## £100 for town centre Rest Room fund

### DESK SET AT THE OVER 60's CLUB

### NEWTON AYCLIFFE MUSIC SOCIETY

Once again the popular choral group 'The Scholars' return to Newton Aycliffe. The concert to be presented by the Society is on Thursday 19th Feb. in Woodham School, at 7.30 p.m. The programme will consist of the usual popular mixture, Madrigals, Victorian part-songs, folk songs, spirituals, and close harmony arrangements. The fund to provide a rest room for the elderly and handicapped in the town centre has received a "shot in the arm" with a £100 donation from the Round Table and promise of further help in the future.

The project which will cost around £5,000 is taking a long time as the public, as yet, have not warmed to the idea.

Round Table felt they should give a lead and hope other charitable minded organisations will consider supporting this worthwhile project.

The ADC have provided a site and been very helpful in launching the fund.

It is possible if the fund committee raise £2,000 locally that National trusts will provide the balance.

But this cannot be banked on and the committee realise they have a hard job raising the amount.

The building which would be about the size of a large lounge will have facilities for tea making and comfortable chairs to allow the handicapped and elderly rest while shopping.

It is a fact that handicapped persons have to wait outside shops in wheelchairs in all weather and the elderly would welcome a rest, and the company, this building would provide.

Offers of help will be appreciated by Secretary Mrs D. V. Hill, 2 Biscop Crescent.

# Go ahead for Arts centre

Aycliffe's Arts Centre, planned to go on the town centre site between the Recreation Centre and Wenton's carpet shop, has attracted new support.

The Arts Council of Great Britain and the British Film Institute have told the Development Corporation they want to see the project go ahead — and have indicated that applications for grant aid are likely to be approved.

This news revives hope of an early start to the first phase of the arts centre. Cost for this development is £220,000. The Corporation has allocated £120,000 from the Major Amenity Fund for the project. Durham County Council has long pledged its support for the centre but has dropped the scheme from the current programme because of across the board spending cuts.

Jim Ewing, Corporation Social Development Officer said "The news about support from the two national bodies is

great. It means that even less will have to come from the rates—and could mean an earlier start than we anticipated in the present economic climate."

"I am also delighted with the indications of strong support for the Aycliffe arts centre from these expert groups. They are the specialists in the field and their support is a powerful endorsement of our view that the town and the district need this facility."

The first phase of the arts centre will be at first floor level. It will contain: an auditorium for the performing arts, including drama, music and ballet; a sound proofed room for audio-visual productions; a general social area with coffee bar; and facilities for displaying painting, sculpture etc.

## Jobs and homes campaign successful

Aycliffe industrialists, The Dept. of Employment and the A.D.C. combined forces last week in a campaign to recruit skilled workers to the town. The theme was "Aycliffe for jobs and homes" and it was concentrated on Tyneside and Wearside.

During the 5 days of the campaign almost 600 men and women applied at Dept. of Employment job centres in Newcastle, Gateshead, Sunderland and South Shields. Over 100 skilled jobs with Aycliffe firms were on offer and the Department was hopeful that most of these could be filled.

Ken McKay, A.D.C. Press Officer, said "This is the first time that a campaign like this has been tried. The initiative came from the Dept. of Employment and the industrialists who were concerned about a shortage of workers in certain skills in the area. The A.D.C. was keen to support the proposal, especially as our Master Plan is specific about Aycliffe's purpose — to develop the town in step with industrial growth. There was, of course, nothing new about offering homes to people who get jobs here. That has always been a cornerstone of our Housing Policy."

Employment on Aycliffe Industrial Estate has remained almost constant over the past 12 months, despite the country's economic crisis and the

rapidly rising level of unemployment nationally. The unemployment rate for Aycliffe is 2.9%, against a national figure of over 6%.

### POOR TOILET FACILITIES

The town centre toilet facilities, after hours, must be one of the poorest services in the country.

So much so that the Chinese Restaurant and other town centre premises such as pubs, clubs and the Recreation Centre are used as Public Conveniences.

Mr Fong told us that many non-customers use his Restaurant toilets at night either because they cannot find public ones or that the toilets are in such a disgusting state for use.

During the day when attendants are on duty there is nothing to complain about — save the one difficulty for newcomers and visitors — they cannot find the toilet!

Poked away, as the toilets are, makes things very inconvenient. There are no signs in the town centre to direct persons to this necessary public building.

Despite frequent requests on behalf of our readers this situation remains unchanged.

Admittedly two films every 4 weeks isn't the best solution but it's a start and obviously in a capital intensive area where one showing can cost as much as £40 to screen your support is needed.

Although the Moving Picture Show is, to some extent, subsidised, it cannot run at a loss indefinitely, likewise the towns own Cinema Society, must aim to break even at each show. Teessides first show 'Juggernaut' had an audience of 29, they need 80 to break even.

Both Teesside and the Cinema Society have good family programmes from now until Summer; are reasonable, cost wise, and are professionally screened.

Teesside's next film is My Fair Lady which will be screened in the Recreation Centre on Friday 27th Feb. at 7.30 p.m. The film Society is showing a short feature and a Monty Python film on Wednesday 3rd March at 7 p.m. in the Recreation Centre.

The moral of this piece is don't sit and grumble about lack of cinema provision, support the various people who are working hard trying to fill the gap, then perhaps we may see even further expansion in this field. By the way the population of Newton Aycliffe is 27,000, if only 0.5% were cinema goers, an audience of 135 could be expected.

Those of you who have read our previous newsletters will be familiar with what we are trying to do, namely bring to your attention those organisations which already exist in the town, and also help to form others which may be needed in outlying areas.

One of our more recent additions is the **Parent Alone Group**, the title of which is self-explanatory, but, to further enlighten you, we give some facts and figures, so that those in need of such an organisation may be persuaded to join.

The P.A.G. was formed one year ago on a self-help basis; 10p to join, thereafter any form of contribution the member is capable of giving, such as friendly chat, a cup of tea in friendly surroundings, understanding, and more obvious things like clothing for the swap shop, toys, or indeed anything at all which is useful.

The meetings take place in St. Clare's Church Lounge each Wednesday 1.30 to 3.15 p.m. and both parent and children are welcome. Here one can also swap ideas for the mutual benefit of all and plans are formulated for future activities.

At recent Spring and Autumn Fayres enough money was raised to send families to the seaside and to give Xmas

parties, just an indication of what can be done when every effort is combined towards a mutual goal, namely aid for all. So if you are single handed, trying to bring up a family, don't feel it is an impossible task, help is at hand in the P.A.G.

We all know how very difficult it is, in these trying times to keep children on the right path, even when there are two parents to advise and supervise; how much more so when there is only one.

We all know the feeling of being over-burdened thinking we are full of care only to realise when talking to others how much worse off we could be. It is this feeling of "a worry shared is a worry halved" that is present in P.A.G., where everyone helps everyone else, being fully aware of the problem.

So, if this applies to you if you are a parent alone, why not go along to the meetings, halve your worry, do the same for someone else, Dads too of course, not just Mums, for there are a great many Dads alone, who, in a family crisis need a woman's help, just as there are many Mums who would like a man's point of view.

We think that P.A.G. is a wonderful idea, a sort of Parent Therapy where a problem difficult when faced alone becomes insignificant and even humorous when aired with understanding companions.

Yes, we did say companions, friends in adversity, someone to turn to, so why don't you turn to P.A.G. — will no longer be alone.
