What is it all in aid of?

During May bands of Christians trudged round the 7000 houses in Newton Aycliffe in the annual appeal for "Christian Aid Week."

Most people gave something in the envelope, and a lot give generously, but there is a minority, who through ignorance have a couldn't care less attitude.

Most annoying are the people who slam the door in your face, or who come out with the remark "I need a bit of Christian Aid myself" and then proceeds to get ready to go to the club for a few pints.

One of the best reasons why the Christian Aid appeal should be supported is in an article printed in St. Clares Newsletter which is headed "What is it all in aid of?"

"Nearly 500 million people in the poor parts of the world can't afford the very basic needs of minimum health. This country consumes the equivalent of 3050 calories per head per day, while India consumes 1600 and Africa 2150. A third of the world—the affluent West—gets over half the world's total food supplies. Between 1969 and 1971, 370 million tons of grain were used annually in the rich countries for livestock alone — that is more than the total for the whole of India and China combined.

In West Bengal a woman burnt her only child and be-

gan to eat it. In villages in other states people are reduced to eating leaves. A family of seven in Andhra Pradesh found their grain store was empty, so they ate a tin of insecticide.

Now this sort of horror story can mislead us. We can feel terrible about it, but feel that there is no solution, that there just isn't enough in the world, and that is all there is. This is the position which Christian Aid rejects.

Not that digging in our pockets is enough, but it helps."

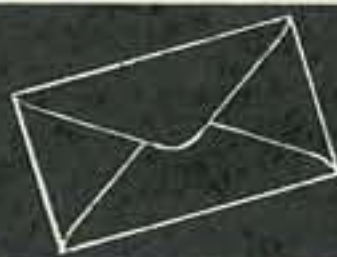

We do not have to pay at the door to get in the local

pubs, cafes or restaurants, so why should the Recreation Centre make an extra profit out of our mid-day lunch?
