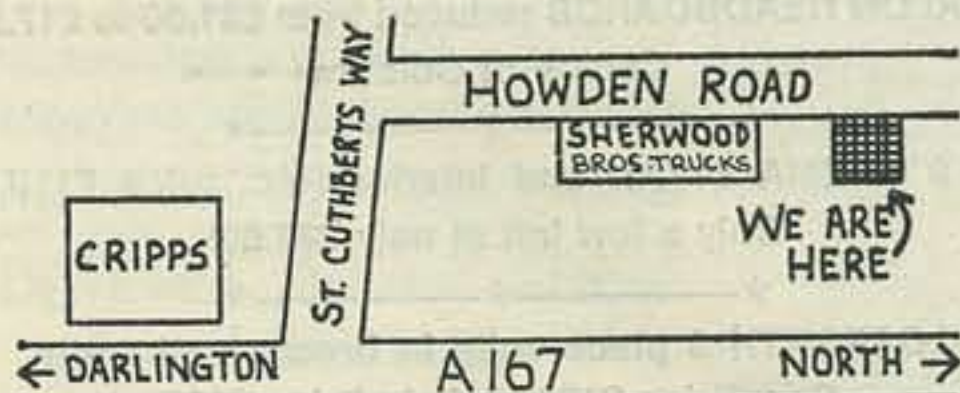

# First 'Community' school for Aycliffe

A major breakthrough in the utilisation of school property is being tried in Newton Aycliffe.

Elmfield School will be rebuilt with the needs of the community in mind.

One third of the building will be designated for use of the public and available at all times.

The headmaster will have overall responsibility for the premises, but a Community Association will administer the halls available for hire.

The objective is to provide facilities for the many adult organisations hindered by the lack of a local meeting place.

### TRAGEDY

The initiative, though he modestly lays no claim to it, came from Jim Ewing, A.D.C. Development Officer. He saw, from the tragedy of the Elmfield fire, a strong community feeling in that area. With the help of Robert Bloomfield, headmaster, he has pushed this amazing scheme through the A.D.C., Town Council, and County Council.

All have accepted the idea with the Town Council putting up £7,300 and the A.D.C. the balance of the total cost, estimated at around £25,000.

"It has proved how quickly local authorities can move," said Jim Ewing. "The idea was accepted and finalised by all concerned in five weeks" he added.

The new school cum Community Building should be ready by September next year. For some time, there has been discussion on the use of school facilities after hours,

and this pilot scheme ought to prove how easily it can be done.

In the present stringent economic situation the idea makes even greater sense.

There is some use of schools, after hours, under the name of further education but this idea of community use during and after school hours has a far reaching effect on the development of our whole social environment. Let us hope this new project is the first of many.

## "It won't be the same without her"

Very soon Sister Siobhan leaves Newton Aycliffe to take up a new appointment in Leeds.

This loveable, charming headmistress of St Marys School will be missed by all who knew her.

Wherever she went and whoever she met, her smiling personality shone through gaining respect and admiration.

Father Anderson writes a special tribute in the following paragraphs, but may we, as the towns community newspaper on behalf of its readers, thank Sister Siobhan for the service she has given the school and Newton Aycliffe.

May she be happy at her new school and as successful there as she was here.

"The imminent departure of Sister Siobhan, herald the end of an era for the Catholics of the eastern and southern areas of Newton Aycliffe. Ever since St. Marys School opened in 1961 the head has been a Religious Sister and the presence of Sisters always gives a distinctive ethos to a school. The personality of Sister Siobhan re-inforced this distinctiveness. Her enthusiasms were many and intense; her qualities as an educationalist were those of an expert, especially her vitality which enabled her to produce an endless stream of ideas and projects. Each December found her exhausted by her efforts to create the momentum for the new school year, but each time she regained her energy. Her charming irreverence for bureaucratic niceties ensured that she got away — if not with murder — at least with quite extraordinary concessions."

