Olympus Global Announces Start of Construction in Newton Aycliffe

European automotive component distributor, Olympus Global, has announced it is soon to break ground on its new multi-million pound distribution facility in the North East of England.

Ambitious growth plans, a significant £2.7m investment, and industrial architectural designs, civil engineering and project management expertise by Building Design Northern (BDN) all came together on Monday 6th October when construction started at the 16,000 sq ft Newton Aycliffe site.

The announcement coincides with the launch of this year's North East Automotive Alliance (NEAA) event which sees organisations from across the whole industry supply chain attend the annual expo held in Sunderland.

Olympus Global, a UK and European-wide distributor of high-quality engineered components, is building its second UK warehouse distribution facility (the first in the North East) to directly serve industrial, automotive and wider supply chain companies in northern and Scottish regions.

The bespoke build - designed, delivered and project managed collectively by architectural and engineering firm, BDN, will see prime brownfield land at Aycliffe Business Park in County Durham be fully transformed into a fit-for-purpose scheme with dedicated storage space and modern offices.

The site will facilitate existing international customers including Unipres, Thorn Lighting and Gestamp Tallent (located opposite), and is anticipated to ship more than £7m worth of parts and engineering components in the first year of operations alone. The new facility will create up to 10 new jobs making a significant contribution to the local economy.

Ryan Doyle, Director at Building Design Northern (BDN) which is working on behalf of major UK-wide industrial and commercial clients including Olympus Global, commented: "Being able to announce the start of construction onsite is fantastic and it'll be great to start seeing our designs coming out of the ground."

"We have worked closely with Olympus Global right from the start across all requirements to support this major scheme, and our knowledge, industry insight and technical expertise across different architectural and engineering disciplines has proved critical, given our client is also based outside the region. The main contractor is ready to go, so getting ready to break ground on the site is good news for Olympus Global, the industry



and the wider business community too." BDN has appointed Hall Construction as principal contractor to deliver the development which also includes bespoke 'green' features to align with Olympus Global's commitment to carbon reduction and sustainability.

Olympus Global - a £38m turnover business - supplies engineering fasteners, precision-turned and machined components, castings, aluminium extrusions and forgings to major organisations within the industrial and automotive sectors. The Newton Aycliffe development will become the company's fifth site including its head office and distribution centre in the Midlands and further facilities in Spain and Hungary.

Keith Rice, Managing Director at Olympus Global, said: "We are delighted to be breaking ground at Newton Aycliffe as it is a key strategic site for the company, and one which marks a new chapter in our 50+ year history. We work very closely with the region's automotive supply chain, so it is also very timely to announce the start of construction date at NEAA's expo event."

"The North East and County Durham is a prime location, providing direct access to main transport routes and proximity to the industry's big players and cluster locations. Our clients are fast-paced organisations that require the highest level of turnaround, dispatch and efficiency, so we're delighted to be starting construction and making our mark here in the region."

3000 Baby Boxes Delivered

A child born during the festive season has become the 3000th in the region to receive a Baby Box.

North East charity 'The Children's Foundation' celebrated boosting the start in life for 3,000 babies at Christmas, with first-day essentials, information and support in the form of a Baby Box. A third of children in the North East live in poverty and these boxes

are designed to level the playing field for all youngsters. Baby Boxes include developmentally rich toys, early learning materials, baby essentials and expert guidance to first-time parents.

The scheme has been backed by North East Mayor Kim McGuinness, since she came into office, she has expanded the initiative to benefit more families across the region and is becoming a cornerstone of her strategy to tackle child poverty.

The model combines financial relief with relationship-based support delivered through midwives, health visitors and community partners, easing the pressure on stretched public services and giving families the confidence, tools and knowledge to support their baby's development from birth.

Sean Soulsby, CEO of The Children's Foundation, said, "Reaching 3,000 Baby Boxes isn't just a number, it represents real, individual families whose babies are now starting life with the essentials, the learning tools and the support every child deserves."

What started as a local, community led initiative has benefitted from private sector collaboration with warehousing specialist Stiller bringing the Baby Box scheme to life.

