


Woodham Summer School

Gig Pit Review - Crook FC was absolutely jam-packed and it appeared apparent that they had made such a good impression on the punters the last time they played, that quite a lot had turned out for them adoin, despite the dodgy weather. Well, what can I say about the music? Well NE/DC are (probably obviously) an AC/DC tribute band who cover the Bon Scott era tracks, and are made of the remnants of Whey Aye CDC plus a couple of newbies to the fold.
They played a straight set for nearly two hours and as usual Graeme got right into his 'Angus' role and just never seemed to let up, an absolutely blistering guitar performance with all the moves of Angus off to a tee. The crowd were really getting into it by the third track! Lead singer Patrick, vocally I don't think I have ever heard better. I usually refer to him as 'more Bon than Bon' but don't just take my word for it, go and see for yourself, I think you will be amazed. Despite not looking like Bon however, Patrick is a great frontman, gets the crowd going and keeps up with the Duracell bunny antics of Crame superbly well.
The drummer Neil Knows AC/DC upside down and could probably play any track by them while eating a sandwich and reading a newspaper, and he puts his own trademark of course on everything he does. This is the second time I have seen NE/DC and I think they were excellent first time round at The Blyth and Tyne, but they really stepped it up a gear and took the roof off Crook FC on Saturday.
One to watch these guys, they dont gig loads, but I personally would highly recommend them another - "outstanding again. It was just like watching the AC/DC "Rock goes to college 1977" DVD . . . loved it."





The news that Hitachi is to bring their European train building factory to Newton Aycliffe is brilliant for the town. 730 working in the

For all

factory and 200 construction jobs will bring a welcome boost to employment in the area. And these are not

minimum wage jobs. They are high value, skilled jobs which will be well paid, bringing extra spending power to the town and surrounding area. One of reasons why Hitachi coming to Aycliffe because the town has is is a skilled worked force. And to add to the skills apprenticeships will be offered to our young people. There will be many more thousands of jobs in the supply chain. The Hitachi plant will only cover a third of the site up for development, leaving plenty of room for suppliers and other companies to move onto the designated land.



its research and development facility at Aycliffe also shows the company's longterm commitment to the area. Hitachi Rail Europe will use the site as its base to export trains to Europe, I understand the company has been shortlisted for one European contract already and has also been shortlisted for providing the rolling stock for the Crossrail infrastructure project in London. almost immediately, but the construction of the site will start in the New Year. Trains will start rolling out of the factory in 2015. 600 carriages will be manufactured for use on the Great Western line between London and South Wales from 2017 and the East Coast mainline from 2018. The new trains will leave the factory and join the railway along the original route used by George Stephenson Locomotion No. 1 187 years ago. A piece of history not lost on the Japanese. Train building has come full circle.

Residents Unite to Oppose Wind Farm

The Isles Communities Turbine action Campaign (TICTAC) was formed by residents in the area to protect their interests which are needed now more than ever due to the threat of this wind farm Eon will be holding workshops

so they can try persuade the advantages of giant 410 feet turbines. TICTAC do not receive government subsidies paid for by the taxpayer so they will not be holding workshops but Eon, a foreign company will receive a staggering £150, million. These subsidies cause energy bills to rise and will make British industry uncompetitive due to the green energy charges.



School summer holidays mean the true arrival of summer and the following six weeks will see more families taking to the road for holidays at home and abroad. In particular many families are opting for a holiday at home with one in five people planning a

caravan or camping holiday this year, me included! Nissan carried out a survey and found 20% of caravaners had actually only taking up towing within the last six months and an astonishing 40% of those who tow caravans have never received any training on how to do so safely. Speak with most drivers

speak with most drivers and they'll admit a lack of knowledge about the towing power of their own car. This lack of knowledge can result in drivers purchasing caravans, boats or even trailers which are being pulled by underpowered vehicles.

However, there are now many courses available up and down the country designed to help motorists learn how to tow safely, some of which are even free. You can also find online services where you can enter the make and model of your car along with the type of caravan you're towing and they will provide all the information you need taking into account, top speeds, wind effects and road gradients. Another important factor to take into account is stability and if your car can tow a particular caravan safely. To help raise awareness and the importance of ensuring you're towing a caravan safely, the Highways Agency has realesed a new safety DVD called 'Fit to Tow' that can be found on their website at www.highways.gov.uk. Here's my five top tips for towing this summer:

1.Checkyouarelegallyallowedtotow.Requirementsdifferaccordingtowhenyour

license was issued 2. Know your towing limit as well as the maximum braked and unbraked towing

weights (this can be found in your vehicle handbook) 3. Know the speed limits (60mph on motorways and dual carriageways and 50mph on single carriageways unless

otherwise stated) 4. Allow more time and space for accelerating and braking

5. When approaching an incline select a lower gear in good time. Going uphill this provides extra power. Going down it reduces the strain on your vehicle's brakes. Enjoy your summer

Re-thinking our Approach | TOWN SPORTS CLUBS to Physical Activity

Lack of exercise is now causing as many deaths as smoking across the world, a study suggests. The report, published in the Lancet to coincide with the build-up to the Olympics, estimates that about a third of adults are not doing enough physical activity, causing 5.3m deaths every year. It's medically proven that people who do regular physical activity have:


