## **Military Pension**

Dear Sir.

We once again have a Labour government in power who, like those since 1974–79, say they will look after our military veterans - including our current MP, Alan Strickland.


In 1975, Harold Wilson changed the pension structure for the Armed Forces, resulting in veterans receiving less money when they were demobbed. Later, Tony Blair introduced further changes, reducing the pension paid to widows of service personnel from 50% to 33%. By comparison, council employees' widows currently continue to receive 50% of their partner's pension.

Mr Strickland visited serving military personnel in Cyprus in July this year, the same location where many veterans served in July 1974 during heavy bombing, in which lives were lost.

I would therefore like to ask Mr Strickland to show his support for veterans by seeking to restore the pension allowance for widows to the previous 50%, in line with council workers.

## Is It Worth It?

Dear Sir,

There have been a few rumblings recently regarding the standard of service from Royal Mail, specifically the lack of postal days for letters and rumours that parcels are taking priority over mail in general.

I had cause to go to the sorting office at Newton Aycliffe to retrieve an important letter a couple of weeks ago. I strongly suspected that it would be sat there and 'lo and behold' it was - but it was not going out that day.

I spoke with the manager who informed me that Royal Mail are indeed prioritising parcels over letters and that they are only delivering letters every other day, whether first class or not. This 'every other day postal service' officially goes live in April next year and that is apparently across the whole country.

If this is the case, then hospitals, for one, will have to take this into account when issuing important hospital appointments. Personally, I can no longer see the point in paying the extortionate amount of £1.70 for a first class stamp anymore, when there is every chance that it is not even going to arrive next day, as most people paying for this service, rightfully expect.

Now that I have heard this officially, I felt I should let your readers know so that they can make their own informed decision as to whether or not they buy first or second class stamps going forward.

## **Woodham Paris Trip**







A recent Woodham Academy art trip to Paris provided students with an opportunity to explore the city's artistic treasures, from world-famous museums to hidden street art gems.

The journey began with a visit to the stunning Sacré-Cœur Basilica in Montmartre. The panoramic view of Paris from the basilica's steps was breathtaking. Seeing the inspirational work of street artists in Place du Tertres provided an inspiring start to the trip before enjoying an evening meal in a traditional Parisian restaurant where Van Gogh is believed to have visited regularly.

Next on the itinerary was a visit to the Musée d'Orsay, a former railway station transformed into a haven of Impressionist and Post-Impressionist masterpieces. The students were mesmerised by the works of Monet, Degas, and Renoir, amongst others. The museum's grandeur and architectural beauty only added to the artistic experience. This was followed by a visit to Notre-Dame Cathedral, where students were able to take in the Gothic architecture and see the progress made since returning the cathedral to its former glory following the fire in 2019. The opportunity to observe an unexpected wedding inside the Cathedral made the visit extra special. Following this, students enjoyed a guided bus tour around Paris, seeing many iconic landmarks closely, such as the Arc de Triomphe and the magnificent ancient Egyptian Luxor Obelisk. After an evening meal in Paris, the day concluded with a surprise trip to see the fully illuminated Eiffel Tower, which proved a real highlight for our students.

The second day began with breathtaking views of Paris from the Montparnasse Tower Observatory. Located on the fifty-sixth floor, the rooftop platform allowed students to take some very impressive

photographs of panoramic views of the city. This was followed by a cruise on the Seine on the renowned Bateaux Mouches, where students viewed the famous Paris landmarks from the river. The day concluded with a hands-on graffiti workshop at Bercy Park, where the group had the chance to express themselves artistically through spray cans and urban art. Under the guidance of a local graffiti artist, they learned about the street art culture and created their own vibrant pieces. Before embarking on their journey home, a visit to the Louvre provided a fitting end to the trip, where students explored the countless galleries filled with sculptures, paintings. ancient artifacts and saw the world-famous Mona Lisa.

# Public Urged to be Vigilant This Winter

People in Durham are being asked to stay vigilant this Winter, as crowds are expected to visit the city to celebrate the festive period. With footfall increasing in the city as people enjoy the Christmas markets, shops and restaurants this month, Counter Terrorism Policing and Durham Constabulary are urging members of the public to trust their instincts and report anything that doesn't seem right. Superintendent Mark Jessop is the Head of Protect and Prepare at Counter Terrorism Policing North East. He said: "We're delighted to team up with Durham Constabulary to launch regional support for this year's winter vigilance campaign. The festive season is a busy time for many people, and that includes the police and security services who are working to keep people safe in our region's towns and cities.

