### **OUBTS WOODHAM DEVELOPMENT CAN BE FINANCED**

It would seem that Washington Developments Ltd publicity and spin machine has been hard at work in an effort to convince people that their planning application to build 50 houses and a hotel on the Woodham golf course should be allowed. This is depite the fact the application appears to contravene planning rules on several counts, falls outside the Regional Development Plan for the area, and cuts right across the former Aycliffe Development Corporation's Development wishes that there should be no encroachment onto greenfield sites on the north side of

Newton Aycliffe.

If these plans were to be approved by the Planning Committee, the proposals would undoubtedly lead to the destruction of a very large area of open and beautiful countryside that is home to a wide variety of wildlife.

Having convinced our fickle Town Councillors to support the plans, the company has now turned its attention to our Member of Parliament but clearly from the article in a

it has been extraordinarily economical with the truth about local support for the

project.

I have not seen signs of growth in support locally for this project as is claimed by the company except perhaps from our politicians. When development of this area was first proposed by Washington Developments some three or four years ago now, a meeting of Woodham residents with members of the old Sedgefield Borough Council Planning Department and it was attended by over 120 people who all made it very clear that they considered the proposed destruction of green areas around our town was unacceptable.

Our Town Councillors at that

time apparently agreed. The plans may have been scaled down a little since then but the fundamental principles have not changed. I do therefore hope that Mr Wilson and our Councillors have not been taken in by the rhetoric, the spin and the wild promises made by the professional advisors

facilitate this application.

Jobs can only be created in any significant numbers with investment and the company's case has, since the earlier valid objections to their plans, been based largely upon the potential for job creation. Perhaps our Councillors have been seduced by this prospect. We all want to see more permanent jobs created in the area but this will simply not happen in this case. The reality is that Washington Developments, an Irish
Republic owned company,
has continually failed to
demonstrate how it proposes to fund the development to the tune of the £32 million which they claim will be needed for the project. Presumably the company will expect Council Tax payers to foot the bill for the upgrade of the Middridge Road that will be essential to cope with the increased traffic before any building can start. This will cost many millions and it will be interesting to learn whether that will have been fully costed or that the company intend to foot the bill.

The Irish bankers of this company have, according to a Panorama programme, stopped funding all new speculative property development so where will the funds come from? Washington Developments have failed to show any financial support for the project in their planning application which can be viewed on Durham County Council website.

This question does not appear to have been an issue for our Councillors and our MP. I would suggest Mr Wilson investigates this aspect before allowing our County Planning Committee to consider the proposals. As a Labour party MP, I cannot really believe that he would allow himself to be associated with such a highly speculative and risky project. In any case should he not be focusing upon how to build more affordable housing around the area rather than more expensive "executive" housing?

The company's application suggests that they anticipate the selling prices of their new houses to be between £400,000 and £750,000. We do need a balance of both executive and starter and smaller homes but the pressing need is surely for more affordable homes in our area and there is certainly no current demand for the more expensive housing.

Of huge significance in this matter is the fact that the latest accounts filed at Companies House for Washington House for Washington Developments Limited are at 31/10/09 and the 2010 figures are now well over three months late for statutory filing and are showing as "overdue on the Companies House web site (as at 14/11/11).
Surely the Planning Committee

will need to see the figures for 2010 at the very least as well as firm evidence of a funding package in place before giving this application any credence? It is a matter of public record that the 10/09 accounts filed for the company show losses of over £1.6 million and a return to balance sheet solvency from the previous year's (2008) accounts only by virtue of the directors' revaluation of the fixed assets.

So why is this company so intent on obtaining planning permission for a development that it does not appear to be in a financial position to see

There is a feeling it is simply to enhance the freehold value of the site before trying to sell it on with planning approval to another developer. Quite probably, we shall then be faced with another proposal with the prospect of even more damage to our green areas.

I would urge our Councillors to listen to their constituents as previously at the Community Centre Residents' Meeting some three years ago when they supported the residents. I wonder why they have changed their minds?

