Journey along the Zaire river

Bob Powell, one of the skippers in the Blashford-Snell expedition through Zaire gave an illustrated talk to the Round Table recently.

He related his many adventurous experiences holding his audience spellbound throughout.

His photographic slides of of the 2,762 mile river journey were spectacular.

The massive inflatable boats negotiated rapids whipping atop waves of up to 40 feet high.

The adventurers, who took the trip to commemorate Stanleys' famous exploration of the Congo to find the source of the Nile 100 years ago, were made up of Army personnel, University doctors and scientists,

One of the benefits of the expedition was the study by scientists of river insect life which is probably the cause of river blindness affecting 50% of inhabitants in most villages along the route.

Numerous questions were asked by members and guests and Peter Gallagher, gave a vote of thanks from the chair, taking the opportunity to present a cheque to the Explorers Association who raised the expedition and who are still in debt.

It is an annoying fact that most of the persons in the A.D.C. who are against the erection of signs do not live here, and the sooner they heed the pleas of residents and traders the better.
