and night clubs. Taped music with a system offering stereo sound throughout the whole building can all be operated from within this one unit in the main hall.





Look-out for Senior Citizens

John Tully, County Road Safety Officer announced that during the last 18 months, 188 pedestrians over the age of 60 had been injured or killed on the roads of Durham. He went on to say that these horrifying figures underline the need for the driver to make allowances for the elderly pedestrian. Because they are old they may be less alert, less able to anticipate or respond to a dangerous situation.

Absentmindedness often leads to attempts to cross the road without looking. Many motorists forget the inability of the elderly to assess the speed of oncoming vehicles, this is often brought about by weakening eyesight, impaired hearing or the failure to judge the speed of vehicles correctly.

Mr Tully urged motorists to give the elderly more room to

move.

He stressed the need for elderly pedestrians to use zebra crossings wherever possible, cross roads at right angles to the kerb and away from parked vehicles and remember to give vehicles time to stop.

WEAR SOMETHING WHITE

He added that 62 of these casualties had occurred at night and that all pedestrians whatever their ages should remember to wear or carry something white at night. This makes them more easily seen by the vehicle driver.



How avoid skidding

Mr John Tully, the County Road Safety Officer announced that the sudden snap of cold weather has caught many motorists out. He said that research showed that 49% of accidents occuring in snow and ice involved skidding.

Many motorists blamed skids for accidents. Mr Tully said "This is just an excuse. A driver of a skidding vehicle has made a mistake and may pay for it with his life." His advice to avoid skidding is as follows:---

1 Use more care and less speed. Aim for gradual acceleration, smooth steering and careful braking.

2 Drive at low speeds. If you must use your brakes, a series of gentle applications is best. Allow yourself and others at least double the normal braking distance.

3 On negotiating bends reduce speed in good time-if you must brake-brake on the straight.

4 Before starting, clear all frost or snow from the windscreen and windows.

Mr Smith was trained at the Royal Academy of Music, is a Graduate of the Royal Schools of Music and has played with a number of orchestras including the English Chamber Orchestra. However at the conclusion of his training which was broken by three years service in the band of the Scots Guards, he decided to teach, and is now Senior Lecturer in Music at Middleton St. George College of Education.




