



We note the letter from G Gray re the Elmfield School A group have been looking at the possibilities for this site for some years. We are producing proposals which would meet the needs of all sections of the community and which would be sustainable.

Developing any plans which would meet need and sustainability cannot be plucked out of the air. To that end we will be consulting the community to look at need and possibility and see what the people want, not what one or two individuals think the people want or need.

There could be various options for the site: Housing, mixed housing, housing plus community facility, community garden plus community facility etc.

It is important we consider the needs of ALL sections of our community - young people, old, young mothers and the need for affordable nursery, and child care, affordable homes, social housing. We are listening to what people would like to see, and if we can produce something on this site for ALL.

Deliverability of course is another factor and having a wish list (including housing) doesn't mean that it will happen without robust business planning.
The Localism Bill also

provides new opportunities. including 'Neighbourhood Development Orders'.

This allows a local community group (not just a parish or town council)

to bring forward a small development (i.e. small in comparison to the size of the settlement) which might include proposals for new homes, business premises and or community facilities. Such developments don't take place without careful evidence based proposals. 

VEHICLE EDUCATION PROJECT AT YOUTH CENTRE

Aycliffe Youth Development Team has gained Home Office Funding from Community Action Against Crime Innovation Fund, to develop and deliver a two year vehicle education project for young people, aged 14-25 years.
The Project is called "First

Gear and On Two wheels" and was designed to address a local need, which was supported by evidence from different agencies, of high levels of anti-social and risk taking behaviours being demonstrated around the town, in car parks and residential areas.

The programme aims to educate young people about responsible car and motorbike use and ownership. The project encourages young project encourages

people to develop a positive attitude towards the use of motor vehicles.

Young people are challenged to examine their attitudes to owning and driving vehicles and are provided with the skills to become safe and responsible drivers, riders, passengers and owners of vehicles.



A Newtonian Pioneer Remembers the Old Days



Dear Sir.

hope you find the photographs taken in the 50's of interest - it would be wonderful to find out the names of the people and children - and to hear where they are now.

One is a picture of Newton Aycliffe Junior St John's Ambulance Brigade, taken outside Clarence Hall, now demolished. The brigade met in the upstairs room. The leader of our group (far right back row) was Mrs Foulger who lived in Greathead Crescent.

She had a daughter, Brenda and son, David who were also in the brigade but are not shown in this photograph. Some of the people in the photograph are Jennifer Lishman, Pat Ingram (me), Sheila Clubly Pam Cain, and Sandra.

I wish I could remember more names, and of course most are family names and will have changed due to marriage.

The second picture was taken around 1954 at a sports event held in Newton Avcliffe, attended by Lord

and Lady Beveridge seen here with the children of the new town. My brother, Philip Ingram is in the front row, third child to the right of Lady Beveridge who lived in Bede Crescent when they visited the Town. I moved here at the age of six in in 1952 and I have lived here all my life. My parents were here from 1952 until their deaths in 2000 and 2004.

My mum was an Avcliffe Angel and my dad worked in Chilton and Middridge pits before moving to Dorman Long and later Tolledo Woodhead Springs, both factories on Aycliffe Trading Estate.

daughter was born and bred on the town but is very disappointed how the town has developed. She sees it now as just a sprawling housing estate with no heart. Like so many early Newtonians we had aspirations that Newton Aycliffe would become a beautiful garden town, with wonderful facilities for young and old alike.

We've seen schools come and go and the state of the town centre is very sad. Except for the fairly new fitness suite the Leisure Centre always has a rundown and rather scruffy look about it compared with the clean, beautiful swimming pools and sports halls in nearby towns.

I live in Washington

Crescent nowadays, but I spent my childhood growing up in Surtees Walk, Happy days - green fields, new buildings, new roads, new people - Sugar Hill Farm, Simpasture Hill Farm, Woodham Farm - all to change - to build a new town for the people and families moving here from all over the country, to work in the new factories bringing prosperity to the area. I hope one day the town can have the pride in itself it's people once hoped




