## 'King & I' - Magnificent!

All the children were helped and encouraged by a number of dedicated teachers who practiced and rehearsed alongside their pupils building up a tremendous team relationship, which must be also of great value in classroom studies.

Beverley Edwards as Anna was truly magnificent bearing a principle role as well as a seasoned actress. Every word was heard, every movement displayed an incredible degree of talent.

Schoolmaster Mr Powell, as the King, was superb and it was apparent his presence on stage was encouragement to his pupils.

Lyn Chambers (Tuptim) sang like an angel and I bet there was not a dry eye in the audience whenever she sang.

Anne Harvey as Lady Thiang put in a creditable performance, singing and acting as well as some professionals seen today.

There is talk that next years show could be either "My Fair Lady" or "West Side Story."

Whatever is chosen, 'The Avenue' are assured of full support.

These organisations are now all well established and "standing on their own feet," so now, we at CCS feel it is time we came out of the backroom, where we have worked quietly and without publicity, time to let you know who we are, what our plans are for the future and how we would like you to assist.

Too many people grumble about lack of amenities, things which need doing, and some indeed which need undoing. This is of course human nature, but you should really make your point to the organisation which exists to deal with these factors. One such factor came to light recently, i.e. the lack of a chemist in the out-lying areas of the town.

We cannot give you a chemist, but we can do our best to get prescriptions filled for house bound or handicapped people.

This matter is now being dealt with, and details will be announced in your own special newspaper.

We would also like to see some representatives from affiliated organisations at our Committee meetings, to voice their complaints or simply air their views. If things are going wrong we want to know about it. When everything is going well we also want to know about it, that is our reward for "stirring things up."

Above all, what we, and you do not want in our town is apathy, the disease of modern times. Let's have enthusiasm, criticism, tenacity, and in the best sense of the word, Communism, a feeling of caring for our community and what happens in it.

Each month we hope to bring ourselves, and our activities, to your attention by way of this Newsletter.

Comments, offers of assistance, criticism, all are welcome, and can be made to our Sec., Mr Belton, 9 Isherwood Close.

Meanwhile, it has been suggested that all affiliated organisations have a Seminar type of meeting in order to learn of any difficulties being experienced, and to formulate plans for overcoming same, so please write or phone our Sec. suggesting time and venue.

It is possible that in the near future we will have centrally situated premises, combining in one office the CAB, the CCs and Marriage Guidance Council but more of this later.

Meanwhile 'get cracking,' stir the old grey matter, then act.

## DON'T Drink and Drive

John Tully, County Road Safety Officer announced that he hoped everyone would enjoy the festive season but he warned drivers of the dangers of drinking and driving which can so often lead to death, agonising injuries or personal tragedy.

Mr Tully went on to say that last year 2,092 breathalyser tests were administered by the Police in Durham County alone and as a result over 1,243 people had lost their licences.

The consequence of losing a licence are often underestimated until it actually happens.

The loss of licence can mean a lost job for those who drive for a living or for those who need a car to get to work. This is a more serious state of affairs in a time of high unemployment. Disqualification from driving for perhaps a year or more can cause great social and domestic inconvenience and even when the licence is restored can lead to the imposition of stringent insurance conditions.

John Tully offers the following advice for the party season:

- 1 When going out to a party elect a driver who will not drink for the evening.
- 2 Use public transport.
- 3 Firms organising Christmas and New Year parties should consider arranging transport for their personnel.
- 4 Don't offer a friend "One for the road," it can be the most unfriendly act of all.

It also affords me the opportunity of informing everyone of the Council's activities during the past year and their plans for 1976. During the past year a considerable amount of work has been completed towards providing the Outdoor Stadia at School Aycliffe. The first phase of this project should be operational by Sept. 1976, and even against the financial background of restraint it is hoped that the Council will be able to provide extra facilities on this site.

During 1975 liaison meetings have been held with Sedgfield D.C., Shildon T.C. and the A.D.C. Whilst some of the problems raised at these meetings are difficult, attempts are being made to solve them to the benefit of residents. The Council have already agreed to provide an extra £1.50 worth of bus tokens for Senior Citizens next year and it is hoped that this will go some way to combating the increased cost of travel. The Council and the A.D.C. are contributing all the cost of providing community facilities at Elmfield School. The new school when it is built, will at long last be able to provide community facilities in an area of the Town which has heretofore been without this kind of provision.

Local Council elections are to be held during May 1976, and as these are the first elections since the reorganisation of Local Government they should provide some indication as to the way in which the new Local Government system is being received by the electorate.

May I finally, on behalf of the Mayoress and myself, wish you all a Merry Christmas and a prosperous New Year.
