

Most complaints come in the summer months when we receive more visitors and when residents shop earlier. It might be adviseable for the Town Council to consider extending the hours during the holiday period at least!

We realise it will cost more money and that the Council are looking to cut costs in these hard times, but tollet facilities should be in a priority category and other less important services cut first.
