WE MUST PROTECT THE NHS

Thanks to the Lib Dems support for the Tories, the coalition is planning to turn the NHS over to a plethora of private companies who either commission or provide services, or both. The idea that competition breeds excellence and market forces make everything more efficient is a myth.

Theoretically the bill sets out just how everything should function. But almost nobody except Andrew Lansley and a few around him, quite believes that they will. Certainly most doctors don't; the BMA and the independent King's Fund certainly don't, and so far as I can judge nor do most of the MP's including Tory and Lib Dems.

Even the Health Select Committee, which is chaired by a former Tory Health Secretary, Stephen Dorrell, has strong doubts. The scope and complexity of the bill is immense, and it will have a significant impact on NHS services, its workforce and public

Apart from the threat of piecemeal privatisation, there seems to be no clarification on what happens if GP's run out of money before the end of the financial year. What happens if GPs will not refer patients to the hospital

of their choice because of cost? If a patient is referred to the cheapest provider on financial consideration, will he/she get the best treatment? If hospitals cannot attract "business" from GPs, will they be privatised? How will the conflict of GPs – who are both providers and purchasers – be managed, and what impact might this have on their local hospital?

The legislation proposes a market-based approach that must involve competition between "any willing providers". This supposes that GP consortia would be able to favour their local provider and build excellent local services. The consortia of GPs established to spend £80 billion on commissioning will become rationing committees, choosing which services should be cut and which groups of patients should lose out. Patients' lives are about to rest on the bottom line of the GP's budget.

There is likely to be intolerable pressure on clinicians to dilute their needs-led approach to patient care and instead consider all manner of economic and other factors. Patients should be worried, because GP practices are not set up to do this. They

are clinical enterprises, not businesses.

At the heart of the Lib Dem/Tory agenda may be the complete privatisation of the NHS – a process that has deep roots in Thatcherite ideology. We may be witnessing the end of the NHS as a publicly provided, publicly financed

We are moving away from the traditional health service to one ruled by bogus choice, private health insurance, competition, market forces and supplier diversity. Like the USA and in this sort of health service the chronically and terminally ill, the mentally ill, those from lower socioeconomic groups and the elderly are likely to lose out.

This legislation is the NHS equivalent of the poll tax. We need to resist the introduction of enforced competition, competitive pricing and the imposition of foundation trust status on all hospitals. Ploughing ahead with these changes as they stand, at such speed, is an enormous and costly risk at a time of huge financial pressure.

financial pressure.
For the first time the entire NHS has been put under competition law. The financial and clinical safety of NHS foundation trusts used to

regulator, Monitor. Now its website proclaims: "The first of Monitor's three core functions is to promote competition." That means "enforcing competition law" and "removing anticompetitive behaviour". Few yet understand the nuclear nature of this. It compels every NHS activity to be privately tendered. If the NHS is the preferred provider, that can be challenged in the courts or referred to the Competition

Commission.
This makes NHS contracts subject to EU competition law. The NHS was exempt as an essentially state-run service, but GP consortiums will no longer be allowed to use a trusted local hospital without tendering first, for fear that a private company could take them to court. Some global companies will happily run loss-leader services for a while, driving NHS services to close, and no doubt raising their own prices later.

There are some things which will never be totally cost effective, but which you have to do if you wish to consider yourself a civilised society. The NHS is one of them. What do you think. What do our local GPs think?

Why You Should Say No to AV



1. AV IS OBSCURE: Only three countries in the world use AV for their national elections: Fiji, Australia, and Papua New Guinea

2. AV IS UNFAIR: Supporters of fringe parties can end up having their vote counted five or six times and potentially decide the outcome of the election while people who backed the mainstream candidates only get one vote.

3. AV IS UNEQUAL: AV treats someone's fifth or sixth choice as having the same importance as someone's else's first preference - but there is a big difference between positively wanting one candidate to win and being able to 'put up with' another.

4. AV IS 'EVEN LESS PROPORTIONAL' THAN THE CURRENT SYSTEM: So concluded the independent Royal Commission chaired by the senior Liberal Democrat Roy Jenkins in 1998.

5. AV IS 'DISTURBINGLY UNPREDICTABLE' another warning from Roy Jenkins. Elections fought under AV would either wildly increase the majority of the winning party (e.g. Labour in 1997, the Tories in the 1980s) or create hung parliaments by giving the balance of power to the

third party.
6. AV IS NOT WANTED
– EVEN BY THE YES CAMPAIGN: Before the general election, Nick Clegg described AV as "a miserable little compromise" and the Electoral Reform Society said they did "not regard it as suitable for the election of a representative body, e.g. a parliament".

7. AV IS NO-ONE'S FIRST CHOICE: AV was not in the manifestos of either the Conservative Party or the Liberal Democrats. Many people who want voting reform have spent years campaigning for proportional representation - which AV is not.

8. AV IS COMPLEX: The Government will have to spend millions of pounds explaining to voters how AV works to prevent a fall

in turnout at elections. In Australia, the only reason they have high turnout is because they made voting

compulsory.

9. AV IS EXPENSIVE:
Under AV we won't be able to count ballot papers by hand on election night if we want a guick, decisive election result. Local councils might have to purchase electronic counting machines that are very expensive and prone to

malfunction.

10. AV IS NOT THE REFORM WE NEED: There are lots of genuine reforms which would go some way to restoring people's trust in politics – but changing our voting system to AV is not one of them. 11. If the result of the AV

referendum vote is NO then the Lib-Dem's main justification for going into a coalition with the Tories is lost, and they lose ALL credibility .. end of Lib Dems. They supported

the Tories on Tuition fees rise and privatising the NHS. Cutting the deficit deeper and quicker than necessary, closing Libraries and cutting local services, working longer before getting pensions, bring the Coalition down Vote No to AV.
