Aycliffe Community Bank Now Open





Mayor Mary Dalton Joins Credit Union

In an aim to stamp out loan sharks Durham County Council along with sponsors and local volunteers have opened a Credit Union Bank in Newton Aycliffe.

The formal opening was conducted by County Council Chairman Dennis Morgan in the Library this week and already a large number of Newtonians have signed up as members.

The community bank is a savings and loan co-operative run by the members, but to obtain a loan you must first join and start to save. It can be as much as you want and loans are then given on application at very low interest rates. Savers receive a dividend each year on the

amount they save.

Anyone over 16 can become a member by producing documents proving their name, address and date of birth and paying a £1 membership fee.

The bank opensevery Tuesday at 11am in the Community Room at the Public Library. Volunteers will be on hand to give you more details on how the scheme works. Once you have joined you can make deposits there or at any Post Office. Churches in the town run similar schemes and Newtonians are encouraged to join the bank rather than be forced to borrow from loan sharks later at an extortionate


Be Qualified to Babysit

Bogus traders prey on the elderly and vulnerable in particular who are more likely to be the victim of a doorstep crime.

Joanne Waller, head of the environment, health and consumer protection with the council, offers the following advice: "When you are planning on getting any work done around the house you should always try and obtain quotes from three different traders. We would also encourage people to ask traders for references for extra piece of mind.

Electricity from Wind Turbines Costs Double

Since my letter about wind turbines in the Newton News a fortnight ago, a number of people have approached me to say how much they like and support wind farms.

I can only think that they have not yet realised that they pay more than twice as much for electricity from wind turbines as from traditional power-stations.

is a major concern. As the economy falters and benefits are cut, we are all 'feeling the pinch'. One of our greatest problems is that we cannot do without electricity, yet fuel and heating prices are going 'through the roof'. Do people realise that every turbine more than doubles the price they pay for the electricity it produces? Basically, on top of the £45 per megawatt of electricity from wind power, we consumers ALSO pay a subsidy of £50. So the government's target for renewable power for this year, at 11%, would require us, the consumers, to pay about 12.5% (an eighth) extra for our electricity.

And do the supporters of wind farms realise that it is not WE in the north-east who need the electricity? All the electricity the turbines produce is immediately sent south, to the energy-guzzling south-east.
And do those people who

say they like wind turbines and want an 80 metre-high windmill across the road realise that the block of land designated for the wind farm stretches from Rushyford to Sedgefield, and south to beyond Preston-le-Skerne?

early proposal and let me have

come along all too fast.

If wind turbines were the ONLY solution to global warming, we would have to swallow them as a necessary evil. But wind turbines are NOT the solution. They produce small amounts of unreliable electricity, and make little if any difference to the CO2. A wind turbine delays global warming by 2 seconds

People have said to me: 'Don't you care about our children?'

Yes I do. Wind turbines only have a working life of about 25 years, after which someone is going to have to decommission them, and spend £billions AGAIN to replace them. Wind turbines are merely an expensive temporary stop-gap.

What wind turbines DO achieve is to allow the government to claim it is doing something, whilst its big-business friends grow rich, and the subsidy is arranged in such a way that we, the consumers, pay it, not the government. Everybody benefits ... except

Care Home for Heighington?

One of the many duties that I feel is important for all Borough Councillors is to look at areas and facilities which would improve the lives of residents. These 'projects' can take years to come to fruition. They are a result of listening to Parish Councillors, residents and using my own experiences of living in the Ward. I feel that I have been successful with many 'Projects' but accept that a few have gone by the way side through no fault of trying. Those that came good, including the Sports Field, the School Traffic Charter, Lay-bys in Hopelands, the tarmacing of the Courtine, the 40mph Speed restrictions in Redworth and later School Aycliffe and many more all took a long time to accomplish but I feel that the effort was well worth it. From time to time I have been

asked about the possibility of having a Care Home built in Heighington. After all, there was some support for one as demonstrated in our Parish Plan. 20.8% of all respondents said they saw a need for a nursing home and given our demography this suggests that there is a sufficient interest for the subject to be pursued.

I have already received some positive responses and having brought the matter up at a recent Parish Council Meeting I am delighted to confirm that they have not objected to the proposal at this early stage. Obviously there would be large mountains to climb such as land availability. Planning Approval, and sourcing a service provider but I first need to find out if the interest shown four years ago still is valid

Obviously it is a subject closer to the hearts of the elderly. Moving out of the village into a Care Home in Darlington or Newton Aycliffe is not an easy decision to make. Old friends are left behind and because of age, infirmity or simply lack of transport it is difficult and often impossible for friends to visit leaving those who have to move away from the village, feeling isolated, sad and in many cases depressed. So the idea of a Care Home in Heighington could appeal to lots of people for many reasons.

There could be many problems to deal with – objectors, land availability, planning restrictions, and a developer to name a few, but in the first instance I would appreciate feed back on the idea of a Care Home in Heighington.