Stiller now provide contract packing services to ready boxes for expecting families.

Thomas Prentice, Business Development Manager at Stiller, said: "When we first learned about the Baby Box project, we knew straight away it was something we wanted to support and the project has grown into something the whole Stiller team cares deeply about. We handle the logistics planning, from stock management to making sure each box leaves us safely and gets where it needs to be, when it needs to be there. It's the kind of behind-the-scenes work we do every day as a business, but knowing it directly supports new parents makes it feel incredibly meaningful."

"Stiller has been part of the Northeast community for 71 years, and being able to use our contract packing facility and the expertise of our people to help get these boxes safely packed and delivered feels like a very real, hands-on way of giving back. Seeing the project reach 3,000 Baby Boxes is fantastic, and we're proud to have played a part in making that happen. Knowing that every single one is heading to a family that will start their journey feeling a little more supported is a great feeling, especially at this time of year."



Age UK Co. Durham Launches Workshop

Age UK County Durham is launching workshops across County Durham to share how exercise and adopting good habits can help the county's population stay healthy longer.

The 'Your Body, Your Chapter' workshops, designed for those aged around 50 to 70, will be full of practical advice on both physical and mental health.

Chloe Morton, Physiotherapist Assistant with Age UK County Durham, commented: "If we all have the right knowledge, we can get good habits in place. That's what these workshops are aiming to help with. They'll be fun, with quizzes and group activities and everyone will also have the opportunity to try various pieces of equipment such as light weights, balance equipment and resistance bands. These are the types of thing you can have at home and regular use could really help you stay fitter as you age."

"If we can help people understand the simple steps they can take to help keep themselves healthy, we will be reducing the demand on primary and secondary care providers in our communities. And, at the same time, we'll be helping people age with the confidence that they know how to look after themselves."



Make Your Voice Count



When people talk to me about policing, they rarely talk in headlines or statistics. They talk about the things that affect their daily lives. Anti-social behaviour that makes them feel uncomfortable in their own street. Speeding cars and dangerous driving outside schools and villages. Not seeing a police officer when they feel they need one. Noise, nuisance, intimidation, or repeat problems, that wear people down over time.

These issues may seem small to some, but for the people living with them they matter deeply. And they should matter to those responsible for setting policing priorities.

As Police and Crime Commissioner for County Durham and Darlington, one of my key responsibilities is to decide how policing is funded and what it focuses on each year. Around 30 per cent of police funding comes from council tax, so local people have a real stake in how that money is used. That is why I am asking residents to have their say. Policing faces increasing pressures. Officers are dealing with more complex crime, rising anti-social behaviour, violence linked to alcohol and drugs, and the very real dangers caused by speeding, drug driving and careless driving on our roads. At the same time, costs are rising, and resources are stretched.

There are no simple answers, but the right decisions can only be made if they are informed by the people policing exists to serve. This public consultation is your opportunity to tell us what matters most to you. Whether it is more visible neighbourhood policing, tougher action on anti-social behaviour, greater focus on road safety, or better support for victims - your views will help shape the priorities for the year ahead.

It is also a chance to say what action you want to see taken. Policing is not just about responding when something goes wrong; it is about prevention, visibility and working with communities to stop problems escalating in the first place.

Too often, people feel their concerns are not heard or that decisions are made without understanding local realities. I want to change that. I want policing in County Durham and Darlington to reflect the experiences of people who live and work here - in our towns, villages, and rural communities.

Taking part is quick and straightforward, but it makes a real difference.

This is your chance to shape policing priorities, influence how resources are used, and help ensure that issues like anti-social behaviour, police visibility and dangerous driving are taken seriously.

It is your police, so have your say and help your communities safer, stronger, and more resilient to alcohol and drug related crime and anti-social behaviour.

New Health and Wellbeing Hub

A brand-new community hub is opening in the Western area of Newton Aycliffe, bringing a wide range of health initiatives, wellbeing support, and community resources directly to the local community.

According to the Director of Public Health for County Durham's latest annual report, 15.7% of the adult population in County Durham (72,302 people) have a clinical diagnosis of depression. This is projected to rise by a further 24% by 2040 if no action is taken to address mental health and wellbeing.

