Conveniences are not convenient!

Town Centre visitors are getting quite annoyed with the toilet facilities offered there.

The closure of the old toilets at the rear of Wentons was expected, due to the provision of new "super loos," complete with "wash and brush up" and attendant, next to the Newton Press Shop.

But a full 24 hour service is not available and a few people have been caught in embarrassing situations — forced to ask shops if they may use their toilet.

At the moment the public toilets are open from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. Monday to Saturday only.

A night toilet should be available after 6 p.m., but it is not ready for use yet.

The Council thought the building too open to vandalism, and refused to take it over from the Development Corporation until structural alterations were made.

All this has taken time and we understand only in the last few days has a contractor been obtained to do the work.

It is hoped the toilets will be complete in 2 weeks time.

It only remains then for someone to erect the long

awaited signs showing people in which direction this necessary building lies.

Our pleas on readers' behalfs for directional signs to essential offices and services in the town centre seem to have fallen on deaf ears.

Bus lay-bys?

Dear Sir,

Your article on the narrowness of the roads in Newton Aycliffe, particularly those roads which are regular bus routes has for some time been the subject of many discussions and a great deal of concern by both the Town Council and the Trades Council.

There is no doubt that the problem stems from the unfortunate lack of foresight and anticipation of future traffic

loads by the original planners of the New Town. There is also no doubt that the cost of rectifying the problem even in the best of economic situations would be prohibitive.

However, I feel very strongly that some action must be taken in the interest of road safety on bus routes.

Firstly, I would suggest that lay bys be constructed at all bus stops at the expense of a few yards of grass verge.

Secondly, an introduction of parking restrictions on bus routes, i.e. Pease Way, Shafto Way and the whole of Central Avenue.

I feel sure that if these two items are acted upon, though not achieving complete satisfaction, will help to alleviate the frustrations of all transport drivers, and go a long way towards creating safer travelling in the town.
