"But I'm proud to be an adopted Newtonian." said Jackie born and bred in Greenock where he was a joiner in the shipyards with Billy Connolly. Jackie moved to Newton Aycliffe in 1972 and worked for.

Aycliffe Development Corporation, before retiring in 1991.

Married to Norah, Jackie spent some time on holiday in the area before settling down in Newton Aycliffe and eventually becoming a Sedgefield Borough Councillor in 1999.

"This is now home and always will be. I had a good look around when I was here and decided that this was the place for me," said 71-year-old Cllr Piggott.

Family from Scotland along with children Carol, Stuart, Brian and Linda were present at the Sedgefield Borough Council Offices to see Jackie sworn in as Mayor and replace Cllr Marie Predki. Cllr Predki's chosen charity was the Butterwick Hospice in Bishop Auckland and she presented a cheque to Chief Executive Graham Leggett-Chidgey for £14,915.

During the last year, Cllr Piggott had major heart surgery and underwent a triple heart bypass. And, as a way of saying thank you, he has chosen two charities close to him that will benefit from his year in office - the cardiac unit of the James Cook University Hospital in Middlesbrough and the North East Air Ambulance Service.

"It's thanks to these two organisations that I am enjoying a new lease of life. Hopefully, the money that my charities raise over the next 12 months can go towards helping other people," said Jackie.

Cllr Lucy Hovvels, who has represented the New Trimdon & Trimdon Grange Ward with such distinction, is the new Deputy Mayor.

Will Rents Rise? Dear Sir,

In his reply to my questions about who pays for the Stock Transfer Campaign, Councillor Vince Crosby pointed out that it was not a yes campaign but a consultation process.

But after receiving a further two lots of literature within three days telling me how wonderful the transfer would be, I can safely say it is a brainwashing exercise.

But what they are not telling the public is the rents are 16% higher in Sunderland and over a period of time the rents in Aycliffe will rise to the Sunderland level.

Sunderland Housing Group will have to take out a mortgage to buy the stock and a second mortgage to carry out the home improvements.

If the interest rates rise the rents will have to rise as no company can survive if they are paying more out than they are getting in. This does not apply if we stay as we are because the stock was paid for many years ago.

The real reason behind this is the Government are desperate for money, they aim to sell every Council house in the country, houses that were built 35 to 70 years ago for less than £1,000. Current prices £50,000 to £100,000.

Another disturbing aspect to emerge is that Council employee's have been threatened with instant dismissal if they express their own personal views while carrying out repairs, service etc. What happened to freedom of speech? 

The following article appeared in a recent edition of the Wall Street Journal, Newton News would like to reproduce this story to emphasise the good work Rotary clubs around the world are doing to improve humanity

Polio and Rotary

Tuesday 12th April, 2005

"Today marks the 50th anniversary of the Salk polio vaccine. Poliomyelitis, also known as infantile paralysis, used to be one of childhood's most feared diseases. A few years after Dr. Jonas Salk announced his vaccine on April 12, 1955, nearly every child in the U.S. was protected. Today polio has disappeared from the Americas, Europe and the Western Pacific and is nearly gone from the rest of the world.

A too little known part of this feat is the role played by Rotary, the international businessman's club, which 20 years ago adopted the goal of wiping out the disease. Rotary understood that medical breakthroughs are worthless unless people aren't afraid to immunize their children and efficient delivery systems exist to get the vaccine to them. And so it mobilized its members in 30,100 clubs in 166 countries to make it happen.

In 1985, when Rotary launched its eradication program, there were an estimated 350,000 new cases of polio in 125 countries. Last year, 1,263 cases were reported. More than one million Rotary members have volunteered their time or donated money to immunize two billion children in 122 countries. In 1988, Rotary money and its example were the catalyst for a global eradication drive joined by the World Health Organization, UNICEF and the U.S. Centers for Disease Control. In 2000 Rotary teamed up with the United Nations Foundation to raise \$100 million in private money for the program. By the time the world is certified as polio-free (probably in 2008) Rotary will have contributed \$600 million to its eradication effort. An economist of our acquaintance calls Rotary's effort the most successful private health-care initiative ever. A vaccine-company CEO recently volunteered to us that the work of Rotary and the Gates Foundation, both private groups, has been more effective than any government in promoting vaccines to save lives. It's become fashionable in some quarters to deride civic volunteerism, but Rotary's unsung polio effort deserves the Nobel Peace Prize."





Police Crackdown on Motor Cycles

Motor cycles of all shapes and sizes continue to cause the people of Newton Aycliffe misery. As part of the Street Safe Scheme, Officers from the Beat Office in Newton Aycliffe aided by Durham Constabulary Motorbike Section will continue to target youths who are making local residents lives a misery.

Little kids, teenagers and adults riding quad bikes and motor cycles all plague people when they ride off road and on public footpaths. A lot of it is down to ignorance, some people think that if they can find a plot of wasteland they can ride on it. This is not the case and unless you have permission from the land owner you can not ride on it. There are currently no areas of land in Newton Aycliffe that off road motorcycles or quad bikes can be ridden.

If you ride any mechanically propelled vehicle on a road you are required to have a license, insurance and road tax. Also if you ride any mechanically propelled vehicle off road without permission of the land owner you commit the offence of driving without lawful authority and also could be driving in a careless/ inconsiderate manner.

We would also ask any members of the public who can identify any of the person's responsible for riding off road motorcycles in and around Newton Aycliffe to contact Acting Sergeant Simon Rogers at the Beat Office, Newton Aycliffe on 0845 60 60 365.