The Health and Wellbeing Hub, located at 10/11 Silverdale Place, is aiming to become a central point for health promotion and community connection.

Developed in collaboration with Durham County Council with support from the Durham Mental Wellbeing Alliance and Livin, which runs the Ark community space next door, the hub is part of a broader effort to improve health outcomes and reduce inequalities in the area.

Clare Singlewood, Area Manager for Waythrough, said: "Health is about so much more than just the absence of physical illness - it's about feeling supported, connected, and part of a community. We're delighted to be launching our new Health and Wellbeing Hub to make that sense of belonging a reality for the people of Western Newton Aycliffe."

Open to people 16+, the hub will host group activities, wellbeing workshops, drop-in sessions tailored to the specific needs of residents, and a health and wellbeing book library. The space has been designed to welcome anyone from the community who needs it.

Putting Charity into Action at Christmas

Across the region last Christmas, Durham Freemasons were putting charity into action, demonstrating that the true spirit of Christmas lies not just in generosity, but in compassion, service, and human connection.

With support from individual Freemasons, local Lodges and the Durham Freemasons Charity, members came together to serve their communities at Christmas and throughout the festive period. Alongside financial support and community grants, Freemasons gave their time on Christmas Day through a range of activities, from serving meals in Spennymoor to offering companionship to those most in need in Sunderland.

This work builds on a long tradition of service across County Durham, Sunderland, Teesside, and South Tyneside, with Christmas support delivered throughout the region. Activities have included Feeding Families collections in Shildon, Hartlepool, Stockton, and Sunderland, as well as support for children's Christmas parties in South Shields, where 72 children were welcomed for a festive celebration, helping to bring joy to families facing difficult circumstances.

One powerful example is the "Wear Here to Support You This Christmas" programme in Sunderland, supported by a £1,500 grant from the Durham Freemasons Charity. Now in its twelfth year, the initiative was inspired by a volunteer who met a young man alone in Barnes Park on Christmas Day with nowhere to go. That moment led to the creation of a support network to ensure no-one in the community feels isolated during the festive season. With this funding, dedicated volunteers continue to provide free Christmas lunches, entertainment, and companionship to homeless, lonely, and vulnerable people.

This commitment to service is further demonstrated through the Feeding Families project, in which Freemasons support food collections and the distribution of essential supplies in Shildon, Hartlepool, Stockton and Sunderland. By working alongside local partners, the project helps families experiencing financial hardship to cope with rising living costs and ensures that households across the region receive practical support at Christmas.

The spirit of putting charity into action is also reflected in Peterlee, where a £1,500 grant from the Durham Freemasons Charity supported a Christmas dinner hosted by FACT - Fighting All Cancers Together - bringing together families, carers and people living with cancer for an afternoon of companionship, celebration and reassurance that they are not alone.

As families gathered to celebrate Christmas, Durham Freemasons were out in their communities, giving their time on Christmas Day through activities ranging from serving meals in Spennymoor to offering companionship to those most in need in Sunderland. This is living proof that the true meaning of Christmas is found in service to others.

Chris Lloyd makes a welcome return and his subject is 'Attacking the Devil and Sinking the Unsinkable', WT Stead, the greatest Victorian reformer you've never heard of.

He was responsible for getting the world's first children's protection act passed, but only by using scandalous tactics which he learned here in the North East as Editor of The Northern Echo.

He played a fascinating part in making mass murderer, Mary Ann Cotton appear such a devil and took an extraordinary interest in a ghost which punched a human.

He was also the most famous British person to drown on the Titanic and just as his journalism skills were forged in Darlington, so were large parts of The Titanic forged here - although the company responsible later tried to airbrush out its involvement in the world's greatest maritime disaster.

Everyone is most welcome: Admission £3 which includes refreshments.

North East Ambulance Service

Every minute counts when there's a life-threatening emergency, and the actions you take to help during those first few moments can have a major impact on the patient's chances of recovery.

