WOODHAM DEVELOPMENT TO INCLUDE NEW ROUNDABOUT

W A S H I N G T O N Developments' £32m development plan for Woodham Golf & Country Club will incorporate the provision of a new roundabout at Middridge Road and Burnhill Way.

At present, local residents have frequently complained about traffic speeds along the road which links the area to the Rushyford roundabout on the main A167 route, but the £32m development would include a new £300,000 roundabout which would incorporate the new entrance to both the golf club and proposed new hotel.

It was recommended that the existing roundabout should be upgraded and re-aligned; resulting in a safer junction, network improvements and better operational efficiency / capacity.

Jamie Murphy, Group Director at Washington Developments, commented. "At present, I've personally seen the speed traffic goes along Middridge Road with the boy racers just ignoring the present small roundabout on occasions. It's been a point that came over very clearly to us during the consultation period with local residents and was also raised at our recent presentation to Aycliffe Town Council, so is very much a matter of public concern."

"The new roundabout will not only curtail the use of Middridge Road as a 'rat run' into Aycliffe, but also produce a safe entrance into the development for both residents, local golfers...

and visitors to the hotel and leisure complex."

The planning application for the £32.1m housing and leisure development will go before South and West Durham Planning Committee in April. Washington Development's proposal includes improvements to the golf course, the construction of 50 executive family homes, a 75 bed, four star hotel with conference and spa facilities and extensive landscaping.

The proposal could also create up to 300 initial construction jobs, secure the golf club's future and its 30 existing jobs with a further 90 permanent jobs at the hotel. Additionally, it is estimated that the new residents would spend some £736,000 per year in the local economy whilst the increase in visitor numbers would generate an additional £1.6m of tourism revenue

Additional economic benefits to the local community would include the generation of almost £1m additional Council Tax contributions from the new homes and a financial contribution to the Council for the provision of social



Special Status for Rail Line

Rail passengers will now be able to get more involved in the running of their local line after it was awarded special status by the government.

The Bishop Auckland to Darlington branch line, known as the Bishop Line, which passes through Newton Aycliffe, has been formally designated as a community rail service by the Department of Transport.

The award marks a significant achievement for the Bishop Line Community Rail Partnership, which has been working for several years to improve train services and attract passengers.

The move means communities along the route will have a greater influence over how

the rail service operates. It also enables operator Northern Rail and its partners Durham County Council and Darlington Borough Council, working with the Bishop Line Community Rail Partnership, to bid for additional funding and means services can be more flexible.

Adrian White, Durham County Council's head of transport, said: "The Bishop Line provides a convenient and reliable rail link between Bishop Auckland and Darlington and is very popular with both commuters and tourists.

"The awarding of community rail line status is excellent news as it gives us the opportunity to secure extra funding and manage the



service so it better meets the needs not just of travellers but of local residents and businesses as well."

We are already seeing an increase in users, with a three per cent rise in passenger numbers during the past year.

Hopefully, this will further boost this figure."
The Bishop Line follows the route of the original Stockton to Darlington Railway and is one of the oldest passenger railway lines in the world.

As well as providing a vital service for commuters travelling to and from Darlington, it also provides access for tourists visiting the Pennines and offers a direct link to the Weardale Railway.

The community rail service designation follows the adoption by local groups of stations along the line at Bishop Auckland. Heighington and Shildon. Talks are also ongoing for the adoption of the station at Newton Aycliffe.

Adoption groups take part in a variety of activities including litter picking, provision and maintenance of hanging baskets and planters and dealing with graffiti and repair work.

The groups will themselves also be able to access funding for improvement schemes following the designation. David Lyonette, Darlington

Borough Council's Cabinet member for transport, said: "I am delighted the Bishop Line has been awarded community rail line status - this is a real credit to the many people who volunteer and work hard to keep their rail line, a lifeline for many, thriving.

REPORT ON COUNCIL MEETING **WEDNESDAY 26th JANUARY**

FULL COUNCIL
The Council agreed unanimously that, while a member is suspended, the Council will not pay the member's allowance.

The Council agreed to pursue an offer by Sedgefield Borough Homes to take over the land known as the 'Seven Hills' between Baliol Green and Palmer Road.

Members felt that this would safeguard the green space – we very much oppose 'infilling' green areas of the town with housing – and it will give the Council the opportunity to improve the area visually and ecologically.

Next, the Council was

interested to hear reports from a number of outside bodies. Tom Hunter, MYP, has become Chair of the Youth Council, which is currently working on a draft layout for the Great Aycliffe Show. The Citizens' Advice Bureau and the Durham Countryside Volunteers are amongst bodies worried about funding as a

result of government cuts. Finally, the meeting's most important decision concerned an outline planning application by the Woodham Golf and Country Club. Members heard a presentation by the Club, which described how the application included firm guarantees to deliver the whole package, and not just 'make and break' when the houses were built

The Council discussed the proposal. It involves the loss of green space at the edge of town, it pre-empts the Local Plan, and (as a member of the public argued in a question to the Council) it will place additional stress on the already-inadequate C35. On the other hand, members

were aware that the scheme would provide £32million of inward investment, create 70 new jobs (and safeguard 30 existing ones), generate tourism, provide much-needed executive housing, and give Aycliffe a quality hotel. In the end, the Council agreed (with one vote against) to support the application, with three

provisos that:



A meeting of Aycliffe Town Council has given almost unanimous support to a £32m development plan for nearby Woodham Golf & Country Club.

Owners, Washington Developments Ltd, applied for planning permission for a £32.1m housing and leisure development which would include improvements to the golf course, the construction of 50 executive family homes, a 75 bed, four star hotel with conference and spa facilities and extensive

landscaping.
The application, which will go before South and West Durham Planning Committee in April, is the result of an extensive consultation period with local residents and businesses and has been developed in conjunction with Newcastle-based planning consultants, Nathaniel Lichfield and Partners and Ryder Architects.

The proposals could create up to 300 initial construction jobs, secure the golf club's future and its 30 existing jobs with a further 90 permanent jobs at the hotel. Additionally, it is estimated that the new residents would spend some £736,000 per year in the local economy

whilst the increase in visitor numbers would generate an additional £1.6m of tourism revenue per year. At last Wednesday night's

meeting, following a presentation by Washington Developments and their Planning Consultants, 17 of the 18 councillors eligible to vote supported the proposal with only one vote against. Jamie Murphy, Group Director at Washington Developments, commented.

"We were pleased to have the opportunity to present the plans to the Town Council and answer the councillors' various questions as part of our ongoing community engagement work. The feedback received through this process has already helped to shape the proposals and the support of the Town Council will be a very positive step forward for the planning application."

"Woodham is an excellent golf course in a superb location but would benefit from investment both to the clubhouse and the grounds. Our proposal seeks to create a top class leisure facility which will be a part of the local community. There is no reason why an improved course here shouldn't attract high profile tournaments in the future without losing its community base. The new housing and hotel complex will not only secure the course's future viability but also generate additional income for the local economy.

Additional economic benefits to the local community would include the generation of almost £1m additional Council Tax contributions from the new homes and an agreed commuted sum of £350,000 payable to the Council for the provision of social housing.



EMA - ANOTHER BROKEN PROMISE BY TORIES

Recently, Parliament debated the Conservativeled Government's plans

to abolish Education Maintenance Allowance, or EMA. The allowance is paid to young people staying on into further education. If a family earns less than £20,800 the child attending college will receive £30 a week. Over 80% of learners receiving the allowance are from families on low income. The payment reduces to £10 and the number achieving qualifications have improved with increase retention rates amongst students.

This means we have a young workforce better qualified, with the potential to enter higher paid jobs. For this reason EMA programme pays for itself.

