16th March 2009.

I was elected to Durham County Council on 5th May 2005 and served until 2008. During this time I acted as Vice Chair of Highways and, during my time, I was able to install 32 drop kerbs to assist disabled residents and an additional 14 bays of off street parking, which was sorely needed at the time.

I was re-elected to Newton Aycliffe Town Council on 2nd May 2013 and also 6th May 2021 and have served a combined total of 35 years as a local councillor. In the past I have served in the St. Johns Ambulance Corps for 50 years and received the honour of Serving Brother from the Queen.

As a local Town and County Councillor I have always felt it was my duty to not just serve, but deliver what the town and people require, this means taking the time to listen to the people I represent and pushing tirelessly to achieve these goals. You can count on my experience and understanding of local government and my commitment to the people I represent is unwavering and as strong as ever.

I want to posthumously thank Syd Howarth for printing the banner under which I stood for election twelve years ago, as this has reduced the amount of paper and waste that usually goes hand in hand with elections

- The Great North Air Ambulance Service (GNAAS) is a charitably funded air ambulance service which provides life-saving care throughout the North East, North Yorkshire. Cumbria and the Isle of Man. This covers from the Scottish borders, down to South Cumbria, and across to North Yorkshire.
- They operate two helicopters 365 days a year and also operate a night-time service in the North East and Cumbria on rapid response vehicles.
- The aircraft cover an area of more than 8,000 square miles and on board are specialist doctors and paramedics who effectively bring the hospital to the patient.
- The level of skill and expertise of the onboard team mean they respond to the most critically ill and injured people, giving them the best chance of survival.
- GNAAS is a progressive organisation which has pioneered pre-hospital care in the region.
- The latest techniques, equipment and drugs are constantly being evaluated to ensure the charity can provide the best care possible for their patients.
- On average, the charity respond to six call-outs per day (including their night-time response) to people in the community in their darkest hour.
- · They do not receive Government funding and must therefore raise £9.3m a year through public donations to remain operational. This means the cost per day for the charity is £25,200.

> The County Council of Durham (A167 Avcliffe Village) (Temporary Road Closure) Order 2025

The Council proposes to make an Order under Section 14(1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 as amended, to prohibit all vehicular traffic from proceeding on the following lengths of road. A 7 kilometre length of the A167 extending north from St Andrews Way Roundabout, south of Aycliffe Village to the junction with Durham Road north of Aycliffe Village, the junction of the A167 with Lime Lane and a 20 metre length of West Road, from its junction with the A167 to enable carriageway resurfacing works to be undertaken. An alternative route will be available to vehicular traffic from the southern side of the closure, from A167 north westerly and northerly on B6444 St Andrews Way, to the junction with Heighington Lane leading to the western part of Aycliffe Village, or continuing north on Durham Way South / Durham Way / Durham Way North and east on St Cuthberts Way, to A167 to the northern side of the closure and vice versa. The maximum duration of the Order is 18 months. The proposed works are to commence on Tuesday 6/5/2025 and are anticipated to be completed in 9 working commence on Tuesday 6/5/2025 and are anticipated to be completed in 9 working nights, between 7pm-6am per night (no works over the weekend). On occasions, alternative dates for the closure may be necessary and these will be signed on site