Calling 999 in a life-threatening emergency is something that you hope you never have to do; and equally knowing who to call if it's not life-threatening can ensure that the ambulance is available for the next patient who needs it. The North East Ambulance Service (NEAS) has produced this information card to help you make the right choice if you, or a loved one, need help or come across someone else who does.

Andrew Eales, a public governor at NEAS, has the responsibility of representing his local community at governor meetings, challenging the board of directors and holding non-executives to account for the performance of the Board.

On sharing this information, he said: "I am not responsible for operations or day-to-day decisions at the ambulance service, but I am keen to ensure that this community feels assured of what to do if there is an emergency."

NEAS is one of fastest responding ambulance services in the country; reaching potentially life-threatening calls, on average, in less than seven minutes; and getting to seriously ill patients, on average, in just over 20 minutes. NEAS covers an area of 3,200 square miles from the Scottish border to North Yorkshire, serving a population of more than 2.7 million people. The service answered more than 1.4m calls to 999 and NHS111 last year, as well as transporting non-emergency patients to appointments, delivering training and providing medical support at events.

CDDFT Sets Out Major Reform Programme

County Durham & Darlington NHS Foundation Trust (CDDFT) has apologised to patients and their families who have been affected by failings in the Breast Surgery Service.

The apology comes as the Trust publishes and responds to an independent external review into leadership and governance failings. Alongside this, the new Chief Executive and new Interim Chair have set out their determination and commitment to take action with a comprehensive programme of reform and improvement.

The review, commissioned by the Trust and conducted by governance specialist Mary Aubrey, identified serious and long-standing weaknesses in clinical oversight, leadership action and accountability, and governance processes. This enabled poor clinical practice to persist. The Trust has accepted the findings of the review and, in addition to having implemented improvements to the Breast Service so that patients can be confident they will receive care in line with national standards, is outlining further plans to deliver organisation-wide change. The Trust has acknowledged the failings and is focused on overhauling its governance and leadership, delivering meaningful reform and restoring public confidence.

The Trust has already begun implementing a comprehensive action plan aligned with the review's recommendations. Immediate priorities include:

- Strengthening leadership capacity and capability and improving corporate governance
- Improving clinical governance and how we listen to the voices of our patients experience and communication
- Creating a safe and open culture where the voices of our staff are heard, where we have professional curiosity and take action promptly
- Improving how we manage contracts for services
- Improving medical leadership and management as well as the support to Consultants through job planning, appraisal and revalidation

CDDFT will publish progress updates through its Board and website, ensuring full transparency as reforms are delivered. This began with an open Board meeting on Wednesday 26th November. The Trust is also working closely with system partners, including NHS England, the Care Quality Commission, and the North East and North Cumbria Integrated Care Board, to provide independent assurance of progress.

The Trust recognises that rebuilding confidence and embedding a change in culture will take time, but its leadership team has made it clear that this marks a turning point.

Steve added: "This is about ensuring that what happened here can never happen again and that it brings a cultural reset for the Trust. We will be open and transparent, we will listen, and, fundamentally, we will deliver the changes needed to make our services safer and stronger for the future for our communities."

NEIGHBOURHOOD POLICING

Here is a brief overview of what we have been up to over the past week or so; On Monday, Neighbourhood Officers responded to a shoplifting at a store in Woodham. Within 15 minutes of the call, a male was arrested and transported to custody. On Tuesday, Neighbourhood Officers located and arrested a male who was wanted. The male was also driving a car with no insurance at the time, and the car was subsequently seized and recovered.

In the early hours of New Years Day, a male was arrested for multiple offences including criminal damage, assault and breaching a restraining order following an incident in Honister Place.

The team have responded to several calls of anti-social behaviour and criminal damage over the weekend relating to youths in the town centre. This behaviour will not be tolerated, and we are in the process of identifying those involved and they will be dealt with robustly. Extra patrols are being carried out in this area.

On Saturday, PC Tyers interviewed a male youth in relation to an assault and criminal damage in Woodham. The male admitted to the offences and will be dealt with by working with the Youth Offending Service.

On Sunday morning, a female was arrested on suspicion of assault following a domestic related incident.

