ADC on the way out!

IT IS NOW more than likely that the dissolution of the Aycliffe Development Corporation will take place in the early 1980's.

Peter Shore, Secretary of State for the Environment, made his intentions clear recently. He concluded that Aycliffe had made a useful contribution to the area, but growth had been slower than expected.

Discussions will take place with the ADC and local authorities in the next few years about the arrangements for the changeover to Sedgfield District Council.

COMPLETE CONTROL

It was evident when the decision was made to transfer housing assets in April 1978 that this was the thin end of the wedge and that it would not be long before Sedgfield got complete control.

This move for a more democratic authority managing our affairs has been called for often over the last decade, though recently, since people have had a taste of the Sedgfield administration, they have been somewhat quieter.

The Sedgfield takeover must be viewed with apprehension unless in the next few years they prove to be less remote and recognise the special attention a new town requires.

MANY QUESTIONS

It would be nice if they would communicate with Newton Aycliffe and respond to our requests for justification of their policy on refusing to sell houses to sitting tenants. There are many other questions too on the transfer of housing which needs public airing if only someone would open their mouth. (See Vicar of St. Clare's letter in this issue).

The Minister has recognised the need for the ADC to carry on the task of developing industrial and commercial growth, and it is also probable that they will remain in charge of Social Development.

The only comment from the ADC was that they accepted that eventually they would have to stand down and that it was right and proper, when their work was adjudged to be complete, that the local authority take over.

But, there is no doubt, though the ADC will not admit as much, they did not expect to wind up so soon before the town reached its 45,000 population target.

All we can hope for in all this is that the ADC "winding up" does not result in the town's "winding down."

NORMAN WILLIAM OWEN
We regret to record the death of Norman William Owen who passed away peacefully after a short illness, aged 62.

As an ex professional cricketer Norman distinguished himself as a bowler likened often as another "Larwood." He played for Surrey and was coached by the great Jack Hobbs. On moving North he was engaged as a professional for Wearmouth, Sunderland, Northumberland and latterly for Bishop Auckland CC as player coach.

Not many in the town will realise that we had a renowned professional cricketer in our midst — such was the modesty of the likeable gentleman who worked for the ADC Direct Labour Dept.

The headlines throughout Norman's career are a tribute to the quality of his game. He was an excellent bat, too, always in the top half of the batting order contributing more than his share of the runs.

At one time he held a world record. At Sunderland he took ten wickets, all bowled, for 22 runs in ten overs!

Norman travelled widely and on his return from Egypt to play for Northumberland he made a fine impression in his opening game by taking 7 for 45. A wit remarked "the stumps must have seemed like pyramids."

In a letter of sympathy to his widow, Dorothy, the President of Bishop Auckland CC said: "Norman was a gifted player, a dedicated professional and an excellent coach."

Norman leaves sons Edward and John and daughter Sylvia.

On behalf of Norman Owen's many friends and admirers we extend sympathy to his wife and family and hope they are consoled in the knowledge that Norman's life and example will always be remembered.



These questions need answering . . .

Dear Sir,

The transfer of housing stock and associated assets is raising a number of questions in people's minds and I feel that many would find it helpful if at least some of these could be answered publicly. Perhaps your paper can help in this matter.

Quite a number of people who have talked to me about this matter feel really in the dark and many people's minds could be put at rest by a simple statement from the appropriate authorities.

Here are some of the questions which need answering:

1. What guarantee is there that the standard of housing maintenance will not deteriorate?

2. What guarantee is there that the upkeep of the physical appearance of the town, (grasscutting, trees, flowerbeds, etc.) will not deteriorate?

3. If there is a deterioration, what action can be taken to rectify the matter?

4. Is the Development Corporation's policy on housing allocation going to be maintained or altered and if so in what way? For example, the fine record that (a) if you have a job here you can get a house on the town; (b) if you

are a child of a family in a house here and you marry, you can get a house on the town; and (c) the ease of housing exchange; may be broken if the housing stock is opened up to all in Sedgefield District. It may mean that everyone wishing for a house will be offered one at Trimdon, Tudhoe or Spennymoor, or that long waiting lists will appear.