Previous planning applications to develop this site have failed because they neither conformed to planning regulations or planning policies for the area. so this application should also fail on the same grounds as nothing has changed

Fortunately it is the Durham County Planning Committee who will finally decide the fate of this unwanted and ill conceived application and I am sure they will be far better informed about all of the appropriate planning issues.

#### *GOLF CLUB* RESPONDS

I refer to the letter from Mrs Chrichton in relation to our proposed development at Woodham Golf and Country Club. Much of the letter is, unfortunately, inaccurate and it is therefore necessary for me to respond.

The letter has also raised a number of questions on the funding and delivery of the development. In this regard I can confirm, unequivocally that we have secured bank funding to take this project forward. The key to unlocking and delivering this scheme is planning permission.

With permission in place the end of January we would be able to commence construction on site in 2012 and complete the development within 5 years. Planning conditions will guarantee that the hotel and golf course works will be completed in association with the new housing. This is not a risky project. The new jobs will definitely be created and the scheme will provide much needed hotel facilities and visitors alongside the construction of the new Hitachi Factory.

Washington Developments is a company that operates across Europe, and has operated in the UK for over 10 years with 20 British employees. We have an excellent reputation for the quality and management of our properties. Woodham Golf club has been owned and operated by us for the past five years.

Mrs Chrichton claims no changes in circumstances since 2007. In reality the world is very different. Unemployment in Sedgefield has risen by 88% since 2007 and Durham County Council are now bringing out new plans which target Newton Aycliffe for growth. In this context our proposals will make a huge contribution to meeting local economic and

policy objectives.
We continue to work with the Council and it is our hope that this application will be presented to planning committee on 31st January 2012. At that time we hope Members will consider the application on its own planning, environmental and economic merits rather than on the basis of incorrect and unjustified hyperbole.

### **ARRIVA CUT BUS SERVICES | ARRIVA INCREASE** WITHOUT CONSULTATION

of the town has complained on behalf of neighbours to the changes to the 5 and 5A bus route. The buses no longer operate in this area causing massive inconvenience to residents, partcularly the elderly

What is more the removal of the service came unexpectedly with no public consultation. We tried to make contact with Arriva through their website and Press

"Arriva's recent changes include the withdrawal of the service 5/5a at the stop in Alston Cres. This is a service they provided without any subsidy (except for the Mon-Sat evening service) and as a commercial venture they are free to choose what route and time they operate.

They are keen to save the time involved in the diversion via Alston Cres, in order to improve the timekeeping of the service. Although the diversion takes less than 2 minutes, they consider it is necessary to make this small saving as the timekeeping on these services has been "under pressure" sin changes earlier this year. since

Although the 5/5a times did not change, it was linked at Bishop Auckland with the Bishop - Ferryhill service; and I understand it is now stopping more often in Darlington following a reduction in town services on the North Rd corridor. This has made the overall Office, without success. We left messages, but received no reply. It was noticeable how difficult it was to find

anyone to speak to and it was almost like the object was to wear the caller down.

As the County Council have responsibility for bus services we placed the matter in the hands of County Councillor Mike Dixon who obained the following response from the officer in charge:

operating cycletighter and Arriva feel they have to do something to save a little time by shortening the route. They say the stops at area.) Alston Cres were not heavily used and that is why they

have made the cut. It is of course frustrating that the service is being lost at Alston Crescent. Although for the immediate area of Alston Crescent many of the houses are within what would be considered a normal walking range of alternative stops that are still served, there are people for whom the longer walk will be a problem. (Particularly from the west side of Greenfield Way).

We are in discussion with Darlington Council about a possible variation to the route in Newton Aycliffe of the Scarlet Band service 16 to cover the section of Greenfield Way adjacent to Alston Crescent. This is a service that runs under a subsidised basis, jointly funded by DCC and

Darlington BC (who lead on the contract arrangements as most of the service is in their

The service currently runs The service currently runs from Newton Aycliffe town centre via Burn Lane, Burnhill Way, Williamfield Way, Greenfield Way then School Aycliffe etc. The possible diversion would mean it would have to omit Williamfield Way, which was a server of the server Williamfield Way, instead running via Meadowfield Way and then the full length of Greenfield Way. However, Darlington