Become Foster 'Aunt' or 'Uncle'

A North East council is to be one of the first in the UK to recruit a new type of foster carer. Durham County Council is working in partnership with Now Foster to introduce the Weekenders Programme, a flexible way for people to foster.

The new programme allows people to play an 'aunt' or 'uncle' role for a child in care, spending one weekend each month doing fun things together such as days out, swimming and sports, and other activities.

The initiative is designed to strengthen the support for children in care by giving them wider, family-style relationships while offering a flexible way for residents to become part of a child's circle of care.

Cllr Cathy Hunt, Durham County Council's Cabinet member for children and young people's services, said: "As the Durham Family, we are always looking for new and effective ways in which we can improve the lives and outcomes of our children and young people. Therefore, we are delighted to be one of the first local authorities in the UK to trial the Weekenders Programme.

"We know that many people would consider fostering, but are unsure if they have the capacity to offer full-time care. This scheme will open up our recruitment of foster carers by offering a more flexible way to support a child. It also allows our children to feel connected to trusted adults who can offer consistency, emotional stability, and a sense of belonging in a warm, fun, family environment.

"The scheme does not replace full time foster care and the valuable benefits and stability that come with it. The Weekender Programme is designed to build on the foundations of full-time foster caring, allowing the weekenders to play a grandparent, aunt or uncle role and give the child a wider sense of family."

Sara Fernandez, chief executive of Now Foster, said: "Many people want to support children, but aren't sure where to begin.

Weekenders makes that possible – it's about connection and care, a really good way to step into fostering.

"We're delighted to partner with Durham County Council to help more children build the lasting, trusted relationships they deserve."

The programme has been designed with social work professionals, experienced foster carers and care-experienced individuals. Weekender foster carers will be matched with a child or young person and receive full training to ensure they have all the skills they need to support them.

Member of Parliament Update

My very best wishes for a Happy New Year to all readers of the Newton News.

I hope you had a relaxing Christmas.

After a busy year in Parliament I was pleased to have a nice Christmas at my home in Aycliffe with my family and friends. Over the festive period, it was also great to join community Christmas events in Aycliffe and across our constituency. We have a very strong sense of community in Newton Aycliffe and Aycliffe Village, which was clearer than ever over Christmas.

I've been reading the Newton News - or the Newtonian, as I was brought up to call it - since I was a kid growing up on the town and it's a pleasure to contribute this column again for 2026.

I'm looking forward to continuing working hard to stand up for our area in the year ahead.

The latest figures show that, in 2025, I secured nearly £80,000 for local residents by working with my team to fight for local people who had been shortchanged by utilities companies, pension providers, the benefits system and other organisations. That's an incredible amount of money to return to local families and shows the value of a visible, active Member of Parliament not taking no for an answer when residents have been let down.

Working to support our business community, I was delighted to secure a £160,000 tax refund for a really prominent family-run manufacturing business on the industrial estate. After the company raised concerns with me that officials had got their bills wrong, I met with the relevant government minister in Whitehall to point out the areas where I felt mistakes had been made and ask for an urgent review. This led to a major correction and I'm glad to have secured this win for one of our brilliant local businesses.

In the year ahead I'll continue to push for improved public services, building on the additional police officers that have been funded and the reductions in NHS waiting lists that we've seen since the election. I was also very pleased that Health Secretary Wes Streeting announced a full statutory public inquiry into the appalling treatment received by some residents from the Tees, Esk and Wear Valley NHS Mental Health Trust. The last government failed to act. This government is cracking down on failure in the NHS and those who failed vulnerable young people with mental health issues.

Another priority is to keep campaigning for action to tackle the cost of living. I'm proud that the government has doubled free childcare from 15 to 30 hours, saving local families with young kids thousands of pounds a year; capped the cost of school uniforms, increased the minimum wage and living wage and increased the state pension by another £575 this year. All of this will put money in people's pockets.

It's been a privilege to pick up thousands of constituency cases for residents since I was elected and I'm proud to have held 50 constituency surgeries at community venues across the constituency. These are opportunities for residents to sit down with me to discuss in detail particular problems or issues - if you'd like to book a surgery

This opportunity came about as part of our student leadership pathway, through which students can gain leadership experience during their time at Woodham Academy in a range of roles, such as ambassadors, form or year group representatives, and members of the Student Leadership Team.

