# Tenants may become owners

Corporation tenants in Aycliffe may soon have an opportunity to buy their homes at discount prices.

The Department of the Environment announced last week that it would be prepared to consider requests from individual New Town corporations to start selling houses, subject to four main conditions.

The first is that the waiting period for the main categories of applicants is less than three months.

The second is that there should be consultation between the corporation and its district council. If the two organisations disagree, the minister will adjudicate.

Thirdly, although there will be no qualifying period of tenancy for applying to buy, only people who have been tenants for at least four years will qualify for a discount. The discount will be 20 per cent off current market value, subject to no dwelling being sold for less than cost. And if the purchaser sells the house within five years, he will have to repay the appropriate portion of the discount to the development corporation.

Finally, the Department of the Environment will monitor the position quarterly to ensure that the waiting period for rented dwellings does not lengthen unduly.

## Two centre shops close

Two town centre shops have closed this month due to lack of business.

Melody Centre and Choice Improvements have surrendered their leases and by this have lost a sizeable amount of their investment in Newton Aycliffe.

Both shops were trading from Dalton Way, and though it could be said they were a little out of the way, the area always seems to be busy, with other shops doing quite well.

The Corporation have been accused of bad planning in allowing two new wallpaper and paint shops to open within a year.

Obviously the extra competition did not help "Choice Improvements" but the A.D.C. say they did their calculations and found the population figure justified a third shop selling home decorating materials.

The two closures will have a bad effect on other traders thinking of opening here. They will be very wary indeed when considering the town's potential.

There is little opportunity for speculation on low capital investment in a new town as the rent and rates are very high compared with older

towns. A new shop today needs to be sure of making a profit (not takings) of at least £50 a week to cover just rent and rates. Then he has to think about lighting, heating, insurance and many other items before a living wage for staff and himself.

It may come to the stage where landlords will have to give more help to shop tenants in order to attract the services a new town should offer its residents. The three month rent free period offered at the moment is a drop in the ocean compared with the thousands of pounds the shopkeeper spends on fitting out a bare brick unit.

Industrialists can walk into an advance factory and start business immediately and, in some cases, get a two year rent free period together with other inducements. The shopkeeper gets no extra help from the landlords—in fact over the years there have been tussles over leases and what shops can and can not do from the premises.

The A.D.C. may see these as legal arguments, but to the shopkeeper they are matters concerning the survival of his business.

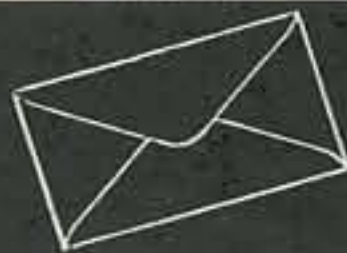
