Rents up from April

As a result of rising costs and very high interest rates and in order to balance the Housing Revenue Account, all Corporation houses in Aycliffe will have rent increases averaging 80p a week from the first rent week in April.

The rent of a standard garage will increase by 6p per week. Without these increases the Corporation would not qualify for substantial subsidies and grants.

More tenants are now likely to qualify for rent rebate than previously. Those already receiving rebates may be eligible for an increase.

The increases range from 35p (for a bedsitter) to £1.22 (for a modern four bedroom detached house with garage). The rents will be increased by 16% and it is the Corporation's intention that these rents will remain at the new level for a full year.

Every tenant will receive a letter detailing individual increases, together with an application form for a rent rebate.

Aycliffe's Director of Estates, Mr J. A. Cooper, said: "It is vital that every tenant who currently receives a rent rebate should complete the new form. And anyone who

thinks he may have a chance of qualifying should fill in the form too. We want to be sure that all our tenants receive any rebates to which they are entitled."

As in the past, all senior citizens and disabled persons will be visited by a representative of the Corporation's Housing Centre, who will assist in the completion of forms. Any other tenants who wish advice or assistance should contact the Housing Centre where trained staff will deal confidentially with their enquiries.

VOLUNTEERS TO RUN CINEMA FOR THE KIDS

The resilience of Aycliffe adults surfaces again. No sooner does the Cinema Society close down than a group of a dozen volunteer adults from the Horndale area band together for a trial run of 3 or 4 Saturday afternoon children's matinees.

The Greenfield Community Association have given use of the Meeting Hall as the venue and have also given a guarantee against loss, up to a limit, so that these adults have a good base from which to work.

It starts on Saturday March 5th at 2 p.m. The Youth Club that runs in the Hall will sell sweets, crisps etc. in the interval and entrance will cost 20p. Each week there will be a feature film suitable for junior school children and cartoons. It will be a mixture of black and white and colour.

Remember the A.B.C. Minors? Well, Aycliffe has its answer now — will your children support it?

Go-ahead given for Scout H.Q.

The plan to build a Headquarters for the town Scout and Cub groups now has the blessing of the authorities.

The news reached the Steering Committee during February, and they now face the enormous task of raising their 25% of the cost of the new building in the next 12 months. Government and County grants make up the bulk of the total cost estimated at £46,000.

Newton Aycliffe Scout Supporters Association first came into being last Summer with its main object to provide a

Scout HQ and promote the ideals of the Cub and Scout movement. Over 100 adults have joined the Association and they are all surprised at the speedy acceptance by the authorities to their application for grant aid.

"No one expected to get the money right away and it means our own fund raising schedule will have to be revised and intensified," said a spokesman for N.A.S.S.A.

Already urgent meetings have been called and some plans are underway in a supreme effort to get the necessary money.

Meanwhile, negotiations are taking place with contractors and two exciting plans are being scrutinised to decide on the most suitable type of building.

The H.Q. is to be situated

off Burnhill near Bluebell Wood and will comprise of a very large multi-purpose hall with smaller room, kitchen, toilets and storage at the end of the building.

Scout and Cup groups within the town will benefit tremendously from the superb facilities the H.Q. will offer, and it is hoped that more youngsters can be introduced to the movement.

The next meeting of N.A.S.S.A. is on Monday 14th March at St. Clares Church Hall, Newton Aycliffe, at 8 p.m. All members are urged to attend and new members warmly invited.
