

A North East training provider is at the forefront of a national drive to meet landmark building regulations designed to improve the safety of electrical work carried out in the home.

Trailblazing South West Durham Training Ltd in Newton Aycliffe is bringing electricians and tradespeople from across the country up to speed with the new 'Part P' regulations by delivering one of the first dedicated training courses.

The landmark legislation, brought in earlier this year to boost safety and cut accidents, is changing the face of domestic electrical work. All but the simplest tasks, such as changing a light bulb, must now be carried out by a Part P competent tradesperson or inspected by an approved person.

Having already received interest from as far afield as Leicester and Carlisle, South West Durham is putting tradespeople through their paces on a course that has been developed in partnership with the National Inspection Council for Electrical Installation Contracting (NICEIC).

The course covers the full spectrum of Part P legislation from full domestic installations right down to the addition of a new circuit or socket. Practical and theoretical training is delivered in areas such as earthing and isolation techniques and can be tailored to the needs of electricians and tradesman in 19 associated trades including kitchen fitting and plumbing.

Part P is a major step change for the domestic electrical industry," explains Paul Daniel, a qualified trainer and assessor at SW Durham Training. "It's not just electricians who are affected, other tradespeople such as kitchen fitters and plumbers will have to prove they have the necessary skills or find somebody to certify their work.

year, plus or minus up to £2 per week until target rents are reached.

This is in line with Government policy, which controls the rents of both the Housing Association sector and the Council sector. Rents of both of these sectors have to converge by 2012 so that rents are similar for similar properties. These rules will apply whether or not transfer goes ahead.

The important thing to remember about rents is that at the moment the Council has to transfer almost £2m worth of rents collected from the Borough's tenants to the Government. If transfer takes place, this sum will be retained within Sedgefield Housing, which will help to pay for the planned improvements. Furthermore 75% of all proceeds from selling Council houses have to be transferred to the Government - in 2004/05 this transfer amounted to £7.3m. Again this stops if transfer goes ahead.

It is by keeping these funds in the Borough that provides the resources to meet the total investment plan of £130m over the first 10 years and £397m over thirty years, not by any further increase in rents over and above those specified by the Government. Yours sincerely.

"Over time it will become the recognised industry standard, like the CORGI standard for gas fitters. Even DIY enthusiasts and anyone wishing to move house will have to show that any work carried out has been properly certified."

After training and assessment, tradespeople will be able to register with the NICEIC before undergoing an on-site assessment to ensure they are qualified to selfcertify their own work. Those tradespeople not registered with the NICEIC will have to have their work checked by building control officials.

Added Paul Rodway: "We're delighted to be at the forefront of delivering Part P training and have worked hard to ensure the course reflects what people experience in the workplace. There has been a steady stream of interest so far and we expect this to grow and grow over the coming months."

Sedgefield Housing would be the new wholly owned subsidiary of Sunderland Housing Company Limited. It owns no assets and is simply a facilities management company. The same applies to Emperor Construction Services Limited, which was established to manage the construction of new build properties. The reason neither of these companies are mentioned in any more detail in the formal offer document is they are immaterial to the Sedgefield stock transfer. If transfer goes ahead: All of the income would be used to improve tenants




