School's 'Special Unit' no bigger problem!

says Principal Dr. Hoghugh

Press, radio and television visited Aycliffe School to hear at first hand the details regarding the decision to build a £600,000 "Special Unit" to accommodate young persons who behave in a disruptive way, or who are a source of danger to the public.

Objections have been made to the siting of the Unit at Aycliffe with fears from townspeople that escapees may cause danger.

Dr. Hoghugh's answer to this was that the Unit was only an extension of the existing plant as they were already accommodating the potentially dangerous now. The new unit would improve the facilities for treatment and security of the inmates.

Like many of our readers I thought Aycliffe School to be an institution of corrective training with emphasis on discipline and punishment. I got an altogether different picture. The task of the school is to alleviate problems of the disturbed and deprived children by psychological approach; offering love and care to those

who have neither received or can give either.

INTENSIVE CARE

The special unit is intended to provide intensive care and treatment to those children who persistently run away or who are a danger to themselves and others, or who have such deep-seated problems that they cannot be helped by other agencies.

The age range is 8-19 and

the unit will house 36 youngsters who will be attended at all times by staff at a ratio of 1 to 4 youngsters.

The school will offer "maximum" security with constant checking for absconders, but the principal was keen to emphasise that this unit would not be a mini "Sing Sing" and that the prime objective is treatment rather than imprisonment. S.H.
