

CRACK DOWN ON TAKING CHILDREN **ON HOLIDAY DURING** TERM TIME

Further to news reports that Education Secretary, Michael Gove, plans to crack down on parents who take children out of school during term-time to go on holiday, as well as issue tougher fines for truancy in a drive to improve attendance rates, Stephen Clarke, Managing Director, Contact Group (www.the-contactgroup. com), comments:

"Parents are breaking the law if they fail to ensure their child's regular attendance at school, so holiday applications need to be closely monitored. Taking children away from school during term-time for whatever reason can disrupt their education, particularly at a crucial stage in their school career. In order to manage term time absences,

Local Authorities can systematically track those on holiday during term-time and if they have requested a holiday, that they return on the agreed date. Our Term Time Tracker system, for

example, logs all holiday applications on to the system, then the system checks each day whether each child has returned on the agreed date. reduce absenteeism it is imperative that parents of truants are contacted on the first day of absence. All schools need a systematic way of notifying parents when their child is absent from school, irrespective of whether a member of

now been able to resolve this and when the new service commences we will be using a new local rate number of 01388 825429 which means there will only be a local rate charge".

Chairman CAB Vince said "Whenever Crosby an organisation makes a significant change to its working practices, an element of training is required. We currently only operate our telephone service a few hours a week with a limited number of staff but from April this will become a 5 day a week service so a large number of staff need training. With this in mind, the trustee

board have decided to close the service's main bureaux in Spennymoor and Aycliffe after Wednesday 28th March until Wednesday 4th April to have the additional equipment installed and ensure that staff are fully trained on the new processes and ready to deal with client enquiries when we reopen on 5th April". Funding cuts and difficult

economic times are hitting almost everyone and we have to ensure we continue to help as many as we can whilst providing a service on a significantly reduced income. We have had local 'in kind' help from a number of Town and Parish Councils over the years and appreciate that not all are able to meet our request to continue to directly fund their outreach sessions. However, there is hope for some of the outreaches that were destined to close as local funders have come forward. These details will be

publicised once confirmed. Helping clients resolve their issues is still our primary aim and whilst they might have to access the service differently now with less face to face help, there is in fact more hours of help available due to the telephone gateway.
