ADC changes at the top

Aycliffe Development Corporation has appointed Mr J.

A. Cooper, B.Sc. (Est. Man), as Director of Estates.

Mr Cooper, who is 35. joined the Corporation in 1973 when he took up the post of Assistant Director of Estates (Industry). He took over as Acting Director during the absence through illness of Mr J. A. Denton, earlier this year. Mr Denton retired from the Directorship on 30th June, The Estates department is

The Estates department is the newest department in the Corporation's establishment. It was set up in 1973 when the A.D.C. acquired Aycliffe Industrial Estate. It is respon-sible for the industrial and commercial promotion of the town and for the acquisition, management and disposal of all Corporation owned build-ings and land. The department is also responsible for the maintenance and manage-ment of almost 6,000 houses in the New Town, It includes a thriving horticultural section which maintains many landscaped and planted areas in the town.

300 new jobs for **Aycliffe**

The 15,000 square foot fac-tory is almost finished, and on completion will be offering 300 jobs to both men and women on a 50/50 basis.

Electrolux are probably making this move due to the suc-ces of Flymo who are members of the group.

In fact part of the work of the new factory will be the manufacture of parts for the Flymo machines.

The new factory is situated on a 16 acre site at Preston Road, leaving sufficient space for the factory to double its size if and when necessary.


