Young offenders have helped a charity by donating £394 from the sale of garden planters made as part of a restorative justice scheme.

In recent weeks the Restorative Justice Team has assembled planters, hanging baskets and garden ornaments to be sold with all profits going to The Rainbow Trust.

Restorative Justice The Scheme is an award winning programmedevisedbyCounty Durham Youth Offending Service for youngsters who find themselves with various court orders who benefit from a programme to 'pay

back' the community. The 'pay back' can take the form of painting and decorating community properties, gardening, litter

picking and site clearing. In bad weather, industrial units equipped with tools are available to make items such as planters, which are then sold, with profits to charity. After paying the council back for the cost of the materials the young people will soon donate  $\pounds 394.15$  to charity. The Rainbow Trust is a national charity which provides finance and support to terminally ill children and their families

# HOUSEHOLD GOODS SOLD AND RECYCLED AS CHARITY EXPANDS

GOODS AVAILABLE TO ANYONE TO BUY BUT SPECIAL REDUCED PRICES FOR THE NEEDY

The Directors and Trustees of County Durham Furniture Help Scheme founded in Newton Aycliffe several years ago by Chris Palmer announced the latest round of improvements at their premises on Chilton Industrial Estate. The two main showrooms have been tidied: new lighting and steel shelving has been installed to improve the layout and display of the vast range of low cost household goods. The offices had a makeover with new furniture acquired through kind donors.

CDFHS has been steadily expanding and improving its service since being registered with the Charity Commission in 2004. This has accelerated recently to meet the additional demands placed on it due to the recession. Nearly 1200 people a month visit the showrooms with the widest range of reusable furniture and household goods in the County. They operate not only to help the disadvantaged and low income families, but any member of the public who may wish to find and negotiate a bargain. Chris Palmer said "Anyone

can visit us get help in the form of the essentials to start a home or to buy a reasonably priced item and we will often deliver on a next day basis to your door". "We rely on the generosity of

people who have surplus or unwanted items particularly beds, cookers washing machines or sofas to donate and our call centre will arrange an appointment to arrange FREE COLLECTION" The crew of the fleet of

modern vehicles carry photo identification and will remove any item as long as it is clean, reusable and in the case of "soft items" carries the relevant fire safety label. Chris Palmer told Newton News how grateful he was to the CDFHS volunteers. "Volunteering can help to improve your health and wellbeing and makes life more interesting and you can do as few or as many hours to suit the individual." Ray Brown a Director said:

"We all work hard as a team to ensure that our service is of a high standard. It benefits residents of County Durham working as we do, with the County Council to reduce waste going to landfill". Nearly 150 tonnes of items were saved from landfill over the last year. Diane Brown, Treasurer stated that every penny of generous donations goes to running the Charity covering overheads, rent, vehicles

overheads, rent, vehicles and general running costs. "The costs to our charity are rising particularly fuel for our vehicles. Even the overhead of our busy kitchen that often feeds in excess of 20 volunteers every day has to be carefully budgeted for. We need dedicated support volunteers, particularly people who have a catering background or an eye for tidiness in our Kitchen and

Bric a brac departments". Anyone wishing to support CDFHS by volunteering is welcome to a taster session by making an appointment with Training and Employment Coordinator - Steve Mitton. "Come and have a look behind the scenes" says Steve. "See if we can offer you what you want from your volunteering and in return get our help and support. Volunteering leads to employment and is now being recognised as informal, non accredited adult learning. We can help people get into or back to work "as CDFHS offers not just a wide range of volunteering or work experience, but full

employability support". Steve is employed full time, funded entirely by external grant awards and can guide people through the volunteering and employability improvement process.

"People are trapped in unemployment, lacking experience, qualifications, or sometimes from low self esteem, depression or lack of structure. CDFHS can help through work experience and a job campaign programme by giving your CV a makeover. "We have seen over 50% of people coming to us for employability support find work." said Steve.

Tony Davies found that volunteering at CDFHS was sometimes hard work, fun and rewarding, but at the same time by getting everyone's support made him feel more alive by helping other people. Working in partnership with Claire Todd, Learning Coordinator across South and West Durham. County Durham Furniture Help (CDFHS) Scheme was securing successful in Neighbourhood Working Funding (WNF) from the Personal Skills Training (Employability) Fund The funding proved very successful in enabling CDFHS to provide specific training including CV preparation, preparation, techniques etc interview for eligible clients allowing them to apply for jobs in sectors where there were employment opportunities.

Working on behalf of Washington developers. Developments, based planning Newcastleconsultants Nathaniel Lichfield and Partners have applied for planning permission for a £32.1m housing and leisure development at Woodham Golf and Country Club.

The redevelopment and improvement of the Club follows a lengthy public consultation which began last October and proposes a mixeduse development which would include improvements to the golf course, the construction of 50 executive family homes, a 75 bed, four star hotel with conference and spa facilities and extensive landscaping

amongst which would be the re-establishment of Woodham Bridleway and new community footpaths.

### Wind Farms Running Out of Puff?

Despite the freak gales that Caribbean air carried here by battered parts of the country recently, climate experts are warning that many of Britain's the Atlantic jet stream, a fastflowing current of air. But the last two winters have featured exceptionally wind farms may soon run out of wind farms may soon run out of puff. According to government figures, 13 of the past 16 months have been calmer than normal - while 2010 was the "stillest" year of the past decade low temperatures and were remarkably still when they should have been the windiest seasons of all, as high pressure diverted the jet stream from its

normal position. Meteorologists have found that the position of the jet Meteorologists believe that changes to the Atlantic jet stream could alter the pattern of winds over the next 40 years stream has been influenced by the lower levels of activity on the Sun. 
