E.ON REVISE LAYOUT FOR ISLES WIND FARM

E.ON, one of the UK's leading renewable generators, will soon begin the second stage consultation process for its proposed Isles Wind Farm near Newton Aycliffe and is urging the local community to input into its plans.

The energy company has taken on board feedback that it received on the design of the wind farm from the first round of its consultation last year.

Originally the development was designed to feature up to 45 turbines and this has now been reduced by almost half to 24 turbines. This could still generate up to 63.5MW, enough electricity to power the domestic needs of around 35,000 homes - more than the population of Newton Aycliffe and Sedgfield combined.

Paul Hunt, Project Manager at E.ON, said: "The layout which we're proposing takes into consideration comments we've had on the visual, noise and environmental impact of the scheme and is an adaptation of one of the layouts we put forward last year.

"We're investing heavily in the region and believe this is a good site for a wind farm. Stage two consultation provides another opportunity for the local community to have their say and we'll be working hard over the coming months to reach out to residents to gather their feedback on the scheme.

"We're currently in the pre-application stage for this wind farm and want

to work with local people to put together the best possible design which will go forward for government approval next year."

The Government has set ambitious targets for renewable energy generation in the UK and development of onshore wind farms plays a very important part in providing a low carbon energy mix for the future. The Isles

Wind Farm, if consented, would be a vital step towards achieving those

Hitachi Will Make Aycliffe an Important Focal Point

The proposed £77m investment by Hitachi Rail Europe in a new train assembly plant will revitalise Newton Aycliffe writes a special correspondent.

The long-awaited completion of the agreement between the Department for Transport and Agility Trains, the consortium consisting of Hitachi and John Laing, to deliver the Intercity Express Programme (IEP) is so close that after over two years of delay it could now be just a matter of weeks away from an announcement by the DfT.

The significance for Newton Aycliffe is not to be understated. As a manufacturing base, this former new town has seen its industrial fortunes fluctuate. The arrival of Hitachi will bring with it a 450,000 sq ft plant, 500 direct jobs and direct rail access to the site. To say its 'good news' for the town is a significant understatement.

The selection of Newton Aycliffe against 40 other UK locations underlines the

town's connectivity by road and rail, important for Hitachi as the company has horizons beyond the UK and contracts such as the IEP and is openly negotiating for contracts in Europe. This has potential for Teesport.

"This part of Co Durham is an established manufacturing area dating back to its new town days, however more recently it has attracted distribution/logistics operations given the excellent AIM connectivity," says Simon Haggie, industrial partner at Knight Frank. "Faverdale, Darlington, is home to large Argos and Aldi warehouses and more recently Lidl has developed a regional distribution warehouse at Newton Aycliffe.

"Wynyard is increasingly seen as a distribution location because of its location on the A19 and proximity to Teesport, but it was Merchant Place Developments' site at Amazon Park which offered the scale and rail access to attract Hitachi and it is hoped that other larger occupiers

that may come through in due course as part of the supply chain."

The arrival of Hitachi is long-overdue. In 2009, the Agility Trains consortium was announced preferred bidder for the Intercity Express Programme. One year later, the then Secretary of State, Lord Andrew Adonis, ordered a review of the Intercity Express Programme, to ensure that it was value for money for the taxpayer.

Then there was the General Election in the same year which suspended progress on the contract which also led to the new coalition government conducting a spending review. So there have been several impediments to the project though all the while there has been continuing dialogue between the DfT and Agility Trains with close of contract anticipated shortly.

This will be a significant inward investment for the North East. Though not comparable to the scale of Nissan, the Hitachi development will nevertheless underline the fact that the region is an excellent location for Japanese companies. Newton Aycliffe in particular will become an important focal point for a new industry.

Rockermouth review from "Stormin the Castle" - "I'd never seem Ska-Mania before. I'd briefly met the singer when he was at the Office one evening watching a band play, and I knew John the keyboardist as he is also the keys-player with the local Whitesnake tribute band, Slip of the Tongue. So it was first time for me seeing these lads in action, but I was very impressed with what I saw. They are a seven-piece outfit, comprising of bass, drums, guitar, keys, horn section of sax and trombone, plus a separate lead singer. They have a great full sound, lots of visuals to see on stage with the group having plenty of members, and you got all the superb bouncy ska classics that you'd expect to hear. I must have missed the first half of the gig, but I did get to hear songs like 'On My Radio' by Selector, plus a ton of Madness tunes including 'Embarrassment', 'Madness' and the awesome 'Nightboat to Cairo'. If the wind farm receives planning consent, E.ON will set up a community benefit fund worth up to £190,000 per year, which will be used to support local projects throughout the lifetime of the wind farm and these projects will be selected by local people.

