New Towns bid for 7,000 jobs

The three North East New Towns—Aycliffe, Peterlee and Washington — have joined forces to attempt to attract a major public sector employer to the North East.

The Telecommunications Section of the Post Office is considering moving up to 7,000 jobs out of London. The jobs to be dispersed include technical, clerical and administrative posts.

Mr. Dennis Stevenson, chairman of Aycliffe and Peterlee Development Corporation said:—

"It is almost two years

since we started our attempt to get Post Office Telecommunications to take the North East seriously. Hard work, and the demonstrable advantages of this area, now seem to have convinced both the unions and management of the Post Office that we have a valid case."

"I understand that our proposal for a multicentre dispersal to the North East is now on the Post Office short list which will be considered soon. The other locations on the list are both in the South East."

"I am sure the Post Office, as a public corporation, will consider very carefully its important responsibilities to the community at large before reaching a re-location decision."

"We have satisfied many of the individuals involved that the North East New Towns can provide the right facilities and that the region can provide the right environment for the workforce. Now it is up to the Post Office to make the right decision."

During the past two years, there have been extensive study tours of Aycliffe, Peterlee and Washington by the three main unions involved. There has also been a visit by a joint team of management and unions representing the Post Office Telecommunications working party.

There has been a rise in the number of men and women employed by firms on Aycliffe Ind. Estate during the Summer.

The increase is small, only 68, taking the total employed here to 8,860 at the end of July — but it is significant.

The national trend has been for a further substantial rise in unemployment during this period.

All ready for Bazaar '76

Everything is now set for the second annual community Bazaar which will be held in the town centre on Saturday 11th September from 10 a.m. until 5 p.m.

The Bazaar will be opened by the Mayor and Mayoress, Counc. and Mrs. Elmer.

The aim of the Bazaar is to let the people of Newton Aycliffe know what is going on in our town and almost 60 organisations are to take part. There will be entertainment from 1.30 to 4.30 p.m. and the following local organisations have agreed to take part: The Town Band, Jacques School of Dancing, Pipe Band, Full Gospel Church, Junior Scottish Dance Group, St. John's Cadet Division and the Newtown Area Dog Training Club.

Organisations have all been notified that the sale of goods of any kind will not be allowed and this includes raffle tickets and tickets for any events that the organisations are to run in the future. The rights of the shops in the area must be observed and this was agreed when the A.D.C. agreed to let the town centre be used for the Bazaar.

This should be a day that the town will remember.

DRAMA FESTIVAL

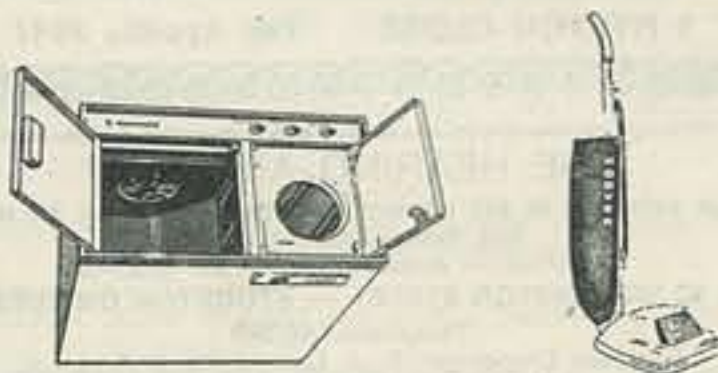

Newton Aycliffe Boys Club is to get a £500 grant from Aycliffe Dev. Corp. to buy basic equipment for the new club at the Parsons Centre.

The Boys Club has had to leave its original building in the town centre because the site is required for development as a magistrates court. The new club, located in the Agnew housing precinct, is to be known as the Woodhead Hall. It has been built at a cost of £47,000 with cash provided by the Corporation, which was committed to replace the old premises.

The new club is scheduled to open by mid September and will provide facilities for girls and boys, despite its title. It will have facilities for indoor games and sports, plus a coffee bar and general social area.
