# Was meeting worth it?

The Town meeting called last week passed a resolution condemning Mr Shore's future plan for a halt to new town expansion.

A more moderate amendment asking for clarification was lost, yet events since have proved this should have been the action taken.

Mr Shore has clarified his statement, and it seems, reading between the lines, that Newton Aycliffe will not be affected too much.

In a speech at Blackpool Mr Shore said:

"The present new towns can broadly be divided into three generations — those formed immediately after the war, those formed in the late 50's and early 60's, and those formed in the late 60's and early 70's. As it happens all the first generation and most of the second generation new towns are now within sight of achieving the objectives for which they were established. Under the New Towns (amendment) Bill now going through Parliament the rented housing in some of these towns will in fact be transferred to the local authorities within the next two to three years. There is little scope here for making drastic changes, although the speed at which any remaining programmes can be completed will obviously have to be looked at in the light of demographic and other changes."

"Of course I recognise that any review is bound to cause some uncertainty so I want to say this. There is not going to be any abrupt reversal of plans affecting all new towns."

## PUBLIC MEETING

County Councillor A. Cessford is to chair a public meeting aimed at establishing a Steering Committee to develop a Community Association based on the new Elmfield Community Use School.

Great Aycliffe Town Council and the Development Corporation, as contributors to the scheme, will also be represented at the meeting. It will be held in the new school on Tuesday 19th October and will start at 7 p.m.

Already there are moves afoot to form a Newton Aycliffe Golf Club and a meeting is to be held at St. Clares Hall on Thursday 21st Oct., 7.30 p.m. to elect officers and form a membership.

## Report on Liason meeting

The press were present for the first time, this Wednesday, at a liason meeting between the A.D.C. and Town Council.

Before starting on the long agenda, the meeting discussed modernisation of houses first built in the town. Council. Conlon drew attention to sub standard sinks and toilets. The A.D.C. explained there was no money available from Government sources for such improvements, as all available cash was being diverted to areas where no toilets existed inside.

Town Clerk Mr Farquhar raised the problem of the new housing area verging onto the town cemetery and the resulting vandalism and noise from children playing while funerals were taking place. A request for a boundary wall was made, but after hearing the cost would be £17,000 the Council members agreed to the suggestion that some type of screen near the area most affected would be acceptable for the time being.

A heated discussion followed concerning faults occurring in houses, and not just as a result of the recent bad weather. Council. Conlon stated he had been complaining for the last four years and now people were being moved from faulty houses only to find the brand new houses have similar faults. "Something must be done" said a frustrated Council. Conlon, "I am approaching my colleagues to see the Minister" he added. Most unfortunate quote of the meeting came from A.D.C. Estates Director who said of the problems of flat roofed houses, "We have got to live with it." An outraged Council. McMenamin related his own experience of peeling wallpaper and said he refused to live with such conditions.

A further report from this meeting will be in our next issue — October 22nd.

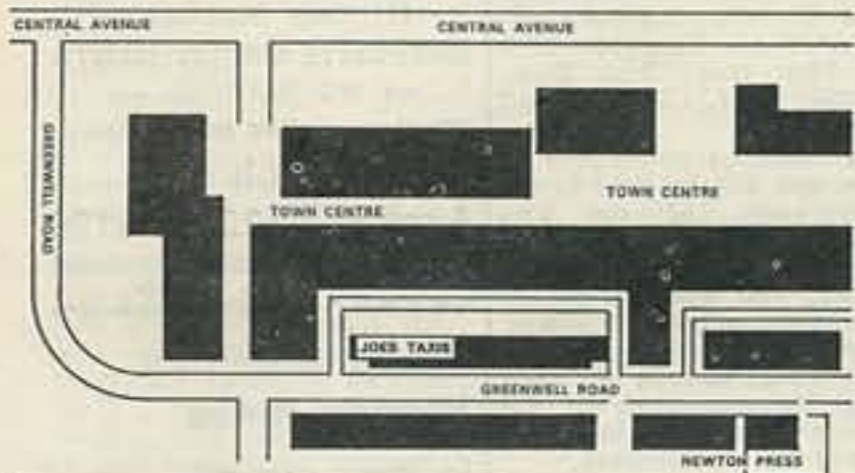
