



As Police and Crime Commissioner for County Durham and Darlington, I know our police officers are often the first on the scene when tragedy strikes. Whether it's a cardiac arrest, a collision, or a sudden medical emergency, their actions in those critical first minutes can mean the difference between life and death. That's why I am delighted to report that every

single response and neighbourhood policing vehicle across Durham Constabulary is now equipped with a lifesaving defibrillator - thanks to the Red Sky Foundation and OurJay Foundation, whose tireless fundraising efforts, compassion and determination have made this significant milestone possible.

This £185,000 investment, launched on Restart a Heart Day, was the result of ordinary people doing extraordinary things - running, climbing, donating, volunteering and fundraising to save precious lives. 140 defibrillators and replacement pads have now been installed across the force area, giving our officers the equipment to help people and save

Behind this initiative are powerful personal stories that remind us of what is at stake. The Red Sky Foundation was inspired by Sergeant Terry Archbold's daughter, Beatrix, who suffered heart failure at just 16 months old. Thanks to a heart transplant in 2023, she is now thriving. The OurJay Foundation, created in memory of teenager Jay Hughes, shares the same mission - that no family should ever lose a loved one because help was not close enough.

These two charities have joined forces to campaign for defibrillators to be mandatory in every police response car across the UK. Durham is only the second force in the country to achieve full coverage, and I want to see that change rolled out nationally. The impact is already being felt. In Northumbria, where Red Sky Foundation first

Northumbria, where Red Sky Foundation first installed defibrillators earlier this year, at least four lives have already been saved. Precious lives that might otherwise have been lost. As BlueLight Commercial Chair I have seen how this work is being driven forward nationally through BlueLight Commercial, with the previous Home Secretary's support, we were able to provide a number of defibrillators for every force fleet across England and Wales after a meeting with Jays parents. It is a powerful example of how campaigning, and collaboration between charities, communities, and policing - can deliver real, measurable change.

But we cannot rely on goodwill alone. With fewer than one in ten people surviving a cardiac arrest nationally, and just one in sixteen in the North East, we must all play our part. These devices are simple to use, but they are only lifesaving if they are nearby. So today, I'm asking residents and businesses to join us.

- Support the 'Red Sky Foundation' and 'OurJay Foundation'.
- Help fund defibrillators for your local community especially in rural areas, where seconds can make all the difference.
- Learn CPR. Know where your nearest defibrillator is. Talk about it at work, school, and in your neighbourhood.

Because, when the worst happens, you could be the person who saves a life.

Our officers are ready. Our partners are committed. Now it is time for all of us to accept that challenge - to turn compassion into action and ensure no life is lost for want of a defibrillator.

Together, we can build safer, stronger, and more resilient towns and villages - where every second truly counts.





One of the honours of being our Member of Parliament is the ability to give a national voice to local families, to give important issues a bigger platform and fix things that are letting local people down. I was very fortunate to be selected for the

second week running to ask a question to the Prime Minister, to do exactly that. I spoke up for Shannon and Tyler, who tragically lost their two-year-old son Hudson in January. Hudson was diagnosed with gastroenteritis during an NHS 111 telephone consultation. In reality he was suffering from a twisted bowel. His condition quickly worsened and he was rushed to Darlington Memorial Hospital where, despite the best efforts of doctors, he sadly passed away.

Shannon and Tyler have shown extraordinary courage in the face of heartbreak. They are full of praise for the medical staff who tried so hard to save Hudson's life, but they believe an in-person appointment might have allowed for a more accurate diagnosis and quicker more effective treatment. In Hudson's memory they have launched a campaign calling for guaranteed face-to-face NHS appointments for children under five. Their petition has already gathered more than 80,000 signatures. I raised this with the Prime Minister, asking him to ensure that Shannon and Tyler can meet with a Health Minister to make their case. The Prime Minister agreed, offered his condolences and confirmed that a meeting will take place. There was strong support and best wishes to the family from MPs across the entire House of Commons. I've since discussed this issue further with the Prime Minister following my question and am grateful for the support he's providing. Improving access to face-to-face NHS appointments and enhancing medical care for children are both priorities for the government - I'll keep pushing on this important issue of access to in-person diagnosis for under-fives.

It was a pleasure to welcome the Secretary of State for Education, Bridget Phillipson, to Ferryhill. Bridget outlined her inspiring plans to give every young person the best possible start in life, including investment in free breakfast clubs, school-based nurseries, family hubs, higher school standards and better vocational training.

As Bridget's Parliamentary Private Secretary in the Department for Education I'm proud to support her in delivering this vital work. We are incredibly lucky to have so many talented young people in our community and we must do all we can to help them thrive.





'Remembrance Soldiers' **Art Installation**

Academy pupils create powerful remembrance soldier installation for Hopetown Exhibition, sponsored by Wilsonart Beaumont Hill Academy in Darlington, a specialist school for children and young people with special educational needs, has brought its entire

a poignant tribute to display at Hopetown Darlington in honour of the Armed Forces

Around 300 pupils, aged 2 to 19, have contributed to a striking art installation titled 'Remembrance Soldiers', featuring 40 two-sided silhouettes of 'Tommys' - life-size representations of WWI soldiers - to mark this years Remembrance Day.

Each 1.2-metre-tall silhouette has been carefully designed by a different class. One side of each soldier is painted in dark grey to represent the sombreness and sacrifice of war. The reverse side bursts with colour, decorated with red and pink poppies, Union Jack flags, moving poetry, and uplifting messages, reflecting themes of hope, gratitude and peace. Originally displayed on the school's football field, the installation is now set to be showcased at Hopetown Darlington between Tuesday 4th November and Sunday 16th November, covering the period before, during and after Remembrance Day.

Hopetown's agreement to host the display means the wider community including national and international visitors - will now be able to engage with this reflective and inspiring tribute.