However, Darlington recently announced it is proposing to withdraw ALL its subsidised services later in 2012, as part of coping with cuts in government funding. This creates a significant question mark over the future of service 16, as DCC will be faced with funding the whole cost of the service rather than paying a share. It is therefore not clear what scope we are going to have, although I am still pursuing the matter. I am sorry not to be able to provide an entirely positive response at this point. I will be back in touch in the New Year." Simon Day

# **BUS FARES BY 6%**

Arriva is revising fares on its bus service in Co Durham and the rest of the region, with effect from 2nd Jan 2012. This is their first general change since February 2011.
• Single fares under £2.30

rise by a maximum of 10p (with some remaining unchanged).

Most return fares increase by 10p (which means an increase in the discount compared with buying two singles).

• Most day/ weekly/ 4 weekly/ annual tickets increase in a similar degree. (eg the "region-wide" weekly ticket increases from £24 to £25.50; and the Durham District ticket increases from £15 to £16). Arriva say overall the general

increase is around 6%.
For comparison, overall annual inflation according to the latest CPI index was 4.8%; the RPI increased by 5.2%; and RPIX (excluding mortgages) increased by 5 3%

The fares increase is taking place against a background of rising operating costs, particularly for compounded from April 2012 by the 20% reduction April in Bus Service Operator Grant that is paid to all bus operators by government to offset part of the cost of fuel taxation.

(Other forms of public transport pay little or no taxation on fuel).

# A Pint With Carols Our M.P. Sums up 2011

In this, my New Year's Report I want to give you a picture of my work over what has been an extremely busy 2011. I have worked hard in Westminster as an Opposition Whip and in the constituency dealing with not only your personal concerns, but also those which have or will affect the whole community. These include Hitachi, Newton Aycliffe Town Centre; The Isles Wind Farm, Arriva Buses.

HITACHI TRAINS

One of our greatest successes in 2011 was ensuring the government made the right decision agreeing to Hitachi trains coming to Newton Aycliffe; creating 500 direct jobs with thousands in the supply chain: the biggest private sector investment in the North East since Nissan. Construction of the purpose built factory will start towards the end of 2012 beginning of 2013. Train carriages will start production from 2015/2016. Hitachi is also looking for other train building contracts which would bring more work to Newton Aycliffe. The importance of this project cannot be overestimated, not just for the local area but for the whole of the North East. The Hitachi project is still on

#### NEWTON AYCLIFFE TOWN CENTRE

The Aldi Store will be built and opened in 2012. The Town Centre Manager informs me the ramp will be brought down and other improvements made in 2012. I found the most frustrating issues since the redevelopment began to be the planning process and the incompetence of the utility companies which caused unnecessary delays. I also know this has caused a great deal of frustration for residents and developers alike. I know it may not always seem as if anything is happening in the Town Centre but that doesn't mean nothing is happening as a lot goes on behind the scenes. THE ISLES WIND FARM

The people of County Durham are not nimbyist. We have approaching 20 wind farms in approaching 20 wind farms in the area and 22 % of our energy needs come from renewable sources. County Durham continues to play its part in the fight against climate change. It is time for other parts of the country, especially the South East, to do the same. We all want to share the benefits of renewable energy but we should also share the burden. Eon proposes to build a wind farm near Newton Aycliffe of

least 4 times the height of the Angel of the North covering 7.5sq miles: an area equal to the size of Newton Aycliffe.

I held three major public meetings on wind farms including Newton Aycliffe; spoke on the matter six times in the Commons. Durham County is known as the Land of the Prince Bishops; I do not want our County to become the land of the wind turbine.

#### ARRIVA BUSES

ARRIVA BUSES

My post bag is full of complaints about the state of bus services in County Durham. They report buses not turning up, broken down or simply cancelled with communities left stranded. It have a constituent who will have to find more than £60 a week in taxi fares to take her to work just 2 miles away and her situation is not unique. Arriva will run buses where there is subsidy from the taxpayer. If that subsidy is withdrawn Arriva simply withdraws the bus. There is a clash of needs. A clash between the commercial bus company which needs to make a profit and the need of the traveller who needs to get to work, college, or visit hospital.