The formal stage two consultation period for the Isles Wind Farm runs from 5 July to 9 September 2012. E.ON welcomes feedback on its proposal and has set up dedicated channels to encourage the local community to comment on the scheme. It will also be hosting a second series of public consultation events in the coming months.

When stage two consultation ends, E.ON will use the responses gathered to shape the proposal further before completing an Environmental Impact Assessment and finalising its submission to the Planning Inspectorate which will be submitted in 2013.

and extends from Morden in the East to Newton Aycliffe in the West and from Bradbury in the North to Preston-le-Skerne in the South. The wind

turbines remain the same height as those outlined in the initial proposals for the scheme and will be between 100m and 126m tall.

Wind Farm More Likely

Eon's revised layout for the proposed Wind Farm near Newton Aycliffe has distinct possibilities of being accepted. Reducing the number of turbines to 24 has significantly lessened the environmental impact which so many people opposed.

There are still some concerns and Eon won't get it all their own way, even with the promised £190,000 kickback a year for local projects.

If it does receive permission there will be fun and games over who will decide who and what gets this sizeable chunk of cash each year. We understand a board of trustees will be appointed or elected to choose which applications for cash will be approved.

It is hoped politicians do not get these positions and that ordinary people get a chance to pick what projects would benefit the area.

Lets also hope, unlike AAP money, there is no exorbitant administration charge in dispensing the cash. If it's kept out of the hands of the County Council the whole amount can be spent locally.

Major Development Proposals for Co. Durham

Major proposals that will help to shape the future landscape, population and economy of County Durham are to be unveiled next week. The County Durham Plan is the first county-wide development strategy and will shape development in the area for the next 20 years.

The plan shows, for the first time, the types of development which are earmarked for towns and communities across County Durham, from Consett to Barnard Castle.

It outlines key sites where future housing and jobs could be created, as well as details on how new infrastructure can best support sustainable development.

Members of Durham County Council's Cabinet will be asked to agree a

public consultation on the proposals, which are supported by the council's regeneration statement and infrastructure delivery plan. All three documents are to be discussed by Cabinet next Tuesday 24th July.

The plan includes proposals for each of the county's 12 main towns and for rural areas. These proposals build on previous consultation and involve working with partners and other interested parties to ensure that the ambitions for the county's development are achievable and sustainable.

Cllr Neil Foster, Cabinet member for regeneration and economic development at Durham County Council, said: "The County Durham Plan is the council's most important regeneration document, setting out how

we can make the best of County Durham's assets to create a sustainable economy supported by strong communities.

"It looks at where key housing sites will be needed to support job creation, for example in Durham City, Peterlee and Newton Aycliffe, where it is anticipated Hitachi and other major employers will locate. "It identifies the sites where businesses can thrive – such as the strategic employment site in Seaham, and the Aykley Heads site in Durham City which is viewed as one of the best locations in the region for attracting private sector business investment.

"And it looks at leisure and tourism, including major proposals for a new executive housing development, leading to the creation of public access to the parkland at the Lambton Castle estate, near Chester-le-Street, which we see as a major regional tourist attraction."

The plan represents the council's response to the economic challenges facing the county and the wider region, which include unemployment, a high reliance on the public sector and funding changes affecting the support available to businesses investing in the area.

It is aimed at maximising opportunities for private sector investment, linking jobs, housing and retail to create confidence in the county.

Cllr Foster added: "This is very much about creating sustainable development across the whole county in partnership with private sector developers and other stakeholders.

"Under these proposals, developers will be expected to support the creation of the infrastructure which communities across the county and industry need to thrive – from road and transport networks to health and educational facilities.

"Our infrastructure delivery plan and proposed community infrastructure levy sets out different charging rates for different locations and types of development, which is aimed at encouraging development and investment in all parts of the county.

"Our aim is to set the framework for a vibrant and prosperous County Durham where people want to live, work, invest and visit.

"We believe that the proposals we are putting forward represent the best and most effective way of delivering growth for our communities."

Cabinet members will be asked to agree the preferred option for the County Durham Plan and approve a recommendation for a public consultation on this option to give residents a chance to respond.

PARISH PRIEST COMMENTS ON POLICE STATION

Dear Sir,

It is reported that the Police Station on Central Avenue in Newton Aycliffe is to be demolished and the site sold for an estimated £3 million. There are persistent but unsubstantiated rumours that a retail outlet wants to build on the site.

