# Christmas present we all want...

IN THIS SEASON OF GOODWILL Newton News makes a plea, to all involved in the Eaton dispute, to settle their differences and avoid a major catastrophe for our town.

We understand the main issue in dispute is resolved and that the only thing stopping a return to work is the amount of cash the workforce want for the period they have been out of work.

The employers have offered an average of £160 per man, the employees state they are entitled to an average of £700 as they were "locked out."

The management state they "laid off" the men because of sanctions they imposed which resulted in 50 per cent loss in output.

We hear it is definitely on the cards that the Eaton Corporation, based in USA, will cancel its investment in Aycliffe, pull out, and leave 1,300 people without jobs. Make no mistake, Eaton could do it, and this would be a savage blow to this town and one from which we have little chance of recovery.

### SHOCK

Already the company has cancelled a three-quarter million pound factory extension presently being built on the trading estate. The ADC are still reeling from the shock and have only "suspended" building in the hope that there will be a settlement.

ADC Chairman Dennis Stevenson told Newton News: "We have suspended building for a fortnight because we cannot believe the two sides cannot get together to resolve the problems. Failure to resolve will have a devastating effect on the whole town."

The fortnight expires on Monday next and if there is no hope of settlement the ADC will be forced to dismantle what they have built and to sell off the materials.

Newton News recognises first and foremost the hardship the men and their families are suffering. On the picket line I spoke to a man who had received a court writ for £140, another told me there would be no Christmas festivities for his family, and a third said his wife is being treated for depression.

### COMPROMISE

If there is no return to work next week the men could lose payment of a further £60 in Christmas holiday pay.

This dispute must be settled, common sense demands that everyone concerned makes up their mind to com-

promise. Orders and customers have been lost and it is going to be very difficult for the company to regain the position they had prior to the dispute.

But with goodwill and a desire to fight back, Eaton can reclaim all it has lost, including the new extension and further expansion at Aycliffe.

To all the men at Eaton and to the management here and abroad, give Newton Aycliffe the Christmas present it wants most — a settlement, which will ensure continuing prosperity for our town.

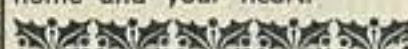
Soon the mad rush of pre-

## First book from ex paper boy

Philip Coxon had his first book published by Faber & Faber on 7th November, 1977. The book, entitled "The World of an Island," is beautifully illustrated by his wife Michele who is a well known wildlife artist.

The Outer Hebrides island of North Uist was taken by Philip for his study of life on an island. The book, fifth in a series for the young student, deals with geology, wildlife and the people of North Uist.

For nine years Philip lived with his parents in Bewick Crescent, Newton Aycliffe. This was the period in his life when he delivered the Newtonian. He also sang in the choir at St. Clare's Church. He was educated at the Timothy Hackworth School, Shildon, and Durham Grammar School, and graduated M.A. at Aberdeen University.

The working life of Philip has been varied and interesting. For over three years he worked as a Forester. He then taught at schools in Scotland for a brief period but missed the outdoor life so became a ghillie in a Scottish deer forest, followed by a reindeer herder in the Cairngorms.

Next he was engaged as a warden by the R.S.P.B. and has worked on reserves throughout Britain. For three years he worked as summer warden at Balnald reserve in North Uist where he met

his wife Michele Bootle, of Alcester, Warwickshire. She returned to the island to illustrate the book and shortly afterwards they were married. The wedding took place on Pabby Island in the ruins of a church. Pabby is in the Outer Hebrides and is uninhabited apart from six weeks of the year when shepherds live in its one croft while tending their sheep.

Philip and Michele, with their baby son, are now living on the Hensol Estate, Mossdale, Kirkcudbrightshire, while Philip is conducting a bird survey for the RSPB, the site being of special scientific interest.

Encouraged by his first book Philip is at present working on a novel which will be based on Galloway, Scotland.

Dear Sir,

I have been asked by Com-  
 mander Christopher Morgan  
 to keep you in touch with  
 HMS Eskimo's news and  
 movements.

The Ship has recently com-  
 pleted its Sea Training at  
 Portland under the guidance  
 of the Flag Officer Sea Train-  
 ing and his staff. During this  
 time the whole ship's com-  
 pany have been required to  
 work long hours practicing all  
 the many evolutions and  
 operations required of a  
 modern warship. As well as  
 gunnery practice against  
 towed surface targets, aircraft  
 and shore bombardment, the  
 Ship has been required to land  
 its Royal Marine Detachment  
 on a "hostile" beach to rescue  
 British residents from

"rebel hands."  
 Other activities have in-  
 cluded the tracking and  
 attacking of "enemy" sub-  
 marines both by the ship's  
 helicopter and anti-submarine  
 mortars. Practice in boarding  
 and towing stricken merchant  
 ships and boarding and  
 searching gun runners have  
 been carried out.

On one particular day over  
 half the ship's company were  
 landed to deal with an earth-  
 quake disaster in the imagi-  
 nary town of Fostaria. The  
 sailors had to put out fires,
