



"We have spent some of the money on delivering cognitive therapy sessions to people with Parkinson's and on providing sports and activity days, where they could try out things they may not have tried before, explained Jill.

"It was then agreed that we should invest some money in something big, a real event, that would not only generate more funds but also raise awareness of Parkinson's among the wider public; kind of speculating to ccumulate.

The Sixties concert theme came after Jill met Dave Berry at one of his gigs in the region. "He has helped us pull this group of performers together at charity rates for no other reason than he met me and was appalled and shocked to know

how this disease can affect so many people, young, attractive, spirited people, not just the very old, as most people with Parkinson's are depicted. A cure for Parkinson's does not seem to be too far away. With the generosity of people in the North East we can do a lot towards supporting those who are dealing with the disease every day." said Jill.

Fellow organisers Ken Booth and Lynn Tearse, of Newcastle met at a support group. Ken, 54, has lived with the

condition for 23 years while Lynn was diagnosed three years ago and they think the concert is a fantastic idea and to fill the Sage.



# REPORT FROM GREAT AYCLIFFE RESIDENTS ASSOCIATION

At a recent Committee Meeting of the Association various topical subjects were raised prompting contact with the various authorities to clarify the situation prior to calling Public Meetings to give residents the opportunity to air their views.

TOWN LITTER PROBLEM

Vice Chairman Fr. Michael Campion raised the continuing problems with litter especially in areas where children walk to school and drop their rubbish – there is a litter trail between the two senior schools and the shops. Counc. Bob Fleming explained that there is a Town Pride Team who go to a different part of the town each morning to pick litter.

Syd Howarth suggested inviting Tesco to send a representative to a Committee meeting to discuss litter coming from their store. Don Fraser referred to the Environmental Protection Act of 1990 which gives a complete guide of what should be done and what must be done by law with regard to litter.

He said that this had not been enforced since the District Councils went out of business, but it was the responsibility of the Council Council to enforce the law. He explained that if the bodies have a duty under law then schools also have a duty under law to pick up their litter, but he did say there should be a period of notice given to warn parents that fines will be imposed if children drop litter. The Council should also be doing their job under the law. Ken Robson reported the Acorn Residents Group volunteer to collect litter in their

# FUTURE OF POLICE STATION AND POLICING IN GREAT

Ken Robson raised the question of the future of the police station in the town centre. Chairman Syd Howarth said the Town Council have this under constant review and the Police Authjority are in contact and present regular reports on the effectiveness of new policing

operations.

Bob Fleming explained that there had been no decision made about the personally fellowed by the personal pe the police station in Newton Aycliffe yet, although he, personally, felt that the old station will be demolished. The police are in industrial premises on the Business Park at the moment and hold meetings in various parts of the town. They say they have no complaints from the public about this. The police are looking at other police stations in the area to provide with cells manned 24 hours.

Fr. Michael recognised there was a strong feeling amongst residents that there should be a police presence in the town centre. He suggested it is time for us to have a petition to say we want a police station in the town centre and it is because individuals think they cannot do anything about the situation they say nothing. The building does not have to be as big but we do need a point of call for the general public. It was agreed to send formal letter to GATC asking them, on behalf of GARA, if they would join us in a joint petition, inviting the public so call for a police station to be located in the town centre SOCIAL HOUSING NEEDS

Don Fraser referred to Livin as a private housing company in their own right who are not accountable to an elected Board as the members are now appointed by Livin. Don expressed his concern about the way Livin allocate council housing in Newton Aycliffe.

Anybody can apply for a house in Newton Ayeliffe and bid for it, and they don't have to live in the town. This is a government directive, not necessarily Livin. Because of the allocations policy, second generation Newtonians are having to go outside the town for social housing, e.g., Chilton and Shildon, and this is splitting families, some who need to be near relatives. He thought we should invite a representative from Livin to come to one of our meetings to discuss the toric and procedure.

the topic and press for change. Bob Fleming said we should invite Livin to discuss the Town's Neighbourhood Plan. He said that social housing is a massive problem in Newton Aycliffe. The last social housing built by a

Council was in 1973 at Agnew.

The problem is that all those people who came to Newton Aycliffe as young people are old people now. There are many people living in 3 bedroom houses who would be more than willing to live in a bungalow but there are no bungalows available.

Ken Robson mentioned the Welfare Bill whereby people between

the ages of 18-64 with an empty room in their house will have to pay extra rent for that room. There are areas on the town that could be identified for social housing under the Neighbourhood Plan and we


need to speak to Livin to explain their future policy.