"Sister Siobhans' religious superiors have decided to concentrate their personnel in areas of special need and so the new head teacher is not to be a Sister; this is in recognition of the fact that the catchment area of the school is now no longer an area of special need and is now well settled."

"I have paid our tribute to Sister Siobhan on other occasions and expressed our deep gratitude to her. All that I can say now is that the place will not be the same without her." Fr. Dennis Anderson

## More damp floors mean evacuation

Ninety two houses in Horn-dale are affected by damp floors the A.D.C. revealed last Friday.

Letters are being sent out to those properties affected informing tenants of the necessity to move them out while the sealing is carried out.

A few months ago 90 houses in Hawkshead Place had the same problems and they are being remedied at the moment.

Twenty five of the occupants who were moved to other houses have opted to stay where they are, not wishing the inconvenience of removals again.

As in Hawkshead, the Horn-dale residents will be generously compensated by the A.D.C.

At a special press conference, Mr Garry Phillipson, General Manager, A.D.C. stated this problem will not re-occur.

### COMPLAINTS

During the past few months the Corporation had received complaints of dampness from a number of tenants at Penine Walk, Cumbrian Place, Cheviot Place and Cleveland Place. These houses were of the same design as those in Hawkshead Place. Councillor Tony Moore, the area's representative on Sedgfield District Council, drew the attention of the Corporation to a

number of additional cases.

Detailed investigation of the difficulties at Hawkshead Place have shown that the problem arose because, when a minor change was made in the specification for the concrete mix, a repeated reference was not made to the need to include a waterproofing agent. This was not the case at Horn-dale where the waterproofing agent was specified throughout: final conclusions as to the cause of the problem there remain to be drawn. The Contractor in both cases was the Corporation's Direct Labour Dept.

For those houses which are only slightly affected, consideration is being given to a modified treatment. This can be carried out room by room, with a minimum of inconvenience avoiding the need for residents to move out. Further tests are necessary, however, before this modified treatment can be decided upon.

### SURPRISE HOLIDAY

A happy story for old age pensioners affected by the Corporations plans to remedy dampness in houses they occupy.

The A.D.C. have arranged a weeks holiday in Scarborough with hotel and travel expenses paid, while the work is completed.

