Questions, Questions

Aycliffe's Old People's Welfare Committee have mobilised 60 volunteers — many of them young people, including 6th formers and police cadets — to start action designed to improve the quality of life for some local people.

The volunteers are interviewers in a survey which will aim to reach everyone of Aycliffe's 7000 homes. Every household will be asked if there is anyone living there who is retired, or who considers himself to be infirm or handicapped.

All people who reckon they fall into one or other of these categories will be asked to answer a carefully selected set of questions about difficulties in using ordinary household equipment — like floor level plug sockets — and about getting round the town.

The O.P.W.C. will use the views it receives to campaign for modified housing and more accessible services.

A lot of care has gone into the survey — professional advice has been sought on its preparation, and the O.P.W.C. Chairman, Mr Pat Corrigan, is issuing all volunteer interviewers with signed identification cards.

The survey will take place between Mon. 16th and Sun. 29th Sept. and people can either give completed questionnaires to them, or return forms to the Information Centre.

If the survey affects you, do give the volunteers your help, remember they are doing it for goodwill, not money!

EDITORS COMMENT:

The survey organised by the O.P.W.C. is a fine idea, and they are doing a job an Act of Parliament said the local council should do i.e.: seeking out and registering the chronically sick and disabled.

This voluntary work has bitten hard into the cash resources of the committee, so it would seem reasonable to expect the local authority to reimburse them.

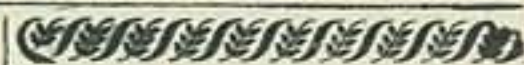

Open Day for Aycliffe School

Dear Sir,
As you know, Aycliffe School is the regional Diagnostic and Treatment Centre for disturbed and very difficult youngsters, serving the whole of North East England. It draws its children from the community at large, attempts to deal with them in an open environment and, in the majority of instances, returns those children either to their own homes or to other residential establishments within the community. The children present many problems with sometimes sensational repercussions which antagonise those who are not closely acquainted either with the nature of the children or of the manner in which the school attempts to deal with their problems. Additionally, the school has recently received extensive publicity in view of the plans to establish a unique long-term treatment centre for particularly disturbed youngsters as part of its facilities.

OPEN DAY

In the last resort, as the school can only carry out its task effectively if people understand its purposes and are prepared to give it their goodwill, it has been decided to hold an Open Day on Saturday 5th October at 2 pm on which members of the public can visit the school, see the buildings, look at the plans for the Special Unit, and have the opportunity of talking with the staff and the children. To help add to the attractions of a day's outing to the school, we are providing entertainment and the usual fete-like stalls, sideshows, exhibitions, jazz competition, refreshments etc. All this is in the cause of particularly deprived and damaged children and their greater understanding by the public.
