Anglers to fight Council

Aycliffe Angling Club are raising a petition objecting to Durham County Council's plan to turn Aycliffe Quarry into a refuse tip.

Our reasons are that the Angling Club have been trying since its formation, to obtain the fishing rights to the quarry as it is the only water suitable for our junior member in the area.

The Angling Club would, if they were offered the Quarry to fish, undertake to make safe the dangerous parts and keep the area in good order.

We believe a refuse tip would lead to a reduction in the standard of life in Aycliffe Village through:

- (1) The smell associated with a refuse tip; (2) The increase in the volume of traffic caused through tipping; (3) A drastic increase in the volume of litter visible in that area of the Village; (4) The attraction of vermin to the area.

We believe that other organisations and individuals are interested in seeing the Aycliffe Quarry turned into a safe leisure centre, and keeping Aycliffe Village well placed in the Tidy Village Competition.

Visual Arts Exhibition

Aycliffe Arts Council and the Art Club are to stage another Visual Arts Exhibition in the Recreation Centre from Monday 14th until Saturday 19th June.