"Sadly, the terrorist threat hasn't gone away, and the threat level nationally remains at SUBSTANTIAL, which means an attack is likely. Whilst there is no intelligence to suggest there is a specific threat to Durham, or our region, we still need the public to be our eyes and ears and help keep each other safe. Counter Terrorism Policing is working around the clock with MI5 and other partners to monitor the threat and protect our communities from harm. Last year we arrested more people for terrorism related offences than in previous years, but the support of the public is essential to our mission to keep people safe.

"Our message is simple. If you see something that doesn't feel right, please report it to police or security staff. Don't worry that you're wasting our time, we take every report seriously. Let's look out for each other this winter, so that everyone can enjoy the season safely."

The request comes as national figures revealed that 19 late-stage attack plots were disrupted by the police and MI5 since 2020, including three that were stopped last year. Like many other cities across the UK, police in Durham are taking appropriate, precautionary steps to deter terrorists and to promote vigilance.

Durham Constabulary Superintendent Dean Haythornthwaite said: "Our officers work 24/7 every day of the year to make sure Durham is a safe place to work and live and while there is no specific threat to our area, more can always be done which is why we welcome the collaboration with our colleagues at Counter Terrorism Policing. We would encourage anyone who sees anything suspicious this winter to report it and help us to keep the streets safe where you live."

If you spot something suspicious, or think you might have useful information, please report it in confidence on 0800 789 321, or at *gov.uk/ACT* - in the case of an emergency, always call 999.

In the second half Johnson found himself one on one with Kyle Seymour and Seymour pulled off a smart reflex save to deny the pacy number 10. Aycliffe had a lot of possession for the remainder of the second half, but the score remained the same and Emley had the final chance of the match when a breakaway from an Aycliffe set-piece gave Emley's Kieron Ceesay a good striking chance, but Seymour denied him. Emley didn't score from the resulting corner and the game ended 1-0.

Newton Aycliffe have signed Ashington's Jake Orrell. Orrell is no stranger to football at this level after featuring for both The Colliers and Consett AFC. ## The Wonders of Space & Light

Pupils at St. Joseph's were treated to an extraordinary educational experience when Adam and James from Kielder Observatory visited with their remarkable inflatable planetarium. This immersive dome transported children on a journey through the cosmos, allowing them to explore stars, planets and galaxies in a way that truly brought science to life.

Following the planetarium adventure, pupils participated in an interactive workshop focused on Light. The session went beyond the basics, introducing pupils to the fascinating concepts of infrared and ultraviolet light. ## **Run By Coffee!**



A chance quest for coffee and cake has resulted in a brand-new adult training boat and strengthened community bonds between Durham Freemasons and the Chester-Le-Street Amateur Rowing Club. Earlier this year, the Durham Freemasons Parkrunners visited Chester-Le-Street Parkrun, only to discover that their usual post-run café spot was unexpectedly closed. Determined not to miss their traditional coffee, cake and banter ritual, the runners wandered over to the nearby Chester-Le-Street Amateur Rowing Club, which happened to be open and warmly welcomed them inside.

Over steaming mugs and friendly conversation, members of the Parkrun group learned that the rowing club faced a major challenge. Despite growing adult membership, the club lacked an adult-sized training boat, an essential piece of equipment for safely introducing new rowers to the sport. Rankin, who had not been in a rowing boat since his days in the Sea Cadets, also took the opportunity to take the new craft out onto the water. He said: "This is the perfect example of how unexpected community connections can turn into something lasting and meaningful. What began as a search for coffee has grown into a partnership that supports grassroots sport and strengthens local opportunities. We are delighted to help the Rowing Club expand its adult training and to see this boat already making a difference."

With smiles, gratitude, and many slices of cake, the collaboration born from a closed café has become a shining example of community spirit. It is truly Run By Coffee!

> The County Council Of Durham (A167 Ricknall Lane, Newton Aycliffe) (Temporary Road Closure) Order 2025

The Council on 31/1/2025 made the above Order under Section 14(1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 as amended, to prohibit all vehicular traffic from proceeding on the following lengths of road, a 5.36 kilometre length of the A167 between its junctions with the A689 Rushyford Roundabout and the B6443 St Cuthberts Way, Newton Aycliffe to enable carriageway re-surfacing works to be undertaken. An alternative route will be available to vehicular traffic from the northern side of the closure from A167/A689 Rushyford Roundabout, westerly on A689 to Bishop Auckland, south westerly on A688 to Tindale Crescent then south easterly on A6972 to the junction with B6444 to Aycliffe, or continuing south on A6072 onto A68 leading to A1(M) Junction 58 Burtree to the southern side of the closure, and vice versa. Local diversions will be available between A167 and Ricknall Lane via Lime Lane. The maximum duration of the Order is 18 months. The resurfacing works were carried out from the 10/2/2025 over a period of 5 nights, however it is now necessary to carry out additional carriageway resurfacing works which will be carried out between 8pm and 6am from Monday 15/12/2025 for a period of 2 nights, On occasions, alternative dates for the closure may be necessary and these will be signed on site accordingly.