Durham County Council has to find £125 million in cuts over the next 4 years and is in a similar position to many other local authorities reducing other local authornies reducing its subsidy to bus companies, particularly Arriva, who in turn are withdrawing services. The problem is the decision taken back in 1985 to privatise bus services, however, bus services, however, privatisation didn't highlight the fact that privatised buses run on a commercial basis still require public subsidy. All I am asking the bus companies to do is what they set out to do in the first place: provide a

#### NATIONAL ISSUES

The number of unemployment in Sedgefield constituency in November 2011 numbered 2,332, which is 397 higher than in November 2010. Youth unemployment rose by 105%. 13.3% of 18-24 year olds are out of work in the area, compared to 10.8% in the North East and 8.0% in the UK. We need a growth strategy for the economy. ### **COUNTY DURHAM GETTING WARMER**

underway but a study of weather trends going back 150 years shows that County Durham is getting warmer! The research, carried out a Durham University student on work experience at Durham County Council, also reveals that, contrary to how it may feel, rainfall is pretty much unchanged over the same timescale.

Student, Andrew Telford, 21, studied temperature and rainfall trends dating back to 1850 from the Durham observatory. This is the second longest historical climate record in Britain after the Radcliffe Observatory in Oxford and provides an excellent source for an investigation of recent climate change.

The fact that the data correlates to national trends means we now have unequivocal evidence of climate change here in County Durham and some of the findings are fascinating. example, while temperature rises are in line with those experienced

nationally, this shows that whatever our perceptions of wetter summers may be - they're actually pretty much unchanged regarding rainfall for 150 years. It's the winters which appear to be getting wetter!"

findings give us invaluable data for our continued education campaign regarding the need to take action and make even little changes which will help reduce the impact of climate change."

The report investigated trends such as temperature, rainfall, wind speeds, even humidity and compared these local trends to national

Temperature trends show that over the timescale annual temperatures in Durham City have increased from 8.0°C in 1850 to 9.5°C in 2009 (with a steep drop to 8.3°C in 2010 due to the exceptionally cold winter in this year).
The figures provide a good

match to national trends showing that climate change is occurring even here in

Professor Tim Burt from Durham University added: "It has been very good that a Durham University student has been able to spend time analysing the Durham weather records.

'Andrew's findings are clearly of immediate benefit to the local community and can help us plan for the future. "Having just had the warmest November and the second warmest autumn on record at Durham in over 160 years, we just cannot ignore the recent warming trend.

#### **NEW TECHNOLOGY SHORTENS MOTORWAY** CRASH CLOSURES

benefit from shorter motorway closures after crashes thanks to the roll-out of 3D laser scanning technology funded by the Government and Police,

The Department for Transport has awarded 27 police forces across England a total of £2.7million. The funding, together with police and the National Policing Improvement Agency (NPIA) contributions, will enable them to purchase 37 scanners.

The technology saves time by quickly making a 3D image of the whole crash site, rather than investigators painstakingly surveying multiple sections of a scene. This digital image of the site can then be viewed on a computer screen remotely allowing investigators to take measurements of where vehicles are in relation to each other and examine other important evidence.

This initiative is delivering an action plan aimed at reducing delays caused by incidents in order to keep traffic moving a vital element in securing the UK's prosperity.

"There is nothing more frustrating than being stuck in a traffic jam for hours on end. But even worse than that

is the shocking £1 billion cost of those lost hours for our economy. That is why we are determined to improve the clear-up of accidents so we can get our motorways re-opened as quickly as possible.
The £2.7 million DfT funding

award will see 3D laser scanners rolled out quickly where they are needed most. This will benefit drivers reducing incident clear up times by 39 minutes on average.

Last year there were more than 18,000 full or partial motorway closures lasting a total of more

than 20,000 hours. A Government strategy tackle congestion caused by motorway closures and drive down the £1bn annual cost to the economy was published in May by the Minister.

The 3D laser scanning project is innovative and will enable motorways to be opened more quickly after incidents, passing a direct benefit to the public. The National Policing Improvement Agency pleased to support the project. which also brings significant improvements in supporting better outcomes in policing and increased efficiency in officer


