# **AYCLIFFE GROUP'S** SPONSORED PEDAL TO END HUMAN TRAFFICKING IN UK

Four members from a local group, ACTFORJUSTICE group, ACTFORJUSTICE took a stand against human trafficking in Britain by tackling an exhausting cycle as they pedaled for 6 hours to raise money for the national charity they fundraise for; Hope for Justice, who are striving to eradicate human trafficking in the UK.

Thepedalers ranging in age from 35-60 years are all members of the Newton Aycliffe based ACTFORJUSTICE group, which is part of a network of ACTFORJUSTICE fundraising groups the charity Hope for Justice has set up across the country. As part of their annual community activities and events for the charity they carried out the challenge on the 20th of May, and raised £900 to help provide much needed funds. The charity who use specially trained investigators to rescue victims of human trafficking, have seen dozens of people rescued after years of abuse at the hands of traffickers.

the hands of traffickers. Most people think victims are only trafficked into London and big cities but we understand from Hope for Justice that there are people trafficked for sex and slavery in nearly every town and city in the UK, including our varion. Shockingly some as region. Shockingly, some as young as three years old! Julie Sutherland one of the leaders of the group explained; "As a group we feel strongly that we needed to do something to help prevent this, not just around the country but on our own doorstep and we're trying to raise as much money as we

can, so we can help Hope for Justice fund more investigators to rescue more girls." # **REPORT ON COUNCIL MEETING** WEDNESDAY 21st MAY

Councillor R S Fleming has donated a trophy to be known as the 'Angela Fleming Memorial Trophy' for the best allotment garden at St Oswald's allotment site. Cllr Angela Fleming served the town with great distinction, not least as its Mayor in 1998-99, and Councillors unanimously approved the suggestion.

There were other less laudable environmental matters for Councillors to consider. We are suffering continual thefts of ornaments from graves at West Cemetery, and we have also had someone dumping garden waste, and two youths hunting with an airgun, at the School Aveliffe Wetlands.

Both of these are unpleasant matters, and if anyone has any information, the Council would be very happy to pass it on to the Police. Recently, the graveyard thief was disturbed, and a number of stolen items were recovered, which are currently at the Town Council's School Aycliffe offices waiting to be claimed.

Recreation the On Committee, Councillors heard that a substantial amount of work needs to be done at the Oak Leaf Sports Complex - including routine planned work on redecoration and lighting, but also repairs to a broken drain. Anybody who has suffered being

sand-blasted on a windy day at the Great Aycliffe Show will be delighted to hear that Councillors also voted to tarmac over the 'running track' on the Complex fields. A difficult decision was taken regarding the fairground attractions at the Fireworks Display. There were complaints this year that music from the larger rides had spoiled the music which accompanied the fireworks display itself, and also that - after most people had gone home – Police had to be called to deal with a number of unpleasant incidents involving youths who had stayed on at the fairground attractions. Councillors felt that the





ground-breaking event." Fostering manager Lynne Brown said she organised the day after teenager Amy Bain from Hartlepool sent her a poem she had opted to study at school. "She said it reflected how she felt about the foster children in her home, moving on to adoption," said Lynne.

"I decided we needed to honour the crucial role that children and young people play within fostering households and to give them an opportunity to talk about how they feel. We intend doing something similar every year from now on.





Children from Byerley Park will be representing the school, town and County Durham as they form part of the Guard of Honour for the Olympic Athletes as they parade from the Athletes Village to the Olympic Stadium for the Opening Ceremony of the Olympic Games


