Vandal problem must be solved

Once again the problem of vandalism raises its ugly, stupid head.

Ugly because it defaces our fair town and stupid because the offenders can surely derive no real pleasure.

The cost to the ratepayer grows tremendously. We complain at the ever soaring rates but do we make any individual effort to save money by stamping out vandalism?

Trees, bushes, flowers, are needlessly destroyed, toilets and lights are broken, bus shelters damaged, walls sprayed with paints, and "hoo premises spoilt.

The cost to the ratepayer last year was in excess of £3,000, discounting damage to schools. This year, though an improvement has been shown in the parks, bus shelters are still a prime target, and we know the fantastic costs of the destruction of Elmfield school.

The vandals, when caught, can offer no reason for their senseless action, and often face fines only. It raises the question whether there is a severe enough deterrent factor.

The Psychologists argue that severe punishment is not the answer — yet the comparative relaxation in punishment

over recent years has shown an increase in vandalism and indiscipline.

Whilst we do not agree with recent statements that Newton Aycliffe has a breed of super-vandals, we do recognise the need to stamp out the nonsense and instil pride in our town.

The offenders must be caught and to this end our Town Council are posting notices of rewards to persons reporting vandals.

We realise only a small minority are responsible for vandalism, but equally we, the majority must realise we are responsible for the cost and do all we can to stop the senseless damage to our property.

Pupil's Choice

An interview by three students from the Avenue Comprehensive School

The Music Society is now entering its 22nd season, having been started in 1953 by Miss E. Hamilton, who was Housing Manager at that time, and Mr J. Gittins who was principal of Aycliffe Approved School. The early concerts were held at the Approved School and some still are, when the concert necessitates the use of a piano to meet performers' requirements. The Society however, endeavours to hold as many concerts as possible on the town, usually in the Avenue Comprehensive School, but they suffer from the same problem as a lot of other societies — the fact that there is not a hall which the Arts Council can regard as their own.

POPULAR

The Music Society sponsors five professional concerts a year, and these have included performances by such national and international artists as Joseph Cooper, the Moravian Quartet (from Yugoslavia), Antony Hopkins, Owen Brannigan, and for the last two years An Evening with Gilbert and Sullivan with John Heddle Nash backed by a chorus from the Operatic Society and the Neville Male Voice Choir. The latter has proved very popular, drawing an audience of 300, though this is higher than the aver-

age numbers attending. Prices for the concerts are reasonable; 60p for adults and 30p for senior citizens and students.

The Society receives grants from the National Federation of Music Societies, Northern Arts, and Newton Aycliffe Arts Fellowship, to all of which it is affiliated. It is not a performing organisation, though a large number of its members are individual performers. In addition to the concerts, the Society arranges three members' evenings in the year (one in Bowes Museum) when the programmes are provided by artistes of semi professional status.

MEMBERSHIP

Anyone wishing to join the Society should contact Mrs Swift at 12, Aylmer Grove. Membership costs £1 but students may join for 50p. This enables them to attend any concerts they wish, which is very good because normal prices for them would be 30p per concert, so if they visit only two concerts it is still worth their while. At present the Society has 80 members. The Society season runs from September to May.

We would like to thank the Music Society for its co-operation during the interview.