The Conservative led Government do not see it that way. Even though they said before the election they would not scrap EMAs that is exactly what they are doing now

Another broken promise, on the back of tuition fees rising to £9,000. I do not want to see young people dropping out of college because they cannot afford to stay on. The money, in a lot of cases is used to get to and from college. In a rural area like Durham that is exactly what most young people need, to travel to get to college.

Mr Cameron likes to say "we are all in this together" but from the actions of this Conservative-led government, which no one voted for, the reverse seems to be the truth.



REDWORTH HEALTH | Car Parking for Pease Way Medical's New Extension



The new build at Pease Way Medical Centre will be a great asset to Newton Aycliffe, however what do they propose to do about the car parking facilities at this busy site? Already the car park is over-spilling into the main road causing problems for traffic and pedestrians.

Bowes Road is full of cars that can't get into the car park and the residents there are complaining. What will happen when the new private Care Centre is opened and more people need to park there?

No doubt the extra staff will want their own car space too which will take more spaces away from the people who need them most - the old and infirm people who shouldn't have to walk to the doctors across a busy main road.

Car parking at Pease Way Medical Centre has always been a favoured topic of conversation.

But it has never been an area of contention with Planners.

The reason for this is we live in an environment where the use of private cars is not to be encouraged. We are all supposed to use public transport (service right outside our doors is excellent), walk or use a bicycle if we can. We have had to increase the number of cycle racks - but not the

car parking. This could also be because there are no parking restrictions on the streets around Pease Way - and of course there is quite a large amount of free parking just across the road in the public car park. Parking on the streets - if done correctly and sensibly - should cause no more traffic problems than the existing traffic calming and street parking does throughout the town already.

It may be important to remember that some GP surgeries have no private parking at all.

, We are aware of the need for disabled parking spaces - for the elderly and infirm - and these have been maintained in future plans.


The plans do include an additional 9 car parking spaces - an increase of 25% and of course the car park is restricted in size at the present time by builders cabins and compound.

The GP Partners and

myself carefully considered the matter of car parking right from the time we first decided to expand the building. However space is limited and the choice was either more space within the surgery or a reduction in the amount of additional space in favour of more car parking. The decision was not difficult when land in the centre of Newton Aycliffe is both expensive and scarce. We did monitor the use of the existing car park over a 3 month period. Yes there are "peak periods" and certain days (patients seem to like to park on a Tuesday and then visit the town market without moving their car) - but for a lot of the time there are vacant car parking spaces. One last thing to mention the new build is taking place to provide better facilities for patients and existing employees. We have no plans to increase our workforce. The new build is progressing well after delays (5 weeks

lost) due the bad weather before Christmas. We're almost ready to add the roof and then the windows and doors to make the building waterproof, secure and safe. We hope to be completed in June as long as it doesn't snow again over the next couple of weeks! Regards

Cold Weather Kills Nature Pond Fish

Rumours are circulating in the town that the Nature Park Pond has been polluted as many regular users of the site have seen a high number of dead fish and amphibians floating in the water over the past few weeks. While this has been an

alarming and an unpleasant sight it is thought they have not been polluted but have died naturally because of the recent cold weather.

As the pond was heavily frozen for several weeks natural toxins build up as they cannot escape through the ice and much needed oxygen levels were depleted due to the number of fish which were living in the

pond. This has resulted in the death of many fish and amphibians which were living and hibernating in the mud at the bottom of the water.

The Environment Agency have been consulted on this matter and confirm this has been a particularly common problem in many ponds

throughout the country. An oily film may naturally develop on the water surface over the coming weeks as the remaining casualties decompose at the bottom of the pond - this is a natural process and nothing to get alarmed about.

However, if residents are concerned that newly dead fish are being discovered they are advised to contact Great Aycliffe Town Council's Environment Officer on 01325 300700 or contact the Environment Agency on 08708 506 506

Operatives from Great Aycliffe Town Council have been monitoring the pond on a regular basis and removing any dead animals as they have floated to the surface.

I hope this has reassured concerned residents about the safety of the water at the Nature Park.
