## Report on Liason meeting

The press were present for the first time, this Wednesday, at a liason meeting be-tween the A.D.C. and Town

Council. Before starting on the long agenda, the meeting discussed modernisation houses first built in the town. Counc. Conlon drew attention to sub standard sinks and tollets. The A.D.C. explained

there was no money available from Government sources for such improvements, as all available cash was being diverted to areas where no tollets existed inside.

Town Clerk Mr Farguhar raised the problem of the new housing area verging onto the town cemetery and the resulting vandalism and noise from children playing while funerals were taking place. A request for a boundary wall was made, but after hearing the cost would be £17,000 the Council members agreed to the suggestion that some type of screen near the area most affected would be ac ceptable for the time being.




