Economic growth is paramount, and it has to come before ANY

WHERE DOES AYCLIFFE FIT IN THIS PLAN?

In the original draft Plan, last year, Aycliffe was not even I complained loudly about this, and – if you read the new Plan - you might be persuaded to think that the County Council has listened. Aycliffe is now listed as a 'key employment location'. Its position on the A1 corridor is counted as 'capable of attracting employment of national significance'. Finally, the Plan states that: 'Given the site's importance to the Plan it is proposed to identify the site as strategic.'

When you come to look at what that means in practical terms, however, it is less acceptable. Despite the map's title: 'Strategic Extension to Aycliffe Industrial Estate', NO extra land has been allocated to economic growth in Aycliffe. In fact no extra land has

been allocated for Aycliffe's industrial area since 1996. And although the Plan claims that 103 hectares of 'employment land' exists in Aycliffe, in fact 21ha of that land has already been used for the Hitachi factory development.

That leaves just 80 hectares of land which the County Council is proposing will suffice for economic growth in this area for the next twenty years. Thus we have a County Plan for economic growth which envisages the Aycliffe industrial area as growing at just 4 hectares a year. (A hectare is exactly the size of a football pitch.)

IS THIS GOOD ENOUGH FOR YOU?

It isn't good enough for me! It may well be that the County Council is so incompetent that, despite the 'strategic' significance of Aycliffe, it will only manage to attract enough industry to Aycliffe to fill four football pitches a year. But can we not hope? What if DCC does its job properly and gets our industry zinging! The County Plan needs to allocate land for the growth that MAY happen.

LET'S BE

ASPIRATIONAL!!

I think we need MUCH more land allocating than this. Aycliffe's position on the road and rail network makes it perfect as a centre for warehousing for the whole north-east region. We ought to be able to attract these companies, but they will need space, and our 82 remaining hectares will disappear very quickly if somebody does their job right at County Hall.

(You know, it is almost as if

Aycliffe was being consciously downplayed in order to buff up the County's originallyidentified centre-for-growth at Aykley Heads.)

SHOULD WE COMPLAIN? It is vital that we lobby the County Council and the County Councillors vigorously about this. The County Plan SAYS good things about Aycliffe's economic potential but actually it is A PLAN FOR STAGNATION in our town. This is bad news for us, because it means fewer jobs. less wealth and more outward migration.

What the County Council has to be made to understand, moreover, is that it is also bad news for County Durham.

I want to put an image in your mind. Occasionally I water the garden using a hose with a sprinkler nozzle at the end. There is plenty of waterpressure in the hose, but unless I open the nozzle to full the spray doesn't reach the whole garden.

Avcliffe is exactly the same. It sits at the south-east corner of the County, on the A1 corridor. at the end of a massive supplyline of trucks, trains, goods and services. But unless the Aycliffe economy is turned up to full, that economic flow will not be dispersed through the county - it will simply pass on through to Newcastle.

The Plan recognises this is true for tourism – why have the planners not realised it is just as true for goods and services! This is not an Aycliffe attempt to steal others' prosperity! Growth in Aycliffe will not preclude growth at Aykley Heads – the two places will attract utterly different types

of business. What the planners must be made to see is that, if the warehousing/industry site at Avcliffe is stifled, the office/ executive potential of Aykley Heads will be damaged.

We are fighting here for the prosperity of our County, not just our town

THE NEED FOR A VISION

It will be said that it is hard to plan for the growth of Aycliffe Industrial Estate, because much of the land lies outside County Durham, in Darlington authority.
That should not be a problem.

When it comes to the environment, the Plan boasts how it has agreements with neighbouring authorities to encourage cooperation and biodiversity.

So, if they can do it for the environment, HOW MUCH MORE IMPORTANT IS IT that they manage to cooperate with neighbouring authorities over the economy!