When the Station was closed in early 2011 an undertaking was given that a new Station would be built on the site. We are told now that a decision has not been made on whether a new Police Station is to be built in or near the town centre.

Meanwhile, the community's Police Station is now located in the Aycliffe Business Park. It is at the far end of the town and extremely remote from the majority of the people who live here.

This location makes it very difficult, if not impossible, for many members of the community, especially those who do not have private transport, to get to the Station if they wish to raise concerns, seek reassurance about events in their neighbourhood or report a

crime.

There is a genuine fear that the present 'temporary' Station, located in the Business Park, will become permanent, especially if there is no comment or protest from the community. Clearly, this would not be in the best interests of the vast majority of the people who live in Aycliffe.

I urge readers to take part in the Survey being carried out by the Great Aycliffe Residents Association (GARA) which wants to find out the wishes of the town's residents about their Police Station.

The Survey asks one simple question: Do you want a Police Station in a more central location in the town? Yes/No? GARA will submit these findings to the Police Authority.

Whatever our views on this matter, it is incumbent on all of us to make them known to the relevant authority. If we don't, yet another decision will be made in the interests of the few and not of the many.

I am deeply alarmed that our government is creating changes that will affect so many people, hitting where it hurts, in the pocket of those less fortunate than themselves. Major reforms to areas of unemployment benefits, assistance with housing and council tax and allowances to support people back into work, will never impact on Members of Parliament because their SECURE salaries far outweigh the budgets of those affected. If council tax is to be reduced by 10% then an increase has to be made somewhere else to compensate and maintain a workable allowance to suit the individuals' needs. The margin of higher rents increased in the north, to keep in line with those of the south is ludicrous! The employment sector is greatly divided in unequal proportions, yet the north still has to foot the bills of inflation alongside the

south. As a tenant in Newton Aycliffe for 33years, annual rent increases have always been applied in April, the beginning of a financial year and have subsequently risen with inflation on average £2 - £3. This year the increase is £7 just to keep in line with the south. The government is responsible for closing down businesses and them moving abroad, so what do we as British citizens expect to receive to compensate our loss in skilled trade? A benefit system which defeats public inspiration, sense of wellbeing and increased crime. Surely it cannot be the way forward to develop policies to charge working age tenants (who are already in receipt of some social housing benefit) an extra £13 per bedroom not slept in? It is absolutely outrageous, not only is this scaremongering tactics but an offence of harassment and abuse to the

vulnerable who now find themselves living alone. It is soul destroying to even suggest these vulnerable people should prepare to downsize. Where is the allowance for compassion? I do understand that families in need of bigger housing are hopeful this policy goes through, but not before the provision of one bedroom accommodation is made available! If Councils are not providing for the single person, then they cannot expect people to downsize and give up the home they've nurtured, carrying memories of loved ones. It is the government's responsibility to provide accommodation needs for all residents born and living in this country. It is a bonus that we as a nation, welcome and offer accommodation and employment to legal immigrants who receive the same rights.

I attended the Extraordinary Meeting of Great Aycliffe Town Council on 28th June 2012. I'm pleased to advise that the District Auditor gave yet another 'unqualified' report on the Council's accounts. In common parlance an 'unqualified' report means there are no issues or concerns raised during the course of the audit and the finances are well managed. The Auditor praised Dan Austin, Finance Officer, on producing clear, unambiguous accounts and also praised the Council on achieving year on year tight financial controls.

It was disappointing that only five Independent Councillors were in attendance at this important meeting - a meeting where the Councillors are afforded the opportunity, once a year, to question the person who has undertaken a comprehensive audit of the Council's finances.

In the last five years I've attended numerous Council meetings (probably more than some of the sitting Councillors) and during that time I cannot recall any questions being raised by the Independent Councillors on any financial issues relating to the mid term financial plan, the balance sheet or budgets, save for an embarrassing question as to what the figures in brackets represented on the balance sheet.

Almost five years ago, in the run up to the last elections, the Independents promised the townsfolk to half the Council Tax precept and make significant savings in the running of the town. I strongly suspect that the Independents have catastrophically failed to keep their promises to the electorate.

The company heard from local Councillor Bill Blenkinsopp that she was being denied help from her landlord to cut the 2½ foot high grass outside her bungalow and promptly deployed two men to do the work. It took three days to complete, using strimmers and powerful lawn mowers with 28 large bags of grass to take away.

