New school rises from the fire

Readers may remember some two years ago when Elmfield School was destroyed by fire.

From that tragedy came a bright idea by Jim Ewing, Social Development Officer of the A.D.C., who convinced the authorities that the school should be rebuilt with provision for community use during the day while school was in progress, in addition to evening social activities. This meant that the school could become a social centre and a focal point of community life in an area singularly lacking in this type of amenity.

This exciting new project open all kinds of doors and if proved successful can surely mean that any new school built in the town in the future follows the same pattern. And, maybe, there's a hope that existing schools can be converted!

The Education Authorities are slow to see the common sense in allowing all school premises for community use. It is a crying shame to see open land fenced off and large halls and classrooms of most schools used only 7 hours a day, 5 days a week, and 38 weeks a year.

For too long our town has faced the shortage of local meeting places to the detriment of community spirit. Let us hope that residents in Williamfield and Elmfield take full advantage of this new amenity and show how right it is to use school buildings and land all the time.

We realise it will cost more money and that the Council are looking to cut costs in these hard times, but toilet facilities should be in a priority category and other less important services cut first.

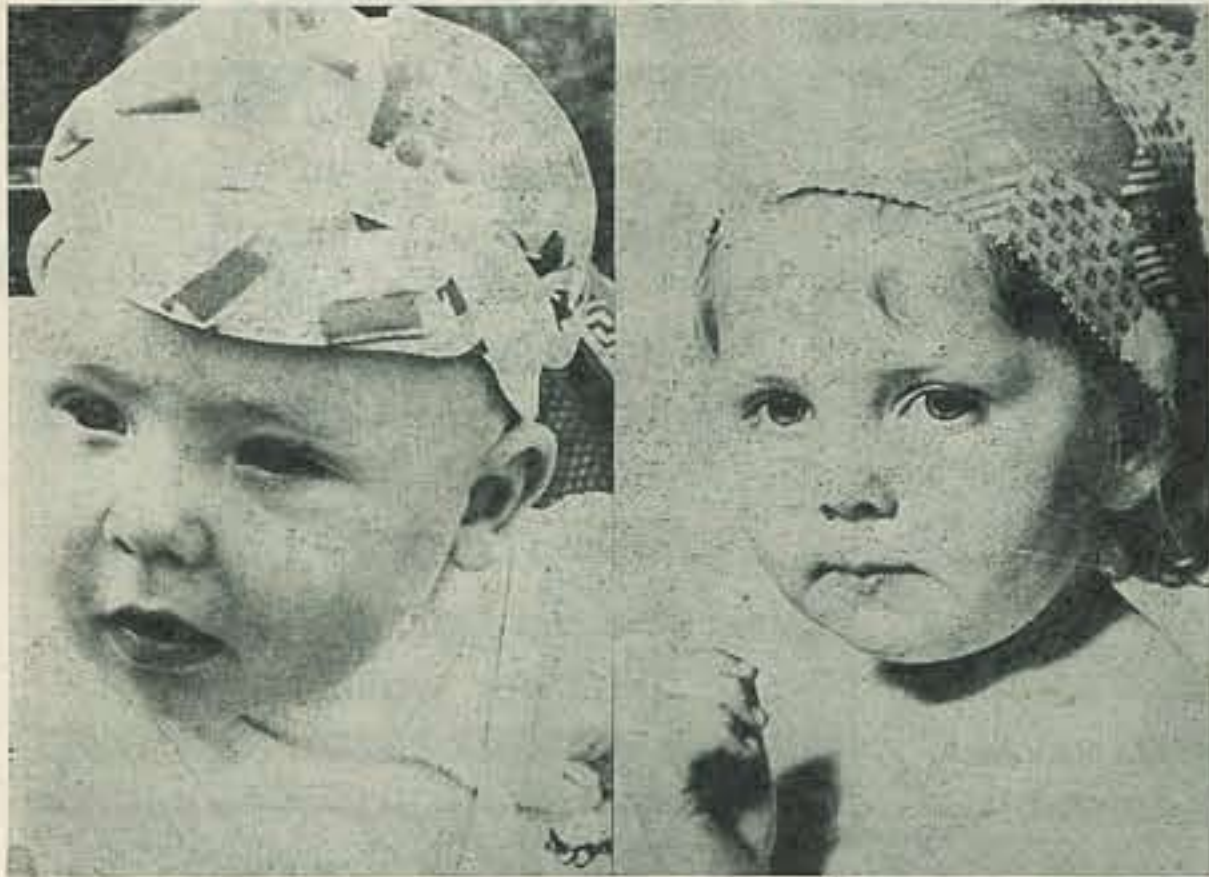
