The A.D.C. has set up a special project team with the aim of ensuring that Aycliffe and district gets maximum advantage from the Government's scheme to help the country's young unemployed.

The Government scheme is administered by the Man-power Services Commission, which last week announced that £6m will be channelled into the North of England, Chairman of Aycliffe's project team is Corporation Board member, Counc. Don Vickers, Chairman of Sedgefield District Council.

Councillor Vickers said "It is not accidental that Aycliffe has an unemployment rate consistently lower than the national average. That is proof that the New Town and its in-dustrial estate is being effec-tive. But there is a growing problem, even here."

"It is a particularly daunting prospect for young people — some of them straight out of school — to be faced with months of standing in the dole queue. We are determined to find ways of getting the numbers down and we are already working with the Manpower Services Commission team in

the North to find the answers."

"It is vital at this stage to get ideas flowing in from industry and commerce on ways of increasing the job opportunities for young people. We are also looking at our own organisation to see if there is organisation to see if there is any way we can boost the number of jobs for youngsters. And we are talking to Aycliffe's industrialists and shopkeepers about how they might be able to help. Open letter from Councillor Tony Moore

The following is an open letter from Counc. Tony Moore to Secretary of Sedgefield Dis-trict Council Labour Group, Counc. S. R. Haswell.

October 1975

After a great deal of thought I feel I must hand in my resignation from the Sedgefield District Council Labour Group and Party. I cannot be a part of an organisation which does not have the interest of the people who elected them at

The Labour controlled Shildon Town Council refuses to accept the responsibilities of providing small things like bus shelters, litter bins and play areas, also the Horndale Play Scheme.

The Labour controlled Aycliffe Town Council has banned children from the Shildon area from attending their Play Groups and will not provide any play equipment in the Williamfield area at Newton

Aycliffe.

When I look deeply into my own Labour controlled Sedge-field District Council, I feel I can no longer be a part of the Shildon 'A' Scheme cover-up. I do not feel that you have been honest enough with the public on this issue. Why, for instance, did Councillor Nunn not inform the Council about the scheme when he was warned a year ago by the Finance Chairman, Councillor R. Ellis, that the Council was getting financial difficulties; or why did you, as Chairman of the Council, not know what was happening in a major Committee? The Direct Labour Dept. should be done away with completely, which would save the public more expense. Another prime example of Direct Labour mismanagement is the houses in my area, built by Aycliffe Development Corporation Direct Labour Deot. These houses have cracked floors and rising damp, If a private builder had done these he would have been blacklisted and forced to go into liquidation.

I finally made my decision to resign at the last Group Meeting, when a Resolution was passed to use the 'Inform'
