Town Festival off to a good start

The Festival got off to a good start with the Festival Princess contest on Saturday, in conjunction with the opening of John Murphy's Fair.

Mr Murphy presented a trophy and Mrs Murphy added to the prize money. The contest was won by 12 year old Lynne Stobbs who will ride with the Festival Queen in the parade on June 28th.

The fair was opened by beauty queen Linda Robson. The Festival Queen will be chosen at the Dance today and will visit the Fair opposite the Southern Club on Saturday at 7 p.m. During the Festival fortnight there will be a full programme of events but "It's a Knock-Out" will not take place as advertised, but may be later in the year.

There will be Pub Nights at the Oak Tree and Iron Horse, a Variety Night at the Big Club, dances at the Southern RAFA, and British Legion clubs, Variety Night at the Labour and Trades Club with the Candlelight Duo, the Jacques School of Dancing and Billy Llewellyn.

One event repeated after great success last year is the Soap Box Derby. There will be 2 classes, push propelled and pedal powered and age groups from 9-12 years. This will take place between 16th and 19th June in Bluebell Wood, final on Friday 20th with cup and medals for winner and runners up. Entry forms from the Information Centre.

The Grand Parade is on Sat. June 28th and will leave Bailol Green after the judging at 1 p.m. Floats to assemble at 12.30 p.m. As well as floats there will be 6 jazz bands and the Horndale Star jazz band, the Pipe Band and the Town Band.

In the evening there will be a Carnival on Skates in the Bev. Hall by the Beveridge Skating Club.

Everyone has been most helpful including the A.D.C., the Town Council and the Aycliffe Police.



## Pupil's Choice

An interview by three students from  
the Avenue Comprehensive School

If you have any interest in drama whatsoever, and we hope you do, then we would advise you to read beyond these opening lines, and take note of what we are about to say.

It is not very encouraging to learn that in a town where people are constantly complaining about the lack of amenities where social events can take place, and the lack of entertainment from drama groups, that in our midst should exist a relatively neglected group of people called the Newton Players. It is sad that many young Newtonians adopt such a scornful attitude to any means of entertainment made available to them. An example of this is the Recreation Centre where senseless damage was done by young hooligans who previously complained that they had no where to go. It is equally disappointing to learn of the apathy shown by Newtonians in the lack of support to the Newton Players.

### TALENT

The Newton Players have been in existence now for 25 years and during that time they have had many talented artists who have left the organisation to turn professional. Nevertheless it is their belief there still is a wealth of talent remaining, and occasionally entering the organisation. Anyone over the age of 16 can join.

What the Newton Players really need is your support. They rarely break even from their shows and have to depend on grants from the Arts Council to cover costs. We asked Mrs Wood, a member for a number of years now, whether she thought the reason for the lack of support was because they could not compete with larger professional organisations.

"Definitely not, in fact we did a play shortly after the Darlington Civic had been presenting the same play, and many people came up to us afterwards and said how they thought the quality of our was equally as good, if not better," she said.

There is certainly no lack of confidence within the Newton Players. They do not wish to compete with larger organisations but simply to perform for Newtonians and enjoy themselves at the same time. They told us that the majority of the support they receive is felt at Christmas when they put on plays for children. Strange as it may seem, however, it is the children who also give the largest support throughout the year. Perhaps they are able to discover the talent within the organisation because they make the effort to go and see them.

Newton Aycliffe is not a town regarded by many as flourishing with artistic wealth but this does not mean to say it does not exist. Let us stop smothering the small pockets of diligent artists in the town, and instead, let us show some interest in them. Look out in future for the advertisements of the Newton Players, and make an effort to go to see them. Perhaps you, like the children of the town, may discover part of the talent that is fighting to survive in Newton Aycliffe.
