PLANNING APPLICATION FOR £32m WOODHAM DEVELOPMENT

Working on behalf of developers, Washington Developments, Newcastle-based planning consultants Nathaniel Lichfield and Partners have applied for planning permission for a £32.1m housing and leisure development at Woodham Golf and Country Club, on the north western edge of Newton

The redevelopment and improvement of the Club follows a lengthy public consultation which began last October and proposes a mixeduse development which would include improvements to the golf course, the construction of 50 executive family homes, a 75 bed, four star hotel with conference and spa facilities and extensive landscaping amongst which would be the re-establishment of Woodham Bridleway and new community footpaths.

The proposals, which have been developed in conjunction with Ryder Architects and Nathaniel Lichfield and Partners planning consultants, would create up to 300 initial construction jobs, secure the golf club's future and its 30 existing jobs with a further 90 permanent jobs at the hotel. Additionally, it is estimated that the new residents would spend some £736,000 per year in the local economy whilst the increase in visitor numbers could generate an additional £1.6m of tourism revenue per

The landscaping improvements which include the reestablishment of Woodham bridleway, the development of a new 2km pathway, the opening up of Agnew Plantation and the provision of new public open space and play areas will benefit the whole community. Members of the golf club will obviously enjoy the new clubhouse and improvements to the course which include new sustainable drainage measures that should prevent the frequent closures of the course which have occurred in the past.

Fuelling Discontent

With BP pushing up petrol prices toward £1.40p per litre people are calling for real action by the government

action by the government.

There is also a suggestion, gathering support, that we boycott BP Petrol Stations suggesting they would then have to reduce their ridiculous prices.

If everybody did this they would soon get the message and the motorist would then have control, not the greedy fuel barons who are clearly making huge profits. People tend to forget that only a few years ago you could fill your tank for around £20 - it is now over £60! We accept global demand is pushing prices up and the main cost to us is in fuel tax and the government need to address this, but it is BP making huge profits.

Last Wednesday's meeting was very important and interesting.

We gave a grant to an Aycliffe Thai Boxer who has been invited to represent his country in the Amateur World Championships in Thailand. Do readers realise that they can apply for a small grant to help local clubs or individuals? We were very pleased to be able to

were very pleased to be able to help him on his way. We had to make a difficult and sensitive decision about burial charges. The Town Council's burial fees are heavily subsidised for Aycliffe residents, but we charge the full cost to people living outside the town (i.e. those who do not pay Council Tax to the Council). A couple of cases recently, however, have highlighted that this can be unfair in the case of a second internment where an elderly resident has had to go

into residential care outside the parish. Members agreed to charge reduced burial fees where the deceased owned a grave and was a resident when the purchase was made, which will go some way to correct this. They also asked officers to investigate further ways to make sure the charging system is fair.

REPORT ON COUNCIL MEETING

WEDNESDAY 19th JANUARY

An important report outlined ways to update the Parish Plan. The Council is already a leader in 'community engagement', through its successful Customer Panels and Youth Council. However, we agreed that this year the Parish Planning process will also include a town-wide questionnaire, a stall at the Community Fair, focus groups, visits to a large number of local community groups and mini-consultations in each electoral ward. The Council genuinely wants to involve the public, so we hope these initiatives produce useful

responses.
As part of this desire to engage with the public, the next thing we considered was a new Council website. We all agreed that the existing website is no longer adequate to the task and, after discussion, members voted to accept a proposal by a firm called 'Urban River'. This carries a cost of £16,300, so members of the public may have something to say about it. Indeed, one Councillor argued very persuasively for a cheaper option, but Urban River is a top-quality firm (it runs the Tyne Tunnel website), and members decided that they wanted a top-quality website for Aycliffe.

Finally, members approved the Revenue and Capital Budgets for next year, 2011-12. The Council has been able to keep its promise to freeze Council Tax (indeed, there has been





This week the County

Council's Cabinet made final recommendations on the budget for 2011/12 to go forward to full council in February.

The recommendations include proposals that there will be no increase in council tax next year and explain how the authority has taken on board the views of the public to minimise the impact of the reduction in Government grants on frontline services

Durham faces unprecedented levels of reductions in Government support over the four year period covered by the Medium Term Financial Plan (MTFP). On December 13th last year the council received confirmation of its Provisional Finance Settlement for the next two years which confirmed both the scale of future grant reductions and their heavy front loading. In total, the council is forecasting the loss of £92.5m of Government grant over the MTFP period with £60.3m of that in 2011/12 – 2014/15. After taking into account

increased demand on services, for example from the ageing population, the council is required to achieve £67.1m of savings in 2011/12 and £125m of savings over the whole of the MTFP. This is the

equivalent of almost a third of the 2010/11 Net Revenue Expenditure Budget with a reduction of nearly 15 per cent required immediately.
During the MTFP process extensive consultation has been carried out. In total, more than 8,000 people either participated or responded to the consultation process



Dear Sir, I thank 'PC' for his letter and am delighted to comment on Great Aycliffe Town Council

allowances.
Town Councillors do not get an attendance or subsistence allowance for meetings – occasionally, where a meeting runs over tea-time, officers buy in a plate of sandwiches.

GATC Councillors do not get

expenses for functions within the parish boundaries. For meetings outside Aycliffe, they can claim petrol @ 40p a mile, and a living subsistence of up to £30 per day. But many Councillors forgo this – for instance, I have never claimed expenses for any Council activity I have attended. Last year, the total of all such expenses amounted

to £155.17.
What Town Councillors do get, is an allowance of £1059 a year. The actual amount is reviewed from time to time by

an independent body.
This allowance was introduced only in 2005, so I have to say that, for most of my time as a Town Councillor, we all did the job voluntarily. The allowance was a national initiative hoping to increase the number of people standing for local councils, and

to be fair it is certainly true that a large number of Independents stood for election in 2007. I am not suggesting that the only reason they stood was for the money. But the Council prior to that had been 100% Labour, and I am one of those proud to say that, before the allowance, we served the town for the town's sake, without financial gain.
As for reducing this allowance,

I do not agree in any circumstances with Councillors setting their own remuneration, either up or down. Reducing it would make marginal difference to the Council finances (it represents less than 2% of the net budget).

net budget).
My beef with the allowance system is not its size, but its inequity. Most Councillors attend frequently, and work hard for the community beyond that, for an hourly rate at which a paper boy would turn up his nose. The task of Leader, particularly, is onerous. But it is possible for an inactive Councillor to attend Full Council meetings only, for a maximum of eight meetings a year, and yet draw the same allowance, at a rate per meeting which is indefensible.





John said: "We knew about

Aycliffe's promising league position and the situation with the new stand and we were approached by a good friend of mine, Charlie Fielding, who's a trustee of the Sports Club.

"Charlie and I go back a lot of years and I know he's keen to see the Sports Club promote its sections' activities. He's calling on professional friendships from various old contacts of his to get this stand up and we wanted to do our bit.

"We're absolutely delighted the club have agreed to name the stand in memory of my father, who passed away in 1995. As a footballer himself.

he'd be very proud."
William Finley played for various clubs at Northern League level in the 1940's and 50's, including Black Hall, Lanchester, Bishop, Ushaw Moor, Brandon and Esh Winning Albion, winning 19 trophies. Martin Walker said: "Getting

the stand up before the March 31 deadline will help to relieve a major burden for the football club and will enable us to focus on trying to make sure we finish in the top three of the second division."

Aycliffe are also indebted to Tony Pepper, of Pepper Draughting, who is supplying the structural drawings for the stand free of charge.