## **Prevention Training**

Dear Sir,

I am writing to you about the amount of times our local emergency services have been called out to suicide and self-harm incidents. The Government currently doesn't ensure our emergency services provide staff with any national standard of suicide prevention training; and yet, Samaritans found that last year, North East Ambulance Service were called out to 40,016 mental health-related and 21,481 suicide and self harm-related incidents. These new figures show just how often our local emergency workers are in contact with those in suicidal crisis - and why training all emergency response workers in suicide prevention is urgent.

Right now, our emergency responders and anyone who is in crisis from our community are being failed. These workers are often first on the scene when someone is suicidal, so providing them with the skills and confidence they need to identify and support anyone who is suicidal could save lives.

I urge readers to email your local MP and back Samaritans' call for mandatory suicide prevention training for our emergency responders, to help reduce lives lost to suicide in the area.



It was really inspiring to visit five of our local schools to mark Parliament Week, an annual event to increase understanding of Parliament, our democracy and participation in public life.

The school council at Woodham Burn Primary School asked brilliant questions and were full of great ideas for adding new equipment to the playground. After our meeting, the school council members took me on a tour of the school. The students were a real credit to our town. The school had also run a competition for the students to pitch their ideas to me about how we can all improve the environment. I'm very grateful to the 65 students who wrote down or drew their many ideas for what we could do. From these brilliant ideas, I've picked three winners, who will be receiving certificates and small prizes from the parliamentary gift shop very soon!

At St Joseph's Primary School I took questions from a number of classes in the school hall. To add some fun and give a taste of life in Parliament, I asked the pupils to 'bob' to ask questions rather than raise their hands - this is the tradition in the Commons that members stand up to show they'd like to speak. What followed was an energetic and enthusiastic question time! Again the questions were excellent, with the young people showing real concern about a wide range of issues and coming up with lots of ideas for improving our town and wider world. At Elemore Hall special school in Chilton, the students in the junior leadership team showed me round the school, so I could meet and take questions about Parliament and democracy from a range of classes. It was great to hear about the work happening at the school to involve young people in democracy - shaping ideas for the changes they want

I also had wonderful visits to Ferryhill School, where I took questions from year 10 about a wide range of issues and to Dean Bank Primary School to meet the pupils there.

All of the visits showed just how interested young people in our communities are in the world around them. I was struck by their motivation to make a difference and to powerful ideas they had to improve their schools and society more broadly. Really inspiring and I look forward to continuing to encourage young people to have their voices heard as I visit schools throughout the year.

In other news, the Labour government has delivered its Budget for this year. I was particularly pleased to see full compensation announced for members of the British Coal Staff Superannuation Scheme which affects many of us locally. I've been campaigning on this since my election, both in the House of Commons and privately with ministers, so I'm really proud to see a good resolution for members of the Scheme. It was also good to see measures in the Budget to tackle the cost-ofliving crisis, which I know has been having a huge impact on people in our area. Because of steps taken by the Chancellor, an average of £150 will be taken off the cost of household energy bills. I'm also really pleased that the Labour government have frozen prescription charges and rail fares, and have expanded free breakfast clubs to save more families more money, putting more money in families' pockets.

## Trapped.

Woke up Saturday morning 22nd November to find that I had been barricaded in without any form of prior notice.

Not only could I not use my car, but there was no way I could physically leave my property on foot as the only egress point was the drive and this was cordoned off with heavy barriers.

I talked to several of the workmen, informing them that I needed to leave, not one of them spoke

English, all they would say was 'Rumanian' or 'BT'.
The company signage read 'DLF Group', but no search of the internet could identify them as a bone-fide company, or provide a contact telephone number. I tried to contact DCC Highways Department, but as expected, they are closed over the weekend.

Besides the extreme inconvenience of being imprisoned within my own property, how was I to know if their intentions weren't egregious? Why are non English speaking foreign contractors allowed to severely inconvenience property owners without having the ability to explain themselves, surely an interpreter should be a minimum requirement? Have any other residents had dealings with this outfit? Name and address supplied.


