600 people need helping

Newton News have just had delivered a copy of the Interim report of the Old People's Welfare Committee on the recent survey of the Town they conducted

The report covers the infirm, handicapped and elderly residents and some interesting facts are brought to light which Authority should note very seriously.

A lot of these disadvantaged people are hesitant about publicity for themselves and their conditions, but nevertheless there is a record of nearly 600 replies to their credit in the highlighting of certain problems that mitigate their living comfortably — and this does not mean in luxury.

Matters such as the difficulty in reaching upstairs toilets, which to those with a heart complaint is a serious handicap. Or undressing or dressing in unheated rooms without the benefit of summer temperatures.

The problem of taking a bath when the difficulty of coaxing unbending limbs and bodies to yield is the first hurdle to be overcome. Simple

help with shopping. New fangled fires that call for one to get down on knees that are often arthritic, to struggle with fuel that is too often like trying to light stone.

A lot of these difficulties the younger residents can physically cope with even though tempers may be frayed in the task, but age takes toll of the first and turns the second into frustration.

The Old People's Welfare Committee have done something that has, to our knowledge, not been undertaken by any other Committee in the County and it is well we are made aware of the problems that have been uncovered. The Committee have a job in front of them and we wish them luck in their efforts to alleviate obvious needs.

But they deserve all the help that Authority and the public can give them in this work.

Strolling Players?

Pantomime in an open air theatre! That is exactly what it may have been for the Newton Players this year, if the Beveridge Hall hadn't been made available to them.

There are ten alternative sites, for such as the Newton Players to stage their production but they have had refusals to book for their annual pantomime from each of these, for various reasons.

Perhaps the Newton Players should change their name to the Strolling Players — buffeted from one venue to another in seek of a permanent home. This could be why the membership, although increased at the commencement of the year, is flagging. It seems ironic that one of the oldest societies of the town who were enterprising enough to build their own meeting and storage hut — should find themselves unable to book a permanent home, i.e. hall and

stage for their three annual productions a year.

LIVE THEATRE
It seems a great pity that Newton Aycliffe cannot have a live theatre of their own, there is talk of an Arts Centre in the future but this is of precious little value to an organisation which is receiving little official support for its activities TODAY!

Bureaucracy is stifling the active and dynamic interest of Newton Aycliffe in furthering the interest of Amateur Drama groups. Time is running out for the Newton Players, isn't it time they received official support, let's face it, in the past twenty five years or so they haven't asked for very much — just a suitable stage that they may continue to perform their productions to the public.

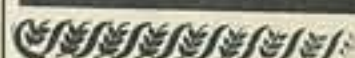

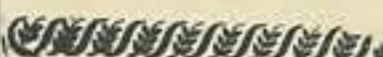

We received the following very interesting letter from former Housing Manager Miss Hamilton, concerning the first chairman of Aycliffe Development Corporation, Lord Beveridge:

Dear Sir,

There must be a number of people at Newton Aycliffe who remember with admiration and affection Lord Beveridge, first chairman of Aycliffe Development Corporation. When he lived at 5 Bede Crescent he was a familiar figure to the residents, entering with genuine keenness into all their social activities.

The plaque on No. 2 Butler Road commemorates his opening of the thousandth house to celebrate the Coronation of Queen Elizabeth II.

After he retired to Oxford I went to see him, and he was just as interested as ever in all that was happening in 'his' New Town.

While exploring Northumberland after my own retirement, I came across his grave in the churchyard of a very old and remote church at Thockrington. It struck me that those Newtonians who knew Lord Beveridge might be interested to see this photo of his resting place.
