Rent & rebate increases in Aycliffe

Rents of all Corporation houses in N/A are going up next month - but the rebate scheme has also been changed to allow higher rebates for more people.

from 16p for the oldest a e bedroom dwelling to 64p for a 4 bedroom detached house with garage, will come into ef-fect on April 4th.

Mr Frank Hiley, Director of the local authority" said Mr Finance for the A.D.C. said Hiley.

"The Government has changed the law on repts and the local authority" said Mr ged the law on rents and subsidies and instructed Local Authorities and Development Corporations to balance their housing accounts."

INFLATION

"In Newton Aycliffe, this means that we are having to increase rents by approxi-mately 10%, which does not seem unreasonable in view of the inflation which has occurred over the last two years and the fact that there have been no increases in rents du-ring that period. At the same time there are considerable increases in the allowances under the rent rebate scheme and these will alleviate the situation for the people who can least afford to pay."

The new rent rebate scheme can mean higher benefits for many tenants and rebates for some who did not

previously qualify.
"It is vital that the application forms are filled in by everyone at present receiving a rebate and we advise people who think they might qualify and especially all widows and single people with dependent children — to fill in their forms" said Mr Hiley. "The senior citizens will be given help in filling in the form by officers from the Housing Centre."

Houses which have had smoke control and other improvements are subject to additional increases of 10p or 22p a week-but these do not include any houses facing the highest increases. Some of these improvements were made as long as 2½ years

Garage rents will go up by 10p per week.

There have been no increases in house rent in Newton Aycliffe for the past two years; garage rents have not been increased since 1968.

Rate *increase*

Following the announcement by the A.D.C. of rent increa-ses, Sedgefield District Council have now fixed the General Rate, the Northumberian Water Auth. have published the Water Rate for next year, and it is at last possible to see the full effect of these changes on the inclusive rents in Newton Aycliffe.

The domestic general rate annuonced by Sedgefield is 72.1p in the pound for the Great Aycliffe Parish, and 72.8p for Shildon; increases of 15.36% and 12.87% respectively. The Water Rate is to be 9.81p in the pound, an increase of 20.89% increase of 30.8%.

In addition the domestic rate relief granted by the Government for 1974/75 is not to be continued next year and this adds something over 35p per week to the average rate figure depending on Rateable

The full effect of these increases is best illustrated by an example:-

An average 3 bedroom tenant paying an amount of £5.04 per week including rent and rates will now pay £6.06, an increase of £1.02. This is made up of 35p rent and 37p

Pro rata this means an average increase of approx. 20% to each tenant.

A.D.C. house boom for workers only

A.D.C. Chairman, Dennis Stephenson has announced that the house building programme in Newton Aycliffe will be "jacked up" in the next 2 years to accommodate the expected increase in industrial jobs.

This is a change of policy approved by the Ministry.

Previously the attitude was jobs first, houses next.

This new move will mean the A.D.C. can attract new industry to the town by saying they have a number of houses available for immediate occu-

This will only marginally alleviate the housing shortage for those living here alreadynamely the couples hoping to marry soon and live in their own home.

This policy though sound in the long term, will bring lots of criticism especially if houses remain empty for long periods.

RECREATION CENTRE DISTURBS IT'S NEIGHBOURS

Complaints from residents in the Lilburne Crescent area have petitioned against undue noise from the Recreation Centre, and its car park, which in some cases is only yards from their house.

Young children are being wakened by car doors banging and persons shouting to each other.

The noise from within the Centre is also causing con-cern. The dances and discos are particularly noisy, so it is being suggested that the windows are double glazed or the amplification equipment turned down.

"A lot of apathy in Aycliffe"

Helen Richardson and Peter Robinson, two 6th formers at the Avenue School, report the first of a series of interviews to be arranged with leading local arts organisers. Alec Belton, well known in the town for his wide variety of work supporting voluntary community action, was the subject of this first feature. They write:—

Let us start at the beginning. The District Councils have always been encouraged to promote art in any form, be it dancing, music, painting or acting. Before the boundary change, the financing of some of these activities was under taken by the Darling'on Dis trict Council who did their best to help in any way possible.

However, there has now been a local council of arts formed in Newton Aycliffe, run on grants given by the local authorities, the Development Corporation, the Town Council etc. The aim of the Arts Council is not just to give grants left, right and centre, but mainly to give a guarantee against loss to organisations who genuinely need the money to help with some plans for social activities in Newton Aycliffe.

HELP

For example, the Old Time Sequence dancing classes need to pay a deposit before they can bring Joe Loss to Newton Aycliffe. The Arts Council will help with this they will also help in encouraging a Town Youth Band and in providing chanters for the town's Pipe Band Junior les-

The money given to these associations may be recovered, but in some cases it may not. Mr Belton told us he would like to see more social activities of all description encouraged.

There are many schemes affiliated to the Arts Council, some of these being, the Town Band, The Pipe Band, the Operatic Society, Dramatic Soc., and the Neville Male Voice Choir.

THEATRE

Newton Aycliffe has always been short of a good hall, but help may soon be on its way in the form of an 'Arts and Humanities' Centre, a theatre is also planned, these will provide the right atmosphere for artists to perform in and to use

The Fettlers who recently came to Newton Aycliffe were a great success and more entertainment of this kind has been planned, utilising the grants provided by local authorities. The High Level Ranters are expected at the Recreation Centre sometime in

There is no charge to join most of the organisations, some even provide equipment and instruments as well as coaching members. The Ten ants handbook gives a list of services and addresses to apply to.

Very soon Newton Aycliffe

hopes to be able to hold local exhibitions of art and pottery.

APATHY

While talking to Mr Belton, he told us he feels there is a great apathy in Newton Aycliffe. It's always the same few faces seen at meetings, while lots of people are clambering for entertainment, a good deal of the town people show little or no interest, but the Arts Council hopes to change this and get more people joining in and enjoying themselves.