Sylvia was delighted and could not thank Manager Paul Coates enough for his kind gesture. However she was absolutely overwhelmed when the company returned with a brand new robot lawn mower which will cut her grass in future.

Sedgefield Borough Homes had always cut her grass as she was disabled, but the new landlords "livin" have introduced new rules which places Sylvia outside the criteria as she has family

living nearby who they say should keep her lawn tidy.

"When 'livin' took over the rented properties they promised nothing would change, but they have broken that promise" complained Sylvia.

"I do have family but do not want them responsible for cutting this large area of grass" said Sylvia a very independent lady despite her disability.

Counc Blenkinsopp is working hard to get "livin" to change their rules and has already had three similar cases involving elderly disabled people reversed. One is a double amputee who lives in Clarence Chare. and two others are aged 95. It appears there are many such cases and like Sylvia the problem is causing much stress among our elderly residents

REPORT ON COUNCIL MEETING WEDNESDAY 11th JULY

Last week's Policy and Resources Committee of Great Aycliffe Town Council dealt with two issues of significance. The first concerned the (postponed) question of a donation to the Citizens' Advice Bureau (CAB). Speaking for the Labour Group, Cllr Clare outlined the difficulty of making a decision in this case. The financial needs of the CAB organisation are so vast that any donation by GATC would make little or no difference. No money had been allocated

for a grant in the Council's budget, and the donations budget stood at only £2800. The Council most certainly would not commit itself to an annual grant, not least because elections in 2013 would see a completely new Council. Having said that, however, CAB provides an invaluable service - one which was likely to become more vital in the future as the recession and the cuts began to bite - and figures supplied by CAB showed that most people attending Newton Aycliffe CAB were from Great Aycliffe. Consequently, the Labour Group was recommending that GATC make a donation of £6933, which would fund 6 generalist case work appointments per session, advice session supervision, reception and clerical cover and a contribution towards volunteer training. The grant was being given on the understanding that it had to be ring-fenced for Newton Aycliffe, and that it constituted a once-only donation to help CAB get over the financial shock of the cuts whilst they readjusted their organisation to the new financial situation. The money would have to be taken from contingencies. This proposal was agreed by the Council. The second issue concerned the Medium Term Financial Plan. The MTFP does not set the Council's budget, but looks forward to the financial issues the Council is likely to face. The Council has just received a glowing report from the Auditor, and is in a sound financial condition. Speaking for the Labour Group, however, Cllr Clare stated that GATC faces significant concerns for the future. There is continued uncertainty about the Double Taxation grant from Durham County Council. Also, Government changes to the Council Tax Benefit system would reduce the tax base, and therefore the council's income - what made this particularly alarming is that GATC had no way as yet of knowing how great the reduction might be, from tens of thousands to more than a hundred thousand pounds a year. Added to that, there were vague threats from Westminster about a cap, even cuts, on Town and Parish Council precepts. What was

Why Did Woodham Go it Alone?

I write in connection with Woodham College becoming an academy. Clearly the Governing Body must have weighed up all the facts before taking such a momentous step but the article needs to be put into perspective. Any academy continues to be state funded but not via the local authority but directly by the Department for Education ie in Woodham's case, the academy is no longer under the protective 'umbrella' of Durham County Council. Yes the academy will receive additional funding from DfE but this will be needed to pay for services which are currently provided 'free of charge' by the local authority. The Government's stated aim on more than one occasion is that academies are to be funded no better or worse than local authority schools. I would also question the phrase 'Following consultation with the wider community'. As your excellent publication is the main source of local news/events etc for all Newton Aycliffe residents, one would

assume that Woodham's consultation plans were originally formally set out in the Newton News asking for views. Did that happen? Finally, it was only 3 or so years ago that the Aycliffe Secondary Schools Educational Trust (ASSET) was set up so that Woodham, Greenfield and Shildon Sunnydale schools could formally work together to share good practice and increase the educational aspirations and achievements of all local students. It makes you wonder why Woodham suddenly sees the need to 'go it alone'! It is pleasing to note that Greenfield and Sunnydale are still working very closely together to promote this aim despite Woodham's withdrawal from the trust. I take the reference to DfE approving Woodham's application for academy status because 'it is a school which is performing well' to be an insult to the many, many other schools in the area doing likewise but do not see the need to 'go it alone'. worrying was not the current financial state of the Council, but the complete lack of figures about the extent of the cuts the Council would face. Cllr Clare thanked the Finance Manager for a clear and informative Plan, but the MTFP would need to be revised at least once before the Budget as - hopefully - these issues were clarified. Speaking from the Chair, Cllr Fleming emphasised that the Council was not in any trouble financially at the moment, but that it needed to brace itself for possible financial shocks in the future. The Council unanimously agreed the MTFP on a named vote. Finally, Councillors agreed a recommendation for the purchase of replacement vehicles. Within the budget allocated to replace the Ford Transit Crew Cab (which is now 11 years old and has literally stopped), the Works Manager has managed to arrange a deal to buy two new Mitsubishi L200 vehicles ... which will allow us also to replace the Parks Ranger's Vauxhall Corsa (which is 15 years old). Councillors agreed that these new vehicles will be a wise purchase as we move into an uncertain financial future. J. D. Clare