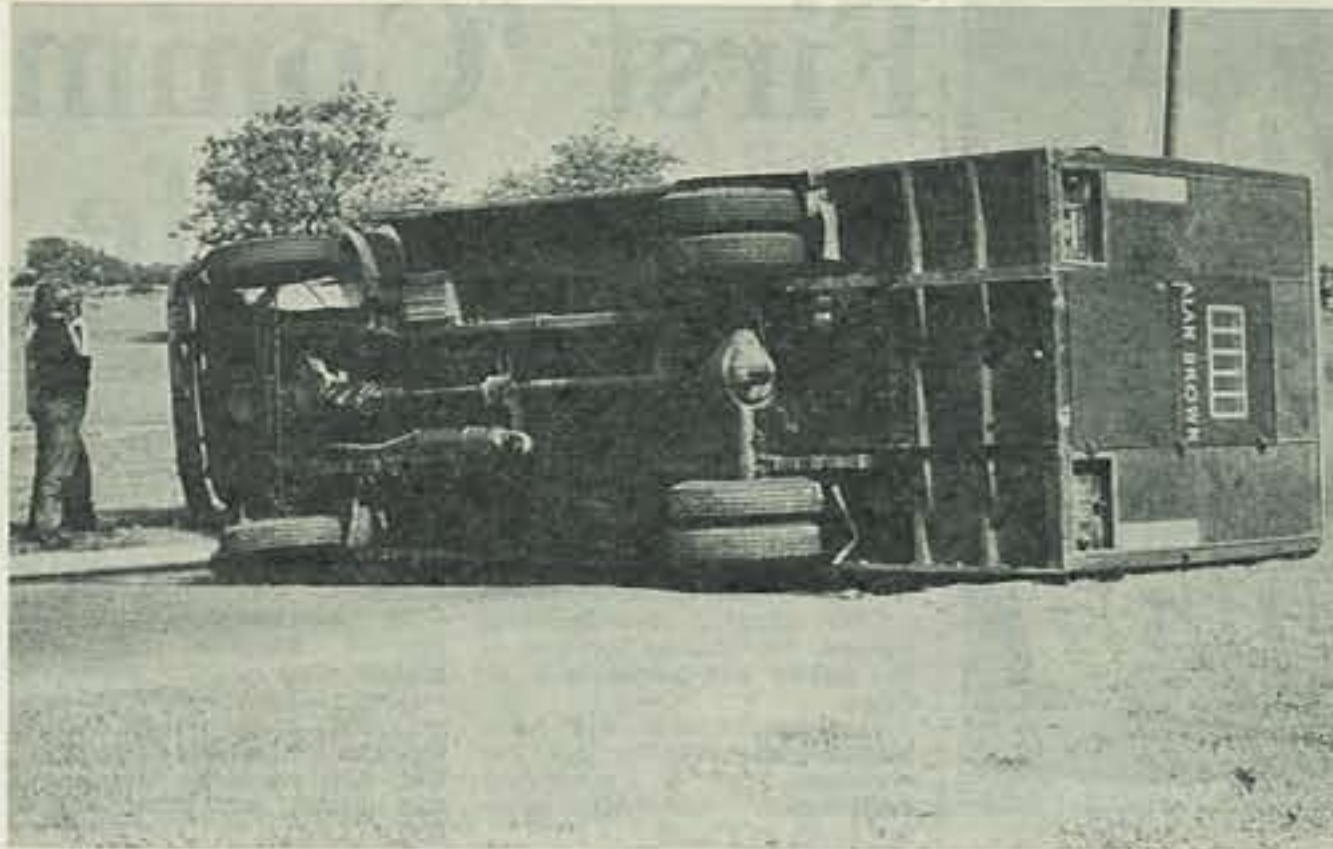

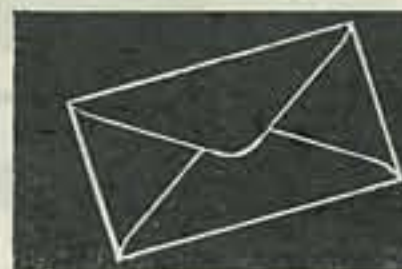

## LETTERS

## Shandy at £3.20 per gallon?

I recently went into Crawfords on a very hot day for a cool drink for my wife, my child and myself.

We asked for an orange juice, and two shandys which were priced at 10p.

On receipt of the glasses, I was appalled at the very small quantity of the gaseous liquid which I received for 30p.

Three small glasses which I estimated contained approx 1/3 of a pint of liquid each, as the glasses were only half as high as a half pint beer glass and of a diameter the same as the lower half of the standard 1/2 pint beer glass.

On this assumption I came home and checked by filling up a pint milk bottle with water to see how many times it would take to fill to the brim using a similar glass. It took exactly 4.

When a few simple sums are done, it can be shown that this liquid costs: 10p per 1/2 pint, 40p per pint, £3.20 per gallon!

When one considers that best beer is 21p per pint, and premium grade 5 star petrol is 75p per gallon, and a large bottle of 'pop' costs 20p, less 3p deposit on bottle for approx. 1 1/2 pints (approx. 12p per pint). This shandy must be potent stuff I thought, I'd better be careful driving home. I complained to the manageress who stated that she must charge the price stated by the Head Office in South Shields and that if she was personally getting the profit on the stuff, she would apologise, but as she wasn't, I was free to write to head office to complain.

I said that I would write to the Newton News and that she could send a copy to head office if she wished, because I feel the price of this is exorbitant to say the least.

I do not accept any excuses of VAT and service charges, etc. because of the above comparison when purchasing 1/2 pint of beer in a pub, i.e. VAT is included and so is service, nor do I accept that the price is high because this stuff is chilled, because the

same applies to beer. This stuff by the way is mainly carbon dioxide aerated water.

My only conclusion is that the glasses used are too small or the price is too high.