Heighington Matters

Fornax

As many of you know, a Hazardous and Clinical Waste Incinerator is being constructed on Heighington Lane. Understandably, this has prompted significant concern within our community. Much has been written in the press and on social media - some informed, but much based on speculation - which has added to the anxiety many residents feel.

As your Ward Councillor, I established a group of local residents back in 2021 to oppose the original planning application. I remain deeply aware of the strength of feeling in our parish and the importance of addressing these concerns openly. From experience, I believe that constructive engagement with Fornax, should the Environment Agency grant them a permit to operate, will be vital in ensuring accountability and reassurance.

To that end, I arranged a meeting with Fornax with three clear objectives:

- To establish a small Steering Committee of councillors and residents, meeting regularly to scrutinise operations.
- To secure real-time access to site monitoring data at the Environment Agency's Newcastle office.
- To ensure Fornax meet directly with local people to listen and respond to their concerns.

I am pleased to report that Fornax has agreed to the Steering Committee and to making their remote monitoring data available to the council. The live-streaming technology exists, but the EA have to be funded properly to receive it. It may well be a condition of the permit that Fornax have to stream the data directly to the EA office, but the EA is in control of how it gets data from Fornax and if in the future that is live-streaming then they can and will willingly comply. Until then, the EA has legislative powers to demand any data at any time and Fornax has to provide that data as and when asked for it, but I will continue to press this point. While many residents may never welcome the incinerator's presence, visible and verifiable monitoring would at least demonstrate compliance with Government and DEFRA standards. In recent months, I have arranged two further meetings between Fornax, members of Heighington Parish Council, and local residents. These discussions have been open and informative. I remain committed to trying to ensure that as many voices are heard and as much accurate information about the Incinerator is fed into the Community.

As such, I would like to thank one of our Parish Councillors for writing a detailed summary which took a considerable amount of time researching and writing up the account of our last meeting. I commend the Report to you.

The Report has now been emailed to everyone in my address book. Although some concerns were raised, the overwhelming majority asked me to pass on their thanks to the Report's author. Many said it has significantly eased their anxiety about the Incinerator.

Funding Boost Hopes To Get People Active



Durham County Council has partnered with Sport England to get people in County Durham moving by increasing accessibility to sport and physical activity.

Durham County Council has received nearly £500,000 in funding from the sporting body to help increase physical activity for those who need it most, particularly in the county's most inactive communities.

County Durham is one of 27 areas in England set to benefit from Sport England's £250 million investment. The national initiative seeks to make sport, physical activity and movement accessible to everyone by working at the heart of local communities.

The local authority was successful in applying for the funding and, in partnership with a range of local organisations, will use it to create new community-based roles. These posts will focus on researching barriers to physical activity and developing tailored solutions to overcome them. This will build on the success of a pilot project in Peterlee, where the council works closely with residents and local stakeholders to understand what prevents people from being active and how it can support healthier lifestyles.

The new funding will help to expand this place-based model to more towns across County Durham, including Shildon, Bishop Auckland, Newton Aycliffe, Stanley and Seaham.

Cllr Karen Allison, Durham County Council Cabinet member for leisure, tourism, regeneration and high street, said: "This significant funding boost will go a long way to improving our efforts to bring physical activity to as many communities as possible, while ensuring they are as accessible as possible. We already have a successful pilot project in Peterlee to support healthier lifestyles, and we're excited to bring this model to wider areas across the county. Together with Sport England, we aim to break down barriers and create more opportunities for everyone to enjoy the benefits of being active."

Research by Sport England highlights the importance of an active lifestyle, estimating that physical activity saves the healthcare system £8 billion annually by preventing illness. It also helps avoid more than 3.3 million cases of chronic health conditions each year.

Despite these benefits, less than half of children meet the Chief Medical Officer's guidelines for daily physical activity. Meanwhile, women, people from lower socio-economic backgrounds and Black and Asian communities remain less likely to be active than other adults.
