Over 15,000 people turned out on Sunday 17th June to welcome the Olympic Torch Parade through Newton Aycliffe. The route from Burn Lane down through Central Avenue and along St. Cuthberts Way was Way was with excited crowded onlookers determined to witness the rare event and record its appearance on

digital cameras and mobile phones. It was a happy occasion with good natured policemen on motor bikes stirring up the crowd with sirens and hand waving. Supt Ian Macdonald of

Durham Constabulary said: "County Durham and Darlington gave a huge welcome to the Olympic Flame. The crowds were good natured, everything went well from our point of view and the thousands who turned up to see the torch relay had a great time. Our thanks go to all concerned." There were cheers for the torch carriers and gleeful smiles throughout the fifty minute tour of the town.

Hair & Beauty Day

A hairdressing salon's free hair and beauty treatment day has raised more than £600 for specialist equipment for a youngster with an incurable degenerative disease. Lecturers and students at

Bishop Auckland College held the event on Wednesday at the salon at the Woodhouse Lane campus to help the Kyran Richmond appeal. Kyran, 9, from Chilton, suffers from Juvenile Batten

Disease, a rare genetic metabolic neurodegenerative condition which has left him with little vision in one eye and inevitable blindness. He also suffers from night seizures and will develop epilepsy, lose the ability to walk, talk and eat, before developing dementia and symptoms similar to Parkinsons. His life expectancy is late teens/early 20s. Kyran is only the third person in the North East

to be diagnosed with the disease and there are only 150 confirmed sufferers

in the whole of the UK. Last September family and friends set up a fundraising team to raise awareness and much needed funds for both the charity and Kyran's ongoing needs.

College hairdressing lecturer Maria Tribley had the idea for the event to help the appeal after seeing a television broadcast about Kyran. More than 100 clients on the day donated cash in lieu of the usual charges for everything from shampoo and sets to mini facials, raising £600.43. Kyran's mum Debbie said:

"It has been a heartbreaking time for all of the family but the support and kindness of the local community has been overwhelming. A big thank you to Maria Tribley, staff, students and customers from Bishop Auckland College for organising the hair and beauty day and for being so generous with donations".

The money raised will be used to purchase specialist equipment for Kyran's new bedroom and will enrich his remaining years."





The Council agreed to enter into a licence agreement with Durham County Council to maintain certain plots of environmental land within the township owned by the County Council; GATC has been seeking this for a number of years, as it will allow us to apply a consistent environmental policy – and consistent standards of maintenance – across the whole town.

The Council also agreed to

continue its Market Licence agreement; this currently includes a significant financial reduction, in order to help the Market's viability. The Market is seen as a benefit to the town, and - although the Council is not allowed to subsidise it at all - Councillors wished to continue helping by reducing to the minimum possible the sum the Council takes from the

market stallholders. The government has issued a consultation on plans for the localisation of council tax benefit. The possibility in the proposed legislation that council tax benefit might not be passed on to the Town Council would not reduce people's Council Tax . . . but does threaten to reduce Town Council finances, potentially catastrophically.

Members agreed to respond to the consultation, requesting that any changes in the regulations might be made in such a way that no town or parish council is left

financially worse off. Councillors agreed to send the Town Clerk to attend a Great Avcliffe Residents' Association meeting about litter, to be held on Thursday 19th July at 7pm in St Mary's Church. By coincidence, members heard that the Town

Council's energetic Youth Council is undertaking a Town Pride litter-pick week at the town's primary schools on Monday to Friday, 9th-13th July - so congratulations to our young people on leading

the way.



I managed to get to the road junction by 9.45am and was allowed through the bollards blocking the road, however the girl who was working with me didn't arrive at the junction until 9.57am, and was told 'the race had started' and she wasn't allowed through. She had to leave her car at the cemetery and walk to the patient's home making her arrival time late. I thought the race started at Greenfield Comprehensive area? If this is the case it would be

a while until the runners arrived at the Stephenson Way junction, during which time this girl could have been allowed to drive through.

Even if the runners were already at the junction area, why wasn't she given some priority to be allowed through? It's not as if she was trying to get to Tesco for a loaf! The particular lady we were to visit is bedbound and had been in bed since 6pm the previous evening. This is only one incident, I know there will have been

others that morning. I am incensed that these people think they have to right to prioritise the use of the roads around town just so that they can indulge in a hobby!