# A Parent's Complaint

In February 2012 I made enquiries to hold my daughter's birthday party at Woodham Community Centre, dates and times had been negotiated, then when asked the age of my daughter, (13) I was informed the committee don't allow teenage parties from a decision taken 8

years ago.
I raised my objections and thought this was unfair that the centre does not promote events as it suggests on its web site for teenage children. The main reason given was that they relied on committee members as key holders to open and lock up the facility, and they also had to take into consideration local residents. After some communication I was finally informed the

Woodham Community Centres committee members had discussed my enquiry and had come to the conclusion that they would not permit the party to take place. It was suggested I try the Sports Complex or the Leisure Centre.

My family and I have an affiliation with Woodham having lived in the area for the last 30 years, both my children attended pre school there, and cubs and scouts before the scouts moved to Bluebell Scout Cetnre. As a family we also attended Ballroom dancing classes.

Woodham Community centre as the name implies should be open to everyone in the community, and is not just a private club for use by committee members as and when it suits. It is all well and good, those members of the committee suggesting to me to go to another venue but it is an excellent facility to be used by everyone in the community. The local residents there is a pub, restaurant and three take away food shops, so what impact could a three hour party have compared to these

permanent businesses?
Because the con the committee dragged their feet on the decision we looked for another venue, and to keep the event in the Woodham area approached the Agnew Community Centre allow teenage parties. The venue was superb - all for a very reasonable hourly fee. My daughter had forty friends at her party all from Greenfield School who had a fantastic night and I am proud to say these young teenagers were very well behaved. I wish to thank Secretary Ron Mitchie for the service Agnew Centre



# Labour's Regulation of the **Economy Was at Fault**

Dear Sir, I was bemused to read J.D. Clare's letter headed Government Actively Destroying the North East". Only two years into the Coalition Government's term of office, does he really think the local electorate have such a short memory?

Can he not remember that when New Labour was elected they announced that, for the first two years in government, they would follow the previous Conservative Government's spending plans?

Unfortunately, the outgoing Labour Chancellor did not leave the Coalition Government a similar, stable economy. Blame the banks if you want Councillor Clare: but it was the duty of the Labour Government to properly regulate the country's economy and financial institutions. I blame the previous Chancellor of the Exchequer, Gordon Brown

Councillor Clare's diatribe ignores the cause of the dire economic situation the Coalition Government attempting to address and appears to suggest that the solution is to replace the current Coalition Government with a government by the party which oversaw the collapse of the banks and our

economy. New Labour had almost 10 years to address the perceived North-South divide, but, despite the fact that most of the north MPs were New Labour and the Prime Minister was Sedgefield's MP, they made not one iota of difference. Instead they introduced tax credits and benefits to buy northern votes to ensure the continued support of the northern voters, regardless of their failures.

37% of the people in Newton Aycliffe are "workless" as a consequence of 10 years of Labour Government policies, or lack of effective policies. Life expectancy in the North East is unlikely to have improved in two years of Coalition Government when New Labour DID NOT improve it in ten years.

introduction of the minimum wage turned the North East into a low wage economy which suited New Labour as they could topup wages with tax credits thereby buying votes with taxpayer's money. Better still, instead of providing jobs in the North East, they gave benefits, ensuring that voters would not dare vote for a party that believes that those fit to work would be better served working.

I share Councillor Clare's fears for the future of the North East given the dire straits New Labour left the economy in. However, I cannot accept his 'headline' and his insinuation that it is the Coalition's policy to destroy the North East. The Coalition Government has allowed the train building project to be located on our trading estate. They would not have lost any votes if they had decided on locating it in a Conservative constituency in the south, as they could so easily have done.

Also, the New Labour Durham County Council has decided to forego the Coalition Government financial support continuing weekly rubbish collection. That is, when the Coalition offers money New Labour turn it down!

As I was born in Scotland appreciated Councillor Clare's reference to the successes of the devolved Scottish Government in new industries.

Prior to the rise of the SNP the majority of Scottish MPs were (Old) Labour and despite being in a majority still went to the 'Westminster Village' for handouts. Scotland has shaken off this Labour belief in rights without duty and is now competing on a level playing

When I first came to live in the North East I considered asking the SNP to put up candidates in the North East to challenge the Labour stranglehold which has been to the detriment of the North East for decades.