As we look forward to the next 20 years for our town and our County, we need planners with vision, who can envisage Aycliffe as an industrial and warehousing hub for the entire servicing and north-east, stimulating the economy of the entire region. And we need the Plan to allocate the land to deliver that vision.

Having worked at Aycliffe Hospital, during the early 1970s, I was puzzled to learn that it was situated 'near Sedgefield' (re: reports on the Castlebeck Care Homes scandal).

Aycliffe was situated Hospital between Heighington and Newton Aycliffe. I walked home from work after many a shift there, to Newton Aycliffe. I certainly would not have been able to walk from there to Sedgefield. Seemingly the beginnings of Castlebeck had its impetus from some staff, within a closing Aycliffe Hospital. It is somewhat ironic that Aycliffe Hospital (a home and a caring environment)

was closed, to facilitate 'care within the community'. In the main, patients were settled in small groups, in sheltered housing out amongst the community. Yet this care home company, dealing with not necessarily the same type of individual - though some of the most vulnerable in our communities - seems to have taken us back to the bad old days of almost industrialised massproduced care, where, at least in this instance, they received neither CARE, nor a HOME.

RESPONDING TO THE COUNTY PLAN – HOUSING

The County Plan currently out for consultation will determine the shape and growth of Aycliffe for the next twenty years. Readers will remember that, last week, I asserted that it MUST be, first and foremost, a plan for economic growth, and that I did not believe that 4 hectares a year was adequate economic growth space for the Aycliffe Industrial Estate.

I feel much the same about the 1500 houses allowed to Aycliffe by the Plan, 1020 of which allocation already exists (i.e. just 480 'extra' houses allocated for the next

20 years). Strangely, by contrast, Bishop Auckland has an allocation of 2800, and Spennymoor of 2400. But they are both labelled 'local towns', whereas Aycliffe is described as an economic growth centre 'of national significance'. So what happens if Aycliffe grows as we hope, and there is a great demand for houses?

Actually, the Plan suggests two areas for new housing, which together total 136 hectares! So, even though the planners want us to choose one of the two, there will still be plenty of land for building houses in

the future.
What the plan does not define. however, is what TYPE of housing we will need. And this is where I would like to see statements in the Plan. I

question just how many more 'anywhere estates' Aycliffe needs – those huge areas of private housing close-packed at 30 per hectare. I would think rather, we need more social housing, more bungalows for our ageing population, and some executive housing for the bosses of those firms we are hoping to attract over the next One thing I DO appreciate

about the plan, however, is its insistence that housing plans take account of environmental needs. I have long argued that Aycliffe's 'open' nature is its defining feature and main attraction, and that we need to resist infilling, and insist also that any 'urban spread' consists of a series of 'islands' of housing sitting on a lattice of green corridors, woodlands and areas of open grassland and shrub. This is the only way that we can assure the necessary species 'travel' which ensures biodiversity and ecological healthiness. So if you decide to respond to the County Plan, I hope you will mention this.

Therefore, I am going to respond to the planners by asking them:

1. To cancel planning permission for at least part of 'Site O' on Burnhill Way, making this a preserved area of 'wild' land in the otherwise wall-to-wall Rope Moor housing estates. It will provide a hinterland for the existing 'Moors' Nature Area, and help to join the countryside (via the

Great Aycliffe Way) to Agnew Plantation

2. To insist that all development within the existing housing boundaries of the town is either social housing or bungalows. (There is no point shoving this type of housing across the other side of the A167, far away from

the town centre.)
3. To identify the 'Young Person's Centre' site as the place for future 'ordinary private-estate housing, reserving a sufficient lattice of green corridors and wild areas 4. To allocate the 'Cobbler's Hall' housing extension site as an area of 'executive housing (6 houses per hectare – it would be a wonderful setting for high-quality housing), again reserving an extensive lattice of green corridors and wild areas

We have plenty of space round about. Let's demand a Housing Plan which will secure our town as a green, spacious environment for us ALL to live.