Woodham Wins £1000 Olympic Prize



Woodham students won themselves a trip to London to see the Olympics and £1000 for their school in a prestigious national competition. The students, Natasha Blackburn, Scott Dawson, Brenna Finn, Caitlin Hindle and Ryan Metcalfe came second in the STEM Challenge in London last week.

STEM Challenges are a series of competitions designed to encourage young people to use the skills learnt in Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics to think and work creatively about the London 2012 Olympic and Paralympic Games. Cisco, STEMNET and the Pearson Foundation challenged students to consider the venue, location, sport, resources, facilities and equipment to plan a large scale, accessible and sustainable event in their home area. As one of eight finalists, the Woodham team was invited to Cisco House, overlooking the Olympic Park, to a Dragon's Den style pitch to a panel of expert judges.

The judges were impressed with the team's plan for a triathlon event in Newton Aycliffe, involving running, swimming and cycling. Students supported their presentation with their own DVD and event merchandise. One of the judges summarised their performance as "awesome".

The idea to enter the competition came from the students' Chemistry teacher, Miss Telford, who will use the prize money to further invest in Woodham's Science club. Christine Forsyth, headteacher at Woodham, said "This was a great opportunity for some of our most able students to put their knowledge of Science, Mathematics and Technology into practice. Everyone at Woodham is very proud of their achievement".

AAP Funds Help Town Youngsters Enjoy New Activities

Budding DJs and sport stars are being given the chance to shine thanks to new sessions in Newton Aycliffe.

Great Aycliffe and Middridge Area Action Partnership has come together with Durham County Council's Sport and Leisure Services to offer Aycliffe young people the chance to try new sport and leisure facilities for a small, nominal fee.

Many young people don't have the opportunity to try new sports or activities because of financial constraints and others come from families which don't get involved in sport.

This involves nearly 25 miles of walking, with 10,000 feet of ascent, to top the highest summits in Scotland, England and Wales. Martin has been to teach health care workers in Nepal on 2 occasions, and he has been to extremely remote, mountainous regions, which can be up to 6 days walk from a hospital.



The nurses the charity employs have only 18 months initial training, and need help in developing their skills to work as GPs and midwives combined. The charity funds their training and pays their wages, as well as organising British GPs to travel to Nepal to teach and support them. The doctors pay all their own expenses, down to the food which is mainly rice and lentils. Most people have no electricity no sanitation and no running water in their houses, and they are chronically short of food. People become very sick from preventable illnesses like gastroenteritis, and education is just as important as medicines under the circumstances. Kieran was diagnosed with Ewing's Sarcoma in October 2010 a childhood cancer. He became confined to a wheelchair needing help with everything. He had full body scans and samples taken from the tumor to check it hadn't spread. A central line was fitted for chemotherapy to start after 1 week lasting for 6 months. He lost 10kgs, his hair and nearly his life.

On 31st March 2011 he had an amputation at just 12 years old. He had a further 8 months of chemo before remission. He's now having rehabilitation to get him walking with his prosthetic leg. During his remission he was chosen to carry the Olympic torch, but being Kieran he wanted to walk not use his wheelchair. This however would take strength, something Kieran did not have.

Athena Sports Academy of Newton Aycliffe saw Kieran's story in the Newton News and invited him along to build up his strength through gymnastics. Kieran realised that he could really succeed in gymnastics, and so after only a few weeks he entered his first gymnastics competition where he won a gold medal. But this was only the start for Kieran and he is now aiming high training for regional acro competitions with the hope of qualifying for the nationals.

He recently took part in a display at the Leisure Centre along with his very talented gymnastics partner Abbie Ramsey (aged 7) performing a cheeky and fun acro pairs routine.

Kieran has even progressed to mainstream classes pushing himself even more. Through all the work from coaches Sam Robson, Gerry Fuller and Jeff Wade, Kieran eventually built his strength up and was able
